Department Goal:

The goal of the Cultural and Recreational Services Department for the 1994-1999 Capital Improvement Program is to provide improved recreational opportunities and enhanced library and information services to all segments of the community, and to raise and protect the water quality of local streams, thereby improving those aspects of community life and neighborhood values which depend on clean and aesthetically appealing surface water. Improvement of the library system is sought to update equipment, improve signage, provide shelving for duplicate materials and upgrade the automated library system used to access the collection. In Parks and Recreation, continuing efforts will be made to enlist public participation (donations of labor, money, materials); upgrade present parks and trails, and complete current park projects. Input was obtained from individual citizens, neighborhood associations, community councils, the Parks and Recreation Commission, Library Advisory Board, Eagle River Parks and Recreation Advisory Board, Girdwood Board of Supervisors, and staff. Approval of the CIP has been obtained from all advisory boards.

Library:

The 1994-1999 Capital Improvement Program for the Library focuses on projects designed to support and enhance the delivery of library and information services while enriching the educational, cultural and economic climate of the community.

Replacement of the automated library system to take advantage of technological improvements made over the last eight years will improve user access to library collections, provide database space for anticipated collection growth, permit addition of public access terminals; and improve response time to public and staff users. Furnishings will house additional public access terminals.

Replacement and upgrade of equipment is required to effectively access the Library's collections in audio-visual, microform and computer disk format and enhance patron and staff access to information services.

Additional interior and exterior signing should increase library use and enable patrons to better utilize collections and services. Compact shelving will provide storage in the Alaska Collection and areas of Loussac housing duplicate and lesser used materials.

Eagle River/Chugiak Parks and Trails:

The 1994-1999 Capital Improvement Program for Eagle River/Chugiak includes continued upgrading of existing parks; acquisition and development of neighborhood parks and greenbelts; and development of Schroeder Park, Loretta French Park, Beach Lake Park, and Peters Creek Park. Funds will also be requested for the design of a recreation center.

Girdwood Parks and Trails:

The 1994-1999 Capital Improvement Program for Girdwood fills community needs for extension of pathways and improvements to the Town Square and Forest Fair park area.

Greenbelt Acquisition:

Acquire land along Rabbit, Fish, Little Campbell and Chester creeks, as well as Peters Creek, Little Rabbit Creek, Potter Creek and designated wetlands as budget and community priorities direct, sufficient to protect local creeks, creek banks, and the immediate upland area along these creeks from human and domestic animal contamination and encroachment by structures and other "improvements" which would otherwise threaten the water quality. The designated wetlands which are included in the Greenbelt Acquisition program should be preserved because of habitat and hydrological values. These wetland areas selected for acquisition have been chosen because of documented high resource value.

Anchorage Parks and Trails Development:

This program provides major emphasis on park and trail rehabilitation, reduction of maintenance costs and completion of existing projects currently under construction throughout the community. Major reconstruction or improvements are planned for Campbell and Chester Creek Trails, Anchorage Football Stadium, Mulcahy Baseball Stadium, Ruth Arcand

Park/Abbott-O-Rabbit Ballfields, Valley of the Moon Park, Kincaid Park, Storck Park, Russian Jack Springs Park, Town Square Park, and others. Maximum use will be made of park improvement districts, volunteers, donations, and other fund-raising efforts to increase community involvement and reduce public expenditures.

There is to be considerable effort to repair and rehabilitate the present parks and trails, including reduction of access barriers for the disabled, and a focus on neighborhood needs. Linkage between major trails will be completed to expand the role of the areawide trails system as a major element of both the transportation and recreation system. Neighborhood parks will be improved where needed and additional sports fields for organized athletics will be developed to meet expanding program needs.

Non-Capital/Legislative Program:

This section of the Capital Improvement Program includes legislative requests for Cultural and Recreational Services activities which do not meet the traditional definition of capital projects. The section focuses on funding for programmatic changes currently identified to meet requirements of the 1990 Americans with Disabilities Act. The annual request for the State-funded program providing neighborhood enhancement projects through summer employment of local youth is included.
