



Do Your Part This Winter!

Keep Watch for the Mayor's Energy Alerts

The "Energy Watch" campaign focuses on actions citizens can take to reduce their energy use during the winter if and when natural gas delivery pressures drop low enough to warrant concern. Local governments

and electric and gas utilities along the Railbelt are working together to be sure we all stay warm and safe this winter. A stoplight graphic will be used to advise residents to reduce their energy consumption by varying degrees.

Green Light: Continue normal, everyday conservation measures. (See page 11 for tips).

Yellow Light: Set your thermostat to 65°F in living areas and 40°F in the garage; lower water heater settings; postpone laundry and dishwashing; turn off unnecessary lights and electronics.

Red Light: Set your thermostat to 60°F in living areas and 55°F if away from home; turn water heater gas valve to "pilot"; do not use gas fireplaces, decorative heaters or gas grills; use microwave for cooking.
