

The Municipal GO Bond debt levels are steady.

State Funds & MOA Bonds for Capital Projects







Areawide Facilities 2020 Bond Recap

Anchorage Senior Center: Paved/Striped Parking lot, skylight replacement in May. Engineering underway for remaining 2020 bond projects.

Chugiak- Eagle River Senior Center: Paving, New Kitchen equipment, Concrete work, Design is underway for carports.

Bering Street Welding Bay: Awaiting steel package and crane.

Loussac Library Elevators & Safety Upgrades: Replaced/upgraded 3 elevators (32-years-old). The elevators include the two main elevators in the lobby and the freight elevator. A 4th elevator as an add/alternate depending on bids.

Mt View Library: Removal of cement structure and enhance safety starts this spring.

Areawide Public Safety & Transit 2020 Recap

Public Safety: Anchorage Areawide Radio Network (AWARN): Upgrade and replace 15-year-old analog audio and transport equipment at each of the 6 simulcast sites in town with digital transport. Enhance and upgrade the voice and system security of police and fire radio voice or data systems. Potential including the replacement of the 40-year-old ATCO structure at Kincaid Park.

Public Safety: Ambulance Replacement: 4 new ambulances & 2 chassis

Transit: Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD)and Automated Vehicle Locate (AVL), Campus Security, and Fareboxes, Real Time Passenger Information Systems (RTIS), Automatic Passenger Counters (APC), Automatic Voice Annunciators (AVA), and single point of logon via the Mobile Data Terminal (MDT) to bus onboard systems.

Transit: Facilities Energy Upgrades replaced 40-year-old boiler system and all lighting to LED at the admin building and bus barn, digital heating controls and motion activated lighting switches

Transit: Fleet Purchasing 10-12 buses in fall of 2021; expecting that these vehicles would arrive in 2022 (1-year lag for production and inspection).

- Transit Facilities and Bus Stops (\$755,000— match funds)
- Transit Fleet and Equipment (\$475,000 matching funds)
- School Zone Safety (\$500,000)




