MAINTENANCE & OPERATIONS

Department Goal

The goal of the Maintenance & Operations Department (formerly Facility and Fleet Management) for the 2009-2014 Capital Improvement Budget/Program is to maintain, refurbish or upgrade municipal facilities to maximize useful life through a program of proactive renovation projects focused on high priority items such as roofs, building structures, air/heating systems, life safety conditions and aesthetic value. Additionally, when it is no longer cost-effective to refurbish or renovate facilities, the department manages the construction of replacement facilities. Generally, funding requests for replacement projects appear in the capital improvement program of the department operating the facility.

The purpose of municipal facilities is to enhance the quality of life and the livability of Anchorage. The Municipality of Anchorage has over 300 facilities that are used for general government operations and civic, cultural and recreational services. These facilities include Loussac Library, Sullivan Arena, Egan Convention Center, Alaska Center for the Performing Arts, Anchorage Museum of History and Art, police and fire facilities, and parks and recreational facilities.

Millions of dollars have been invested in our public facilities. Safeguarding these investments for the use of future generations is a primary goal of Property & Facility Management. This capital improvement program addresses the highest priority needed renovation and upgrade projects that will extend the life and maintain the overall appearance of Municipal facilities.

Fleet Services

The goal of the Fleet Services Capital Improvement Program is to program replacement of or additions to the general government vehicle and equipment fleet in support of existing or expanded municipal programs.

The Municipality is attempting to "catch up" on years of deferred maintenance projects within its aging facility inventory. Most of these facilities are 20-30 years old, and have reached the normal life expectancy of the buildings' major systems.

Now that the facility is 25 years old, state funding is requested for capital renovations necessary to protect the State's original investment in this facility that has served Anchorage and Alaska so well.

Sullivan Arena is a world class facility designed to be versatile and functional with the capability to accommodate sporting events, concerts, trade shows, exhibits, large meetings and other special events. It is home for the Alaska Aces, UAA Seawolves Hockey, and Great Alaska Shootout basketball tournament.

Justification:

Fire and security systems are necessary for continued public safety. exterior and interior renovations are necessary to protect the facility, and to insure a continued positive experience for building users. Various mechanical upgrades are necessary as original systems continue to age, leading to failure, and parts becoming obsolete.

The Municipality of Anchorage is seeking a \$750,000 capital maintenance grant to continue the Municipality's efforts toward remediation of contaminated underground sites at several facility sites.

Comments:

Four major underground sites have been identified that require remediation: The Brother Francis Shelter compound, the Bering Street fleet Maintenance Shop complex, the Transit Maintenance complex, and the Loussac Library facility. The Brother Francis shelter compound site is found to the most wide-spread of underground contamination. The Shelter will be given first priority for cleanup efforts as funding becomes available.

Justification:

The once accepted practice of storing hazardous petroleum products in single-walled underground storage vessels has resulted in a number of sites where the vessels of their distribution systems have been compromised, resulting in loss of petroleum products to the ground. These sites are in need of cleanup, which can prove to be extremely costly, depending on the extent of the contamination and the type of remediation necessary to rectify the situation. The Municipality of Anchorage is dedicated to removing the contamination from these sites and restoring them to their natural uncontaminated environment with the help of the requested funding.

APD is understaffed when compared to cities of similar size and demographics. Thus, APD currently is aggressively recruiting new police officers to expand the force and enhance public safety. Additional police vehicles will be required to outfit new officers as they are sworn in, to make them fully operational and capable of protecting the public. Once received, the additional vehicles will be programmed for future replacement through monthly contributions to a fleet fund.

Justification:

Municipal fleet management provides for the programmed replacement of police cruisers. However, the current aggressive program to increase the number of officers on the street requires a significant initial capital outlay for corresponding additions to the patrol vehicle fleet. Currently APD lacks the resources to fill this need. Without this funding, citizens of Anchorage will not fully benefit from an increased number of police officers.
