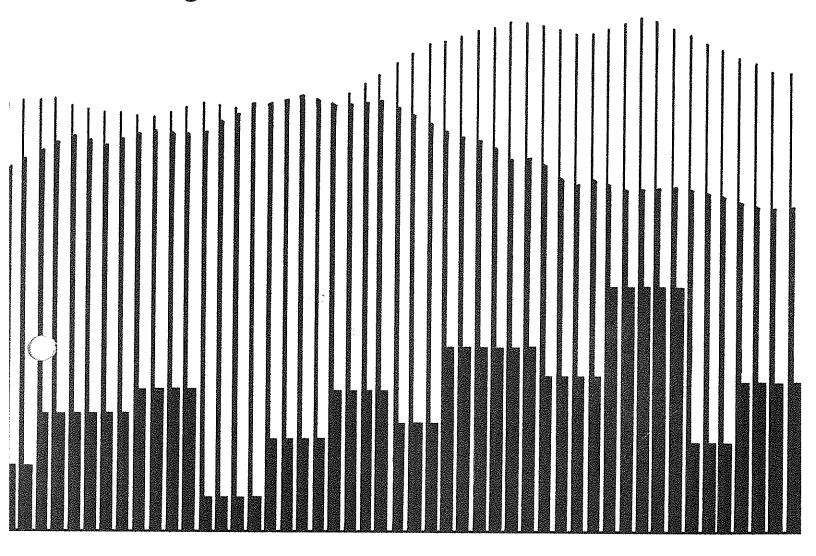

Dear Residents of Anchorage,

This has been an unprecedented budget year for Anchorage. Our 1986 budget was \$4 million less than the previous year's budget. In August, we cut the rate of spending even further when oil prices fell and state aid to local communities was reduced an additional 10%. The cuts weren't easy, but we made them with little visible impact on public services.

This 1987 Proposed General Government budget represents an even more dramatic change, and one which I think will have a very positive effect on the community. At \$198 million, it is \$17 million less than the 1986 revised budget. Even more significant, it holds the line on taxes. There is no increase in total taxes collected on existing property. It is \$8.4 million below the charter tax limitation. And, we accomplished this despite a \$14.5 million reduction in state and federal revenues. This should come as a welcome message to our community which is adjusting sooner than expected to a decline in oil revenues.

The price of government per person has also been cut. In 1978, the per capita cost of municipal government was \$980 in 1986 dollars. This year, it has been \$871. Next year, per capita expenditures will drop to \$809 in 1986 dollars. That's \$171 less than in 1978 even though far more services are provided now -- more roads, fire and police protection in areas which didn't have them then, more parks and recreation centers, several new libraries and a full-fledged bus system. We have also absorbed work that used to be done by the State for traffic signal and roadway landscape maintenance, handicapped transportation and indigent defense.

I am proud of the proposal we are making here for the 1987 budget and look forward to discussing it with the Assembly and the community. When times get tough, a community's willingness to pull together and its ability to deal constructively with change become extremely important. The Administration thanks the Assembly chair and members for their involvement, support and direction of our efforts to deal with the changing fiscal situation in a carefully reasoned way.

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE 1987 GENERAL GOVERNMENT OPERATING BUDGET FOR THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE.

WHEREAS, the Mayor has presented the 1987 General Government Operating Budget for the Municipality of Anchorage to the Assembly in accordance with Article XIII of the Municipal Charter; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly reviewed the budget as presented; and

WHEREAS, on November 18, 1986 and on November 25, 1986 duly advertised public hearings were held in accordance with Article XIII, Section 13.04 of the Municipal Charter; and

WHEREAS, the 1987 funds are now ready for appropriation by ordinance; NOW THEREFORE, the Assembly hereby ordains:

- 1. That the 1987 General Government Operating Budget is hereby adopted for the Municipality of Anchorage.

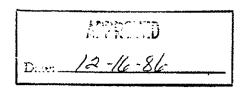
