## Community Concerns for follow-up

### DOT Items:

DOT Alyeska Highway Pedestrian Safety Corridor (Bike Path) concerns

Refresh of painted stencils indicating ped/bike only: This is DOT ROW and GVSA cannot make changes without approval of DOT. Stencil painting cost previously was \$1500 and was covered by funds remaining from construction work. Those funds are now exhausted. GVSA does not have authority or funding mechanism to work on DOT ROW. New South Central Region Director is Sean Holland, Service Area will discuss with him.

Bridge abutment over Glacier Creek: DOT is monitoring and working on a plan to repair and improve the old abutment, likely in March 2024. Project is anticipated to take 1 month.

Unrestricted access to airport property. Public should call police to report illegal activity. Service Area contacted airport leasing officer and was referred to Maintenance and Operation division. DOT states that no recreational access is permitted on airport land. Service Area offered that 2<sup>nd</sup> gate after the hangar condo to be added to deter parties. DOT is examining this request.

#### **Enforcement Concerns**

Alyeska Highway Speeding. Speed limit enforcement by Whittier Police. Speed limit is unlikely to change as it is a state road meeting state statute requirements. Changing the designation of a state road has consequences having to do with maintenance and funding.

#### Unsafe parking on roads:

Call Whittier Police for parking enforcement if emergency vehicles are unable to pass.

Loveland: This road is an issue seasonally, Alyeska Resort has new plan for 2023/24 parking that should improve capacity in Daylodge lot.

Donner Rd: GBOS passed resolution 2023-16 requesting no parking signs on one side of Donner Rd (brewery overflow parking issue) This initiates the process with MOA traffic dept for installation in summer 2024.

Timberline: No parking signs added in summer 2023 at end of Timberline/Virgin Creek Falls Trailhead.

During this reporting period. Officers of the Whittier Police Department completed the scenario-based force training and annual Taser certification.

Officer Ruben Garcia attended a weeklong Tactical Training Course in Texas. This course was sponsored by Texas POST and is transferable to APSC. Officer Garcia is looking forward to sharing his training insights with Whittier police staff.

On Monday, 12/4/23, I attended an online Zoom presentation regarding new tsunami mapping for the Whittier area. Various departments head from Whittier was in attendance. In brief, this is a collaboration between the State, Feds, and University of Alaska on putting together new inundation mapping for the Whittier area in the event of a Tsunami that can be triggered by a variety of environmental factors. The group believes the new mapping should be available by fall of 2024. We are looking forward to new information.

On 12/4/23 through 12/8/23 I participated in the Executive Development seminar and the Alaska Association of Chief of Police conference in Anchorage. Valuable information was received in both the AACOP annual meeting and conference which will be shared with officers and staff.
