Mission

To prevent or reduce disease and injury among persons in Anchorage through education and public health programs.

Major Program Highlights

- Implement the mandatory Vehicle Inspection and Maintenance Program on July 1, 1985.
- Provide continuation funding through contract services to mental health programs (sexual violence, suicide prevention, and family mental health services) since the State will no longer provide a grant for mental health programs.
- Strengthen the capability of investigating outbreaks of infection and poisoning through training, education, and ordinance enforcement in 40 public bathing facilities, 625 food facilities, 165 bars, and 145 food outlets.
- Improve animal control in Anchorage through contract services to carry out animal control patrols, five days per week, eight hours per day and as required for emergencies; to respond to nuisance calls; and to improve animal licensing compliance.
