Proposition #7 Anchorage Fire Service Area \$1,950,000

Project Descriptions

AFD Facility Improvements - \$500,000

This funding would provide for station safety and code updates that are of substantial cost. Items such as: upgrading power (electricity) capabilities, flooring upgrades, and other upgrades to the 20 year old structure. This would include design and analysis to accommodate an additional extractor at Station #1 for cleaning contaminated structural firefighter gear.

Fire Ladder Truck Replacement - \$1,450,000

This project is to replace front line ladder trucks in accordance with the Anchorage Fire Department's (AFD) apparatus replacement schedule. The AFD has a replacement schedule that follows national standards for replacement of front-line fire apparatus. The standard is for ladder trucks to be in front line operational service for the first 20 years and in reserve status for another 5 years, for a total of 25 years of service. The ladder truck carries a ladder, pump and hose. It responds to all types of emergencies including fire and medical emergencies. This funding request is to replace one (1) ladder truck at Station #5, the ladder truck previously assigned to Station #5 developed significant mechanical issues which could not be repaired in a cost-effective manner. It was removed from the fleet.
