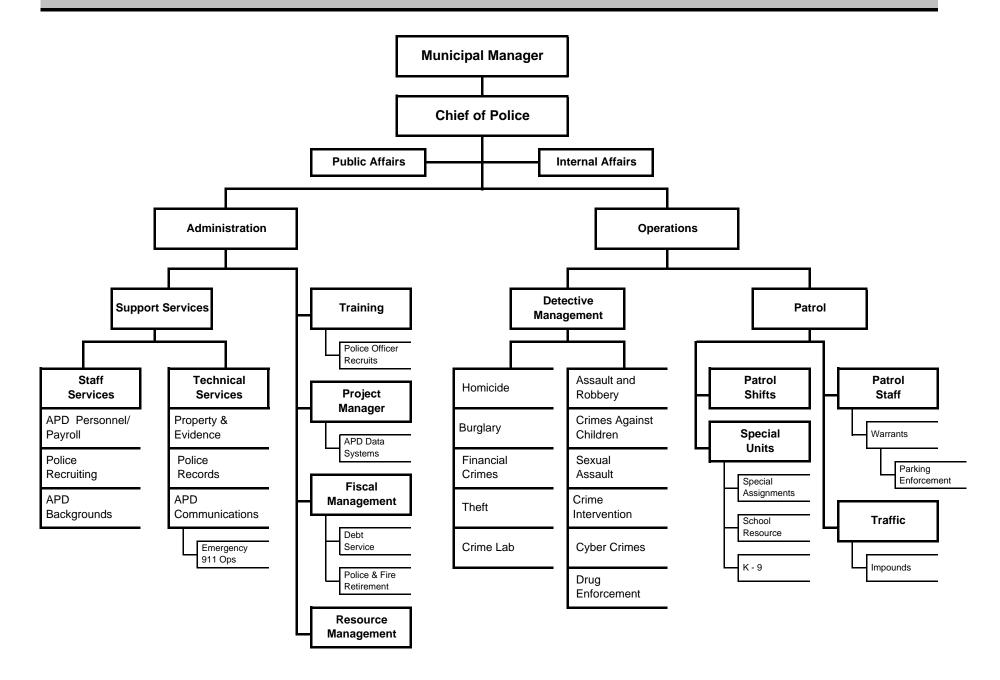

Anchorage Police -- Administration Division

The Administration Division is split into six areas of responsibility:

<u>Staff Services</u> -- maintains employees files and payroll, recruits new personnel, administers pre-hire testing, background checks, and promotion testing

<u>Technical Services</u> -- receives, processes, and stores case evidence; performs criminal history checks; dispatches officers to 911 and non-emergency calls

Training -- provides skills, training and development programs; supervises police officer recruits

Project Manager -- manages automated information systems

<u>Fiscal Management</u> -- provides budgeting, accounting, and other financial services; funds principal and interest payments for bond indebtedness; funds required payments for retirement and retiree medical for officers within the Police and Fire Retirement System

<u>Resource Management</u> -- funds prisoner care in the State operated jail, uniforms, personal equipment, and contributions for grants

Anchorage Police -- Operations Division

The Operations Division is split into two areas of responsibility:

<u>Detectives Section</u> -- oversees three Detective Teams. Team 1 investigates homicide, burglary, financial crimes and theft and operates the crime lab which gathers and analyzes evidence, photographs crime scenes and gives expert testimony in court. Team 2 investigates assault and robbery, crimes against children, sexual assault and operates a proactive street unit engaged in anti-sexual assault strategies. Team 3 investigates all drug crimes, vice and prostitution.

<u>Patrol Section</u> -- provides police officer presence for emergencies; traffic accident/violation enforcement; high schools; and vice, street level narcotics, traffic fatalities and domestic violence investigations. The Patrol Section also provides liaison with U.S. Marshals, courts and prosecutors; manages impounded vehicles and evidence; and funds a contract with the Parking Authority to collect parking fine revenues.
