5. Organization Reports

- A. MRI ATCT-Caleb represents the FAA management side of the ATAAPS and is not a part of the AD HOC Committee. The ATAAPS is now in the AD HOC phase, it will provide recommendations on how the proposal will work or not work, the committee to made up with members from AOPA and Alaska Airmen's, Earl Malpass, Dan Owen and Stormy Jarvis are also on the committee. All findings will be made available for public comment this fall, specifically around September.

- **D. Anchorage Community Councils** Allen Kemplen-Fairview Community Council -is concerned about the flight safety patterns especially with the runway construction this summer.

6. Old Business -

- A. Seward/Glenn Connection Project-
 - 2 routes will impact MRI immensely, there has been limited input from MRI on the project, they have recently been invited to the discussions.
 - Stormy proposed drafting a resolution indicating that the MAAAC Board does not endorse the surface routes; instead, it supports the development of an underground route. A formal resolution will be prepared for a vote.
 - Maps of the project can be found at <u>Seward to Glenn Connection PEL Study PEL Study</u>
 - DOT believes that the underground route, tunneling through the landfill is viable and can be engineered.

7. Business Items -

- A. Rehabilitation Runway 7/25 Project HDL & Quality Asphalt Paving (QAP)-Erik Jordt
 - The grant has been appropriated and QAP has a signed contract for the rehab project.
 - Project start time is pending supply deliveries schedule, should have a firm start time by next MAAAC meeting.
 - The government funding has been confirmed, the project is proceeding as normal. The MOA is protected financially if the funding were to be stopped.
 - The Community Councils will be keep updated on the entire construction process, through flyers, emails or meetings.
 - A couple of big things could delay the construction, weather or long lead times on material orders. There is a firm 60-day max runway closure.
 - Outreach will be the key, working together through the closure.

Follow up discussions on Erik Jordt presentation:

• Caleb Newville-MRI ATCT supervisor- reported there is an in-depth plan in place to allow the North/South runways to handle the air traffic during the 7/25 closure. Priority will be given to iterant as opposed to local pattern traffic.

- MRI will communicate with all the surrounding airports about the closure and hopefully it will self-moderate traffic coming into MRI.
- Tower hours will operate as usual from 7am to 10pm.
- AL Merrill would like to see MRI flight schools get priority in the pattern on touch and go's. Caleb said it will be first come, first serve.
- Earl will contact other flight schools off field, so they are aware of limited training time on the runway. Will suggest using MRI during slow periods 7am to 8am and in the evening.
- Matt Wavra- QAP- during the milling and paving of the runway, crews will operate around the clock; however, we will make efforts to minimize noise levels.
- Marty proposed that the flight schools collaborate to develop a coordinated plan for working together.

- Stormy welcomed new members Karl Kisser and Ransom Jones to the board.
- Marty suggested splitting the runway during construction. Caleb said it was
 explored but there was no safe way to accommodate this. There are more than
 one landing surfaces at MRI, so no waiver was granted. Erik Jordt can provide FAA
 contacts if anyone has more questions on the closure safety decisions.
