Pet Reunification

If your dog is in the care of <u>Bethel Friends of Canines</u>, <u>Best Friends Animal Rescue</u>, <u>The August Fund</u>, <u>Mat-Su Shelter</u>, or <u>Anchorage Animal Care and Control</u>, and you have not yet contacted them, you need to connect with them by <u>December 15th</u> or your dog may be put up for adoption.

Public Assistance Benefits - SNAP Update

The Division of Public Assistance (DPA) was granted a SNAP "hot foods waiver" to support individuals and families that do not have a place to store or cook food because of their current housing status due to the impacts of ex-Typhoon Halong and related storms. The waiver allows all SNAP recipients to use their Quest (EBT) cards to buy hot, pre-cooked foods, such as rotisserie chicken, soup, or hot deli meals from SNAP-authorized grocery and convenience stores statewide.

All other SNAP rules stay the same. This waiver applies statewide and is in place through December 20 but may be extended if necessary.
