		22. Child Emergency Record card and written permission for the use of medication; only medication that is or may be needed for field trips and outings away from the facility for each child participating in the trip or outing.
		23. Container that will hold all the above items. Kit 2 is required for field trips or outings away from the facility. One full first aid kit must remain in the facility at all times.

### CHILD CARE FACILITY REQUIRED ITEMS FOR YOUR \* ABBREVIATED FIRST AID KIT

1.Band aids (adhesive bandages)
2.Bandage tape
3.Cold pack
4.CPR barrier device or mask
5.Emergency Record Card (for children participating in walk)
6.Gauze pads (sterile)
7.Gloves (disposable nonporous, nonlatex)
8.Medication that may be needed on the walk and permission form
9.Tweezers
10.Water (potable)

\*An abbreviated first aid kit is not required but may be used for a neighborhood walk of 30 minutes or less in lieu of the second full kit.

# **REQUIRED ITEMS FOR YOUR DISASTER KIT**

1.Battery-operated radio and batteries (at least one)
2.Blankets
3.Flashlight and batteries (at least one)
4.Nonperishable food
5.Water (potable)

#### The disaster kit should be conveniently located in an easy to reach area.

**Note:** Emergency preparedness organizations and government agencies such as the Red Cross and the Department of Homeland Security recommend maintaining enough supplies on hand to last for <u>72 hours</u>.
