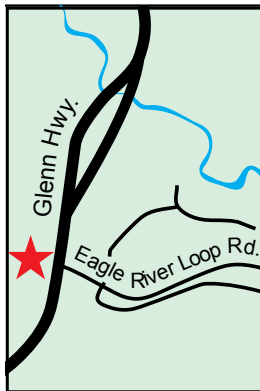


Household Hazardous Waste Collection Options

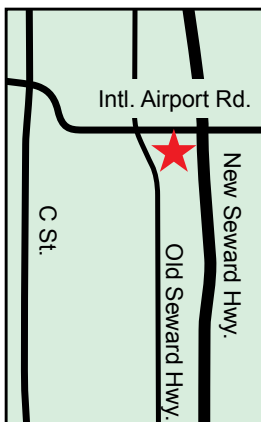
Drop-off services are FREE for households only (up to 40 lbs). A hazardous waste pick-up service is also available on a call-in basis. Phone (907) 428-1742 or (907) 343-6262 for further information.



The Hazardous Waste Collection Center is located at the **Anchorage Regional Landfill**, at the intersection of the Glenn Highway and Hiland road, near Eagle River.

Hours of Operation:

Tuesday through Saturday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. This facility accepts hazardous wastes from households and businesses.



The Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility is located at the **Central Transfer Station**, at the intersection of E. 54th and Juneau, east of the Old Seward Highway.

Hours of Operation:

Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. This facility accepts hazardous waste from households only.

What do I do with batteries?

That's a question we hear often.

There are several recycling and safe disposal options in Anchorage for both wet-cell batteries (lead-acid or vehicle batteries) and dry-cell batteries (household, rechargeable etc.).



Alaska Battery Manufacturing 166 E. Potter Drive562-4949

- Drop off lead-acid batteries only. No charge. Please package leaking batteries in plastic bags.

Batteries Plus 910 W. International Airport Road770-6110

- Drop off any rechargeable batteries for recycling. No charge.
- Drop off lead-acid batteries for recycling. No charge. Please package leaking batteries in plastic bags.

Battery Specialists of Alaska, Inc. 801 E. 15th Ave.....276-5251

- Drop off lead-acid batteries only (24/7). No charge. Will pick up large quantities during day.

Exide Batteries 1131 E. 76th Ave., Suite 400.....344-1390

- Drop off lead-acid batteries only. No charge. Please package leaking lead-acid batteries in plastic bags.

Interstate Batteries 7740 Schoon Street349-1577

- Drop off lead-acid batteries only. No charge. Will pick up large quantities.

Municipality of Anchorage Solid Waste Services Hazardous Waste Collection Center and Household Hazardous Waste Facility (see sidebar on this page)

- Drop off alkaline (household) batteries for safe disposal – not recycled.
- Drop off rechargeable batteries for recycling.
- Drop off lead-acid batteries for recycling. No charge for 1 battery/day per household.

Total Reclaim, Inc.

12101 Industry Way, Unit C4 (Huffman Business Park)561-0544

- Drop off lead-acid batteries, alkaline, and other rechargeable and non-rechargeable batteries (NiCd, NiMH, lithium and lithium ion, and silver oxide). Fees range from \$1 to \$2/lb. Small quantities brought in with other electronics are free of charge for residents. Call for details.

NOTE: Since 1993, domestically manufactured alkaline and carbon zinc batteries contain no added mercury and are essentially mercury-free. They can be disposed in a landfill but consider recycling them if the option is available.
