Department Goals:

Goals for the 1995-2000 Capital Improvement Program are: 1) Provide an adequate regional facility for treating alcohol and drug abuse; 2) enhance the effectiveness of the Vehicle Inspection and Maintenance Program as Anchorage's primary strategy for reducing carbon monoxide and meeting the federal standard; 3) include the department in the Municipal radio network; 4) make available to our senior residents adequate facilities for recreational and community services as well as medical care; 5) house the department staff in a more efficient office and clinic building; and 6) improve productivity of water quality field staff.

Program Statements:

The Clitheroe treatment facility at Pt. Woronzoff is too small and otherwise inadequate for treatment of the growing number of alcohol and drug abuse cases. Anchorage needs to replace this aging center with a building designed not only for local needs but also as a regional facility.

Funding requested for the Vehicle Inspection Program will buy "IM240" equipment which includes a dynamometer for loaded mode testing. The system will enable validation of the idle testing done at the field stations, resolution of disputed field tests and testing of modified and special category vehicles which can't be accurately checked using current field machines. The result will be a more accurate emissions testing program and savings of repair costs.

The department proposes to replace the old radio equipment used by Environmental Services, provide additional communications equipment for management staff and standardize DHHS radio equipment for compatibility with the Municipal trunked radio system. The requested mobile, portable and desktop units would enhance normal field-office exchanges and facilitate disaster response.

The Anchorge Senior Center project will support design of additional capacity for recreational and community activities, including exercising, swimming and reading. Once completed, the renovation and addition will serve a growing and increasingly active senior population for many years. The Chugiak Senior Center Project is construction of a previously designed day care center for Alzheimer's patients.
