My dear Mayor:--

I have your two letters of the 16th inst.
on the subjects of a wharf at Anchorage and of title to
the land covered by your local aviation field.

These are both meritorious matters and off-hand
I would say that there should be little difficulty in
obtaining Congressional action on title to the landing
field. The proposition of a government dock for small
boats would be a little more difficult as it would require
surveys and reports from the Alaska Road Commission.

Inasmuch as there are only about thirty days
remaining of the present Congress and it would be impossible
to obtain committee hearings on bills of this nature,
I am going to call your correspondence to the attention
of Judge Wickersham as soon as he arrives in Washington
and ask him to introduce bills in accordance with
your request.
