 - a. Ruth Schoenleben, Nine Star, provided an overview of their integrated services including, but not limited to: testing, assessments, and career paths. There are currently nine personnel working to assist people in getting jobs, advancing in jobs. They continue to look for funding, behavioral resiliency such as budget tools and financial literacy. The internet platform has allowed them to extend their services to those who have jobs during the day they can now attend courses online at night.
 - b. Peter Taylor, Habitat for Humanity, stated that in the past they had experienced some frustrations with the delays of access to funding but was happy report that they currently have five families that are "graduating" to buying homes on their own in the Lower-48.
 - i. Kelly Isham relayed plans to improve best practices to reduce issues that have plagued the process in the past. He will extend the placeholder to Larry Stokes, and Jed Drolet for the planned October 5, 2021, work-session, and have them provide an overview of the con plan and present more timely reports future forward.
