ANCHORAGE, ALASKA EO No. 2018 - 1

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE PROVIDING FINANCIAL RESOURCES FOR LABOR AND CAPITAL EXPENDITURES REQUIRED TO ADDRESS AND REPAIR CRITICAL DAMAGE TO MUNICIPAL INFRASTRUCTURE CAUSED BY THE POINT MACKENZIE EARTHQUAKE (PMQ) BY APPROPRIATING AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED NINETEEN MILLION DOLLARS (\$19,000,000) FROM AN INTERFUND LOAN FROM THE AREAWIDE GENERAL FUND (101000), TO THE DISASTER RECOVERY FUND (231801) AND AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED ELEVEN MILLION DOLLARS (\$11,000,000) OF UTILITIES' UNRESTRICTED NET POSITIONS TO THEIR RESPECTIVE REIMBURSED PROJECTS FUNDS, APPROVING A TEMPORARY EXCEPTION TO THE UNRESERVED FUND BALANCE DESIGNATION POLICY FOR THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE, AND PROVIDING A PLAN FOR FUTURE REIMBURSEMENT OF SUCH APPROPRIATIONS.

WHEREAS, on Friday, November 30, 2018, at 8:29 a.m., a magnitude 7.0 earthquake occurred directly north of the Municipality of Anchorage, which resulted and threatened to result in personal injury and property damage, including the collapse of several roadways, structural damage to municipal buildings, damage to municipal water lines and wastewater systems, and damage to the power grids of all local electrical utilities; and

WHEREAS, at 10:45 a.m. on November 30, pursuant to authority granted in Article V, Section 5.02 of the Home Rule Charter for the Municipality of Anchorage and AMC 3.80.040, the Mayor declared that a civil emergency existed within the Municipality of Anchorage based on the events described above; and

WHEREAS, on November 30, corresponding state and federal disaster declarations were issued by Governor Walker and the Department of Homeland Security, Federal Emergency Management Agency, with approval of the President; and

WHEREAS, on Sunday, December 2, 2018, the Assembly approved AR 2018-374 extending the Declaration of Civil Emergency issued by the Mayor on November 30, 2018, through Tuesday, December 4, 2018 at 10 p.m.; and

WHEREAS, on Tuesday, December 4, 2018 the Municipality's Declaration of Emergency expired in accordance with its terms, but critical restoration work is and will remain urgently required to restore considerable damage to municipal property, including but not limited to major road repairs on Dowling Road and Third Avenue, structural inspection of bridges, dams, and over/under passes; remediation and repair at municipal facilities including the Department of Health and Human

Services, Eagle River Town Hall, Fire Stations in Anchorage, Eagle River, and Chugiak, and Anchorage-wide parks and recreational facilities; replacement of Solid Waste Services structures; and extensive repairs to line breaks and leaks within the Anchorage Water and Wastewater Utility system; and

WHEREAS, the immediate ability to expend funds to address this damage is critical to effective recovery efforts by the Municipality; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Charter Section 10.03, in the event of such an emergency, an ordinance may be introduced and adopted by the Assembly at the same meeting, provided the Assembly makes a finding in the ordinance that an emergency exists and provides a statement of the facts constituting the emergency; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality is pursuing State and Federal assistance that, if and to the extent received, will be used to fully reimburse the costs of the repairs funded by this appropriation; and

WHEREAS, the Disaster Recovery Fund has been established by the Office of Management and Budget as a subset of the Municipality's State and Federal Contribution Fund, as a single fund for use across the Municipality in funding and tracking disaster recovery expenditures for which the Municipality will seek reimbursement; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to AR 2015-084, it is the policy of the Municipality of Anchorage to maintain an unrestricted general fund balance in an amount equal to 10% of current year expenditures in its General Government fund budgets, and to maintain an unrestricted fund balance of 8.25% of current year expenditures in its non-major Governmental Operating Funds, as a Bond Rating Designation that will become committed fund balance, and to maintain unrestricted fund balances in its five major funds in an amount between 2.0% and 3.0% of current year expenditures as a Working Capital Reserve that will become part of an unassigned fund balance; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to AMC 12.25.040B.5., if required, taxes required to fund the cost of an emergency ordinance enacted pursuant to Charter Section 10.03 are excluded from the tax increase limitation otherwise imposed by Charter Section 14.03 and AMC Chapter 12.25, allowing for the recovery of any costs not reimbursed by State and Federal assistance without curtailment by the tax increase limitation; now, therefore,

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Pursuant to Anchorage Municipal Charter Section 10.03, the Assembly hereby specifically finds that the November 30, 2018 Point MacKenzie

Earthquake resulted in a documented civil emergency within the Municipality of Anchorage. The Assembly further finds that (1) such emergency now requires immediate appropriation of funds for labor and capital costs necessitated by urgent, critical repairs to Municipal roadways, structures, and utility and enterprise infrastructure, including but not limited to major road repairs on Dowling Road and Third Avenue, structural inspection of bridges, dams, and over/under passes; remediation and repair at municipal facilities including the Department of Health and Human Services, Eagle River Town Hall, Fire Stations in Anchorage, Eagle River, and Chugiak, and Anchorage-wide parks and recreational facilities; replacement of Solid Waste Services structures; and extensive repairs to line breaks and leaks within the Anchorage Water and Wastewater Utility system; and (2) a failure to immediately address these issues will result in an insufficiency of services or facilities substantial enough to endanger the public health, safety or welfare.

<u>Section 2.</u> The sum of not to exceed Nineteen Million Dollars (\$19,000,000) in Interfund Loan proceeds from the Areawide General Fund (101000) General Cash Pool Equity, are hereby appropriated to the Disaster Recovery Fund (231801).

<u>Section 3.</u> The proceeds of the Interfund Loan aggregating not to exceed Nineteen Million Dollars (\$19,000,000) are available to be used for labor and capital expenses required to address and repair damage sustained by municipal property in the PMQ.

<u>Section 4.</u> The sum of not to exceed Eleven Million Dollars (\$11,000,000) of Utilities' unrestricted net positions is hereby appropriated to their respective Reimbursed Projects Funds for repairs to damage related to the PMQ. The utilities referred to herein include only Anchorage Water and Wastewater Utility and Municipal Light & Power.

<u>Section 5.</u> The Assembly hereby approves a temporary exception to the unreserved fund balance policy of the Municipality of Anchorage, permitting the Municipality to conclude the 2018 fiscal year with less than the unrestricted fund balances dictated by AR 2015-084 in light of the emergency circumstances outlined in this ordinance and the anticipated reimbursement, through State and Federal assistance or tax revenue.

<u>Section 6.</u> The Municipality's Chief Fiscal Officer is delegated the responsibility to pursue reimbursement of costs of repairs to damage sustained during the PMQ from all available State of Alaska and Federal assistance programs. Any and all costs of repairs not reimbursed by available assistance programs shall be recovered by the imposition of appropriate municipal taxes pursuant to AMC 12.25.040B.5. during future calculations and imposition of such appropriate taxes in the Municipality.

<u>Section 7.</u> This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and approval by the Anchorage Assembly.

AN **EMERGENCY** ORDINANCE **PROVIDING** Subject: **FINANCIAL** CAPITAL EXPENDITURES RESOURCES FOR LABOR AND REQUIRED TO ADDRESS AND REPAIR CRITICAL DAMAGE TO INFRASTRUCTURE CAUSED BY MUNICIPAL THE POINT MACKENZIE EARTHQUAKE (PMQ) BY APPROPRIATING AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED NINETEEN MILLION DOLLARS (\$19,000,000) FROM AN INTERFUND LOAN FROM THE AREAWIDE GENERAL FUND (101000), TO THE DISASTER RECOVERY FUND (231801) AND AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED ELEVEN MILLION DOLLARS (\$11,000,000) OF UTILITIES' UNRESTRICTED NET POSITIONS TO THEIR RESPECTIVE REIMBURSED PROJECTS FUNDS, APPROVING A TEMPORARY EXCEPTION TO THE UNRESERVED FUND BALANCE DESIGNATION POLICY FOR THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE, AND PROVIDING A PLAN FOR

On Friday, November 30, 2018, at 8:29 a.m., a magnitude 7.0 earthquake occurred directly north of the Municipality of Anchorage, which resulted and threatened to result in personal injury and damage to both public and private property across the Municipality. At 10:45 a.m. on November 30, the Mayor declared that a civil emergency existed within the Municipality of Anchorage as a result of the earthquake. On Sunday, December 2, 2018, the Assembly approved AR 2018-374 extending the Declaration of Civil Emergency issued by the Mayor on November 30, 2018, through Tuesday, December 4, 2018 at 10 p.m.

FUTURE REIMBURSEMENT OF SUCH APPROPRIATIONS.

While the Municipality's Declaration of Emergency has expired, critical restoration work is and will remain urgently required to restore considerable damage to municipal property, including but not limited to major road repairs on Dowling Road and Third Avenue, structural inspection of bridges, dams, and over/under passes; remediation and repair at municipal facilities including the Department of Health and Human Services, Eagle River Town Hall, Fire Stations in Anchorage, Eagle River, and Chugiak, and Anchorage-wide parks and recreational facilities; replacement of Solid Waste Services structures: and extensive repairs to line breaks and leaks within the Anchorage Water and Wastewater Utility system. The immediate ability to expend funds to address this damage is critical to effective recovery efforts by the Municipality, and to preventing a situation in which an insufficiency of services or facilities will become substantial enough to endanger the public health, safety or welfare.

The Office of Management and Budget has established the Disaster Recovery Fund as a subset of the Municipality's State and Federal Contribution Fund, as a single fund for use across the Municipality in funding and tracking disaster recovery expenditures for which the Municipality will seek reimbursement. This Emergency Ordinance provides the authority to fund the Disaster Recovery Fund at the level predicted to be required to address known damages to municipal infrastructure. The Municipality is pursuing State and Federal assistance that, if and to the extent received, will be used to fully reimburse the costs of the repairs funded by this appropriation. Because of the anticipated time-lag between appropriation and reimbursement, it is expected that the Municipality will conclude the 2018 fiscal year, and potentially subsequent fiscal years, with unrestricted fund balances below the level required by the Municipality's Unreserved Fund Balance Designation Policy. Any and all costs of repairs not reimbursed by available assistance programs shall be recovered by the imposition of appropriate municipal taxes pursuant to AMC 12.25.040B.5. during future calculations and imposition of such appropriate taxes in the Municipality.

Full reimbursement of the appropriated funds will be sought from State and Federal assistance or through the imposition of taxes. Therefore, no summary of economic effects is included.
