

Description

The Office of the Chief Fiscal Officer manages the financial activity of the Municipality to provide accurate and timely financial information for strategic planning, management and decision support to elected officials and the public.

The departments managed by the Chief Fiscal Officer include:

- Office of Management and Budget
- Purchasing
- Information Technology

2005 Highlights

- The nation's largest rating agencies, Standard & Poor's (S&Ps) and Moody's, reaffirmed the Municipality's strong bond ratings after a presentation by Municipal officials in March. Moody's continued its Aa3 rating of Municipal debt, while S&P's went a step further. In addition to reaffirming its AA- rating (similar to Moody's Aa3 on the scale of high-quality bond rating), S&P's changed its outlook for the Municipality from stable to positive.
- Refunded several outstanding bond issues, replacing them with new, lower-cost bonds at substantial savings to the Municipality. Refunding and refinancing of general obligation bonds totaling \$105 million for Municipal and School District projects saved \$4.6 million net present value from reduced interest costs over the life of the bonds. The Municipality also took advantage of its favorable bond rating and low-interest market to refund \$40.8 million in bonds for the Cook Inlet Pretrial Facility leased to the State, which will save the State \$2.1 million in net present value over the life of the bonds.

2006-2007 Operational Goals

- Continue working with S&P's and Moody's to enhance the Municipality's bond ratings.
- Conduct a debt-capacity study for the Municipality and Anchorage School District.
- Conduct a review of investment policies and practices.
- Plan for automating the revenue analysis system used in projecting all Municipal revenues.
