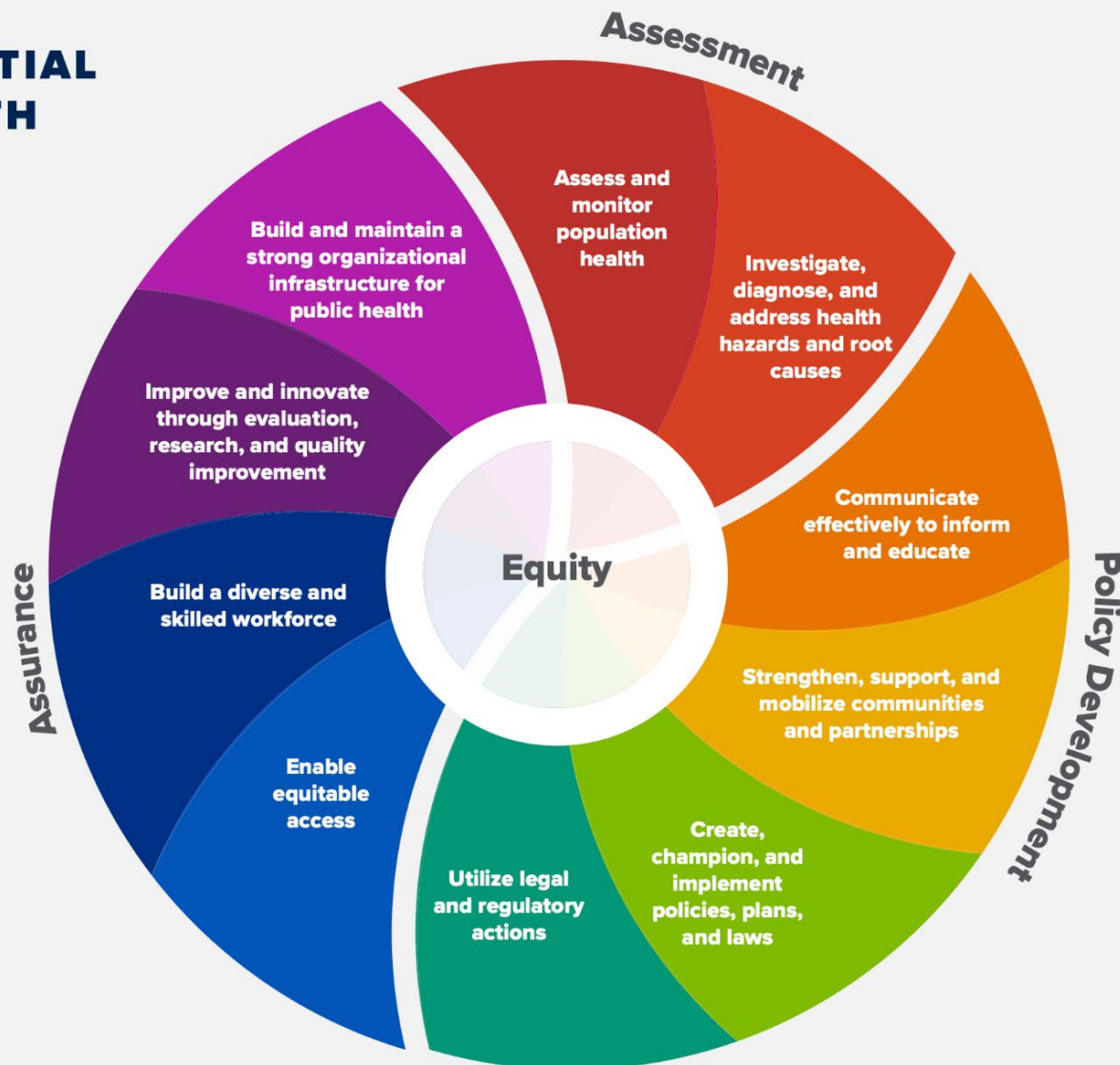

THE 10 ESSENTIAL PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES

To protect and promote the health of all people in all communities

The 10 Essential Public Health Services provide a framework for public health to protect and promote the health of all people in all communities. To achieve optimal health for all, the Essential Public Health Services actively promote policies, systems, and services that enable good health and seek to remove obstacles and systemic and structural barriers, such as poverty, racism, gender discrimination, and other forms of oppression, that have resulted in health inequities. Everyone should have a fair and just opportunity to achieve good health and well-being.

CARES Act Funding

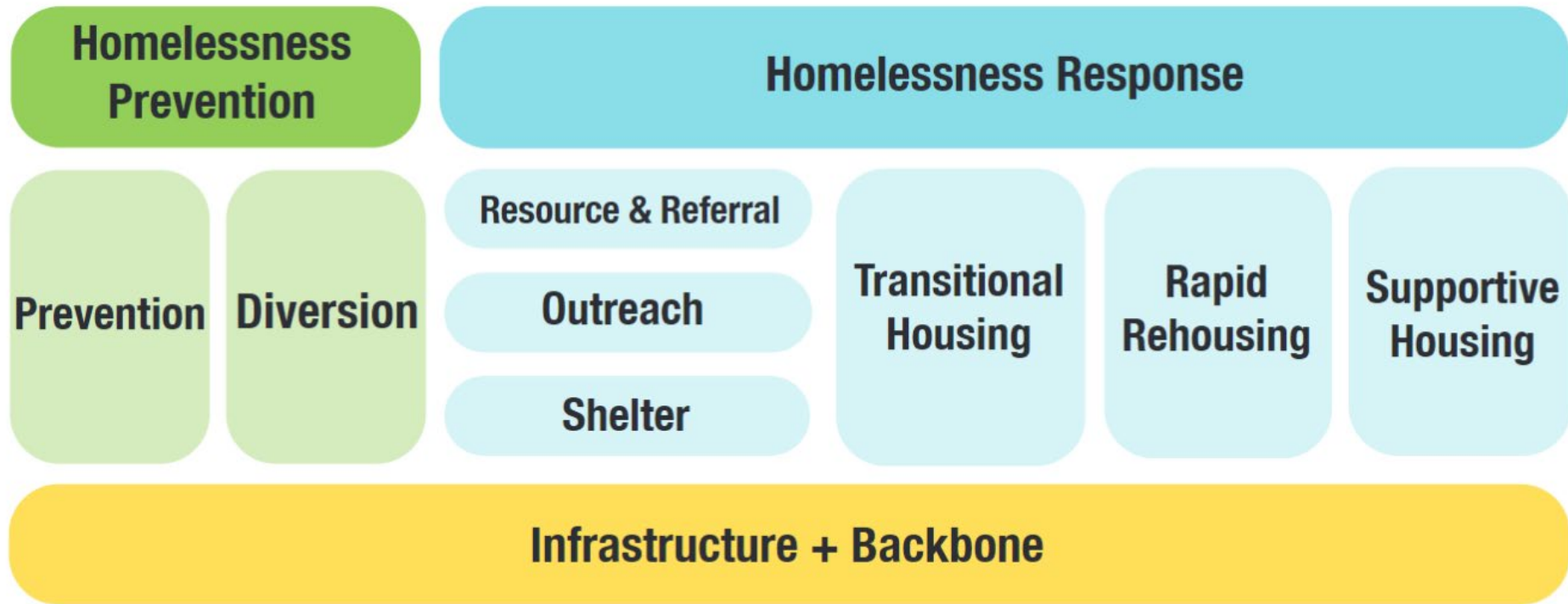
ESG-CV and CDBG-CV

Purpose

The Municipality of Anchorage has received funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for entities to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the COVID-19 pandemic.

*Individuals can not apply for funding.

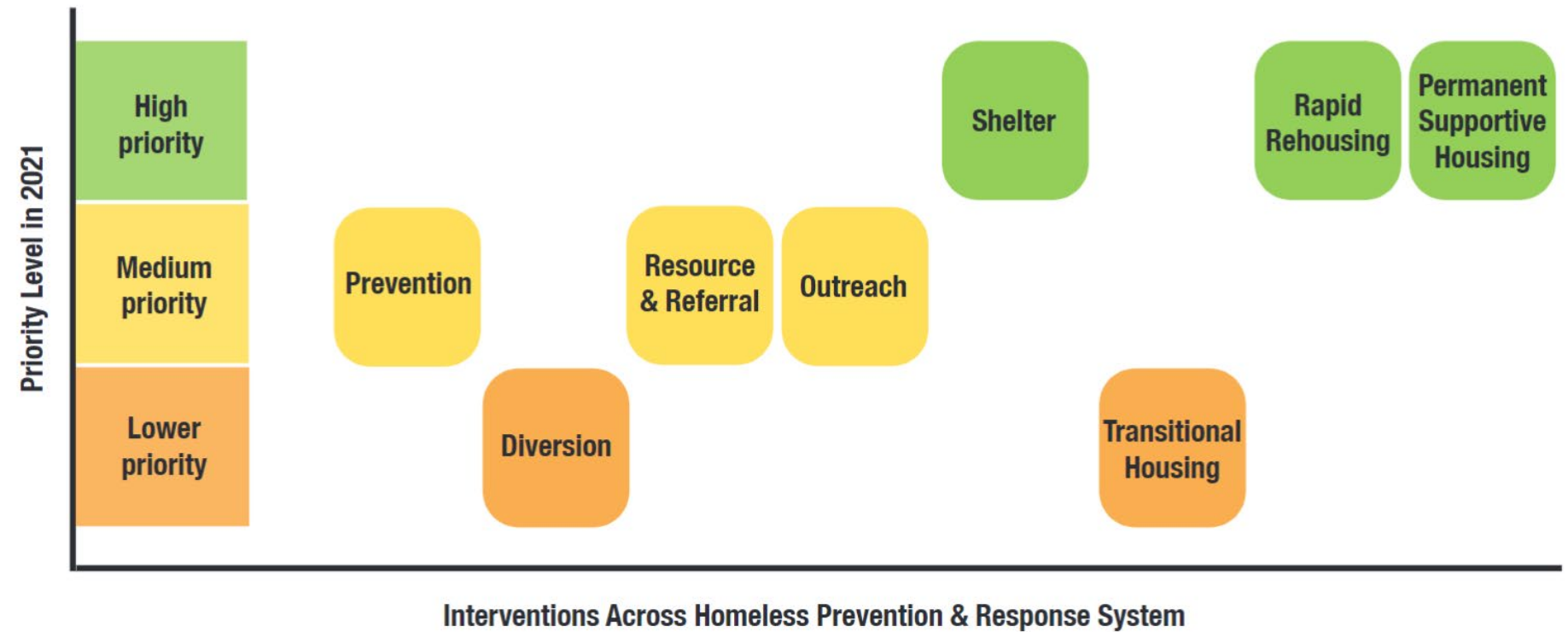
Continuum of Care for the Homelessness Response System



CARES ACT FUNDING

- MOA CDBG-CV Funds
 - Total of \$3M of which \$2.4M remains to be allocated
- MOA ESG-CV Funds
 - Total of \$4.3M of which \$2.8M to be allocated
- Funding Priorities
 - Rapid Rehousing and Permanent Supportive Housing

Gap Analysis Results and Prioritization



ESG-CV Funds

- The CARES Act Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG-CV) is for activities designed to prevent and respond to the spread of COVID-19 among people experiencing homelessness or people at risk of homelessness.

CDBG-CV

The CARES Act Community Development Block Grant (CDBG-CV) must be used for activities that

1) prepare for, prevent, or respond to the COVID-19 Pandemic and also

2) meet a HUD national objective.

- To meet a HUD national objective, 51% of the people served by the activity must be low to moderate income or the activity must fit the criteria of urgent need.
- To qualify for urgent need, the activity must resolve a condition that poses an immediate threat to public welfare and the grantee must be unable to fund the activity on its own.

Next Steps – CV funds

- Jan. 26 - CV Public Input Meeting
- Jan. 19 to Feb. 19 – Individual meetings with potential applicants upon request
- 3rd week of Feb. – 5 day public comment period for projects chosen
- Ongoing – Additional meetings past February to continue allocation of funds, if necessary
