#### MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

#### **Department Goal:**

The goals of the Department of Health and Human Services for the 1994-1999 Capital Improvement Program include the following: (1) Improve the effectiveness of the I/M program by using alternative means of testing; (2) interagency communication for disaster response; (3) improved productivity of field staff; and (4) more effective protection of the public from food contamination through quicker and more accurate identification of harmful organisms.

#### **Program Statement:**

Anchorage continuously seeks ways to improve the effectiveness of the I/M program while maintaining a high level of service to vehicle owners. Acquisition of the "IM240" equipment will give the I/M program an alternative means of testing for certain modified vehicles which fail the current test. It is estimated that there are up to 1,500 vehicles in this category. Use of the IM240 system to certify these vehicles could save vehicle owners thousands of dollars annually in unnecessary repairs.

The Department proposes to replace the old radio equipment used by the Environmental Services Division, to acquire more hand-held radios for nurses who make home visits, and to standardize DHHS radio equipment for compatibility with the Municipal system. As a participant in the trunked radio system, the Department could use the Municipal emergency channel during disaster/crises response.

Purchase of a step van for field use would support the water quality monitoring and pollution enforcement program. Staff would be able to complete measurements of basic parameters in the van. More field investigation work could be accomplished per trip from the office.

Upgrades to various Health facilities have been budgeted also, including additions to the Anchorage and Chugiak Senior Centers, a support facility at the Clitheroe Center Alcohol and Drug Abuse Treatment Complex and, under the Property & Facility Management budget (Chapter 9), renovations to the Public Health Facility.

This would be done by having a small percentage of randomly selected local vehicles tested both at certified field stations and at the referee facility. Other uses of the new system would be testing of vehicles which have been modified, re-testing vehicles which have failed field inspection and when their owners protest the failures and testing other unique vehicles. Initiation of IM240 testing in Anchorage would be incorporated into the local air quality plan to be an EPA-credited strategy for attainment of the federal CO standard.
