#### ANCHORAGE, ALASKA AO No. 2022 – 45

AN ORDINANCE SETTING THE RATES OF TAX LEVY, APPROVING THE AMOUNT OF MUNICIPAL PROPERTY TAX, AND LEVYING TAXES FOR ALL SERVICE AREAS OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE GENERAL GOVERNMENT FOR 2022.

#### THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

<u>Section 1.</u> The Assembly hereby fixes the rates of tax levy for all service areas of the Municipality of Anchorage general government for fiscal year 2022. The Anchorage Assembly levies these taxes upon the full value of all assessed taxable real and personal property as follows:

**GENERAL GOVERNMENT FOR 2022.** 

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This information memorandum contains documents showing the historical tax rate, i.e., "mill rate" by tax district from 2012 through the amount proposed for 2022. Tax districts are created by service areas and some overlap. A tax district's mill rate is determined by combining the areawide mill rates with the the mill rates for each service area within the tax district.

Last year's mill rate calculation was complicated by CARES Act funds that per the process set forth by the U.S. Department of Treasury, were applied to first responder payroll costs in 2020, which impacted the tax formula's output. Thanks to the keen eye of Mike Edgington, a member of the Girdwood Board of Supervisors, the calculation was quickly adjusted. While the 2020 first responder payroll situation was unprecedented and is not expected to recur, the prior Administration and the Assembly recognized that reviewing the proposed mill rate in the context of historical tax rates could help provide another check on the formula-driven mill rate calculation.

The Office of Management and Budget has provided historical mill rate data by tax district for the past ten years. Since each tax district is referenced numerically, maps are also provided as a key.






