# V. OLD BUSINESS

### A. Government Hill Bear-Garbage WNRC Resolution No. 2015-01

The Commission opened discussion on this issue following concerns and questions on the objectives and value of moving garbage cans on pick-up day to the front curb in the Government Hill neighborhood. Three assemblymembers and the presidents of the Government Hill and Rogers Park Community Councils voiced formal concerns about the WNRC Resolution No. 2015-01 recommending this approach as a way to minimize bear-garbage conflicts. The Chair spoke to Assemblymember Flynn about the issues. He suggested it might be more effective to work with Solid Waste Services (SWS) to follow through with its intent to identify and pursue other actions to address bears and garbage. The Commission suggested it continue to work with SWS on how best to take positive and effective actions to reduce bear-garbage conflicts without getting into politics and by avoiding neighborhood sensitivities. Solutions to this longstanding issue are either process-and-management oriented—e.g., enforcement—versus changes in policy, regulations, or garbage can requirements.

The Commission decided to invite the interested assemblymembers and community council representatives to the March meeting to discuss issues, re-state concerns, and identify solutions. The Chair will work with staff to draft an invitation letter for that meeting.

### VI. OTHER BUSINESS/STAFF REPORT

Staff is working on several future meeting agenda items, including:

- Alaska Railroad Corp. presentation on their fencing activities and policies;
- Watershed Management Section's culvert monitoring project data; and
- Alaska Center for the Environment's efforts to educate and protect salmon habitats in Anchorage.
