The Emergency Medical Service, being a relatively new Division, is growing rapidly and foresees the need to up-grade and expand the Paramedic system on an areawide basis of which the Division is responsible for. It is imperative that a new and permanent station be established in the City of Anchorage area to respond to the alarms that contribute 50% of the total Emergency Medical Service activity. It is also imperative that Paramedic training be a continual function (as police and fire training are) and the need for a division training facility is vital. At the present, the Emergency Medical Service administration is separate from the division and poses a problem. Offices are needed in this building. It is realized the need for an Emergency Medical Service station would eventually be

accomplished. Now with the Trans-Alaska Pipeline impact, it is imperative this planning be advanced as soon as possible. Our present service is carried out by two area vehicles that were adequate six years ago when 250 alarms per month were responded to. Today over 600 alarms per month are responded to by still two vehicles. We must up-grade the system not only to meet the present demand but to definitely meet the impact.

Public Safety - Emergency Medical

The Robit Creek Emergency Medical Service Station would be built on a joint sharing concept with the Borough Fire Department. It would be approximately 1050 sq. ft. housing a rescue unit, supply storage area, bunk and kitchen facilities to house two on-duty Paramedics. During the past two years there has been a sharp increase in population and new construction in this area. The rescue unit responding to this area leaves from Station 4 (Tudor and MacInness). The time factor for this response is increased to a seriously long time, coupled with the fact that this area is difficult to respond to during the fall and winter months which contributes to the extended time frame. The population impact in this area is continuing to place more demands on the Emergency Medical Service. The joint

The Emergency Medical Service has four emergency patient caring rescue units and one non-patient caring emergency unit that requires constant maintenance from operator level to shop level maintenance. These vehicles are committed on a 24 hour basis, seven days a week. The joint maintenance facility with the Fire Department would ensure timely shop level maintenance completed by personnel that were continually aware of the problems in dealing with Emergency Medical Service rescue vehicles. It is imperative that these units remain in a high degree of readiness because of our service commitment to the community. Therefore, our joint association with the Fire Department in the combined maintenance program is essential because maintenance service personnel are familiar not only with emergency vehicles in general but with the Emergency Medical Service vehicles specifically.

The new Emergency Medical Service station would be constructed as a single service dwelling, housing two on-duty Paramedics, kitchen facilities, bunking area, heated garage area for a rescue unit, and a storage area for general supplies. This station cannot be built in conjunction with Fire Station 6 because of the limited amount of land. This heavily populated area will have an increase during the pipeline impact that will make demands on this service that must be satisfied to the public in this area. This unit will cover a very highly concentrated area on the Glenn Highway. This stretch of four-lane highway has had a sharp increase during the past years that the pipeline impact has contributed to.
