Four major underground sites have been identified that require remediation: The Brother Francis Shelter compound, the Bering Street fleet Maintenance Shop complex, the Transit Maintenance complex, and the Loussac Library facility. The Brother Francis shelter compound site is found to the most wide-spread of underground contamination. The Shelter will be given first priority for cleanup efforts as funding becomes available.

Justification:

The once accepted practice of storing hazardous petroleum products in single-walled underground storage vessels has resulted in a number of sites where the vessels of their distribution systems have been compromised, resulting in loss of petroleum products to the ground. These sites are in need of cleanup, which can prove to be extremely costly, depending on the extent of the contamination and the type of remediation necessary to rectify the situation. The Municipality of Anchorage is dedicated to removing the contamination from these sites and restoring them to their natural uncontaminated environment with the help of the requested funding.
