#### **CULTURAL AND RECREATIONAL SERVICES**

#### **Department Goal**

The goal of the Cultural and Recreational Services Department for the 1996-2001 Capital Improvement Budget/Program is to:

- · expand and improve sports and recreational opportunities,
- · enhance library and informational services,
- improve the Anchorage Museum of History and Art, and
- expand and improve park and greenbelt system.

The Department's capital budget represents input from individual citizens, neighborhood associations, community councils, Anchorage Parks and Recreation Commission, Library Advisory Board, and the Eagle River/Chugiak Parks and Recreation and Girdwood Valley Service Area Boards of Supervisors.

#### **Anchorage Sports and Recreation Facilities**

This program provides major emphasis on sports facilities evaluation, design, construction, and expansion. Significant improvements are planned for Chester Creek Sports Complex (Mulcahy Area) and the initial construction phase of the Anchorage Sports Center. Construction of a second ice sheet at Dempsey Anderson Ice Arena and completion of Harry J. McDonald Memorial Center Recreation Center (Eagle River) are included under *Property & Facility Management* (Section #9) in this document. In addition, the capital program includes feasibility studies for recreational centers in Mountain View and East Anchorage.

#### **Anchorage Parks and Trails**

This program provides major emphasis on trail connections, rehabilitation of existing facilities, and completion of existing projects currently underway throughout the community. Significant improvements are planned Coastal Trail, Campbell and Chester Creeks Trails, Far North Bicentennial Park, Kincaid Park, Russian Jack Springs Park, Earthquake Park and others. Maximum use will be made of volunteers, donations, and other fund-raising efforts to increase community involvement and reduce public expenditures.

There is also considerable effort to upgrade and rehabilitate existing parks, facilities and trails, including reduction of access barriers for the disabled, improved safety for users and a focus on neighborhood desires. Linkage between major trails will be completed to expand the role of the areawide trails system as a major element of both the transportation and recreation systems. Neighborhood parks will be improved where needed and additional sports fields will be developed to meet expanding needs for organized athletics programs.

#### **Eagle River/Chugiak Parks and Trails**

The 1996-2001 Capital Improvement Budget/Program for Eagle River/Chugiak Parks and Recreation Service Area includes continued upgrading and development of existing parks such as Loretta French, Schroeder and Peters Creek Parks.

#### Girdwood Parks, Trails and Acquisitions

The 1996-2001 Capital Improvement Budget/Program for Girdwood follows the recommendations of the newly approved Girdwood Area Plan and the Anchorage Trails Plan. This program provides for the acquisition of land, including Heritage Land Bank parcels, which will then be developed as new parks, trails and recreation facilities in the Girdwood Valley. The program also provides for continued upgrading and development of existing parks and facilities.

#### **Park Acquisition**

The 1996-2001 Capital Improvement Budget/Program will continue to in-fill greenbelts, emphasizing water quality improvement and public access, as well as new neighborhood parks. Acquisition will be funded through state grants and management transfers with the Heritage Land bank, supplemented by private donations.

#### **Greenbeit Acquisition**

The 1996-2001 Capital Improvement Budget/Program continues to target acquisition of land along Fish Creek, Little Rabbit Creek, Rabbit Creek and Potter Creek and designated wetlands as budget and community priorities direct. Protection of wetlands, creeks, creek banks and the immediate upland area along waterways from human and domestic animal contamination and encroachment by structures and other development which might threaten water quality are the main goals of these acquisitions. Designated wetlands identified in the Greenbelt Acquisition Program are included because of the habitat and hydrological values and have been selected for acquisition because of documented high resource value.

#### Library

The 1996-2001 Capital Improvement Budget/Program for the Library focuses on projects designed to support and enhance the delivery of library and informational services while enriching the educational, cultural and economic climate of the community.

Acquisition and upgrade of equipment and software will enhance access to library collections for both onsite and offsite patrons. A community electronic network will provide broader access to Municipal information and increase awareness of other community information available in electronic format.

The replacement of library shelving which does not meet current earthquake-resistant standards is a high priority for the safety of library patrons and staff. Furniture must be regularly replaced to maintain safe and effective use.

The remodel of Z. J. Loussac headquarters library will provide better customer service and increased space for collections.

#### <u>Museum</u>

The 1996-2001 Capital Improvement Budget/Program for the Anchorage Museum of History and Art focuses on improvement of security and storage for collections and replacement of furnishings worn by heavy public use. Additionally the expansion into a new facility for the Arctic Studies Center will require capital expenditures which will benefit not only the Arctic Studies Center but also the Anchorage Museum of History and Art by providing laboratories and workshop areas for conservation, exhibition preparation and materials analysis.






