AN ORDINANCE OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTERS 21.25, 21.40, 21.50, 21.55 AND 10.40 AND ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE OF REGULATIONS 10.40 REGARDING ADULT ORIENTED ESTABLISHMENTS, INCLUDING PHYSICAL CULTURE STUDIOS AND MASSAGE PARLORS.

WHEREAS, it is a lawful purpose of the Assembly to enact regulatory ordinances protecting and promoting the general welfare, health and safety of Municipal citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality is empowered to enact such ordinances pursuant to the Constitution and Laws of the State of Alaska; and

WHEREAS, state licensure laws in effect under Title 8 Chapter 84 for physical therapists and occupational therapists do not cover accredited massage therapy, and it is the intent of the Assembly to establish separate licensing categories for accredited and non-accredited massage and exempt all persons currently holding a license under Alaska Code Title 8 Chapter 84 and accredited massage practitioner from regulation under section two of this ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly deems it necessary to provide for licensing and regulation of adult oriented establishments including, but not limited to, adult bookstores, adult mini-motion picture establishments, adult motion picture theaters, physical culture studios, massage parlors, escort services, or similar type businesses where, by the nature of the business, minors under the age of 18 are denied entry or, businesses which are prohibited by law from having minors or unaccompanied minors on the premises for reasons other than the sale of liquor; and

WHEREAS, many adult oriented establishments provide rooms or install booths with doors in which patrons can view adult oriented movies or videotape or film or view other forms of adult entertainment; and

WHEREAS, it is well known and has been found in Milwaukee and Kenosha Counties, Wisconsin; Chattanooga, Tennessee; Newport News, Virginia; and Marion County, Indiana, to name a few locales, that the viewing booths in adult oriented establishments have been and are being used by patrons of said establishments for engaging in sexual acts, particularly between males, including but not limited to intercourse, sodomy, oral copulation and masturbation, resulting in unsafe and unsanitary conditions in said booths; and

WHEREAS, the State of Alaska Department of Health and Social Services, Division of Public Health, Section of Epidemiology has reported that as of December 31, 1992, 138 confirmed cases of Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome were reported in the State, including 90 that resulted in death.

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2 WHEREAS, AIDS is a sexually transmitted disease which destroys
3 body's immune system, is always fatal, and has no known cure; and
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5 WHEREAS, the viral agents responsible for AIDS and other sexually
6 transmitted diseases have all been isolated at one time or another from
7 semen; and
8

9 WHEREAS, adult businesses have been determined, by court accepted
10 independent studies, to produce secondary impacts on surrounding land
11 uses. The impacts include a decline in property values, and increase
12 in the level of criminal activity including prostitution, rape, and
13 assaults in the vicinity of these types of enterprises, and the
14 degradation of the community standard of morality by including a loss
15 of sensitivity to the adverse effect of pornography upon children, upon
16 established family relations, and upon respect for marital
17 relationships.
18

19 NOW THEREFORE, THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:
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21 Section 1: That AMC 10.40.010 is repealed. All individuals,
22 partnerships or corporations holding a license under AMC 10.40.010.A
23 upon adoption of this ordinance shall have 60 days from the effective
24 date to obtain a license under the new provisions set forth in section
25 two of this ordinance. All individuals holding a license under AMC
26 10.40.010.B upon adoption of this ordinance shall have 60 days from the
27 effective date to obtain a license under the new provisions set forth
28 in section three of this ordinance. The Clerk shall notify all current
29 licensees under AMC 10.40.010.A or B of the new provisions by first
30 class mail within 20 days of passage. The change in licensing
31 procedures will not alter existing uses for purposes of AMC 21.55.
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33 Section 2: That a new AMC 10.40.010 is enacted to read as
34 follows:
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36 10.40.050 Adult oriented establishment--license

38 A Definitions
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40 For the purpose of this section, the following words
41 phrases shall have the meanings indicated:
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- 43 1. "Accredited massage/practitioner" means any person that
44 provides massage, general massage therapy or body work
45 and has a license issued by the Municipal Clerk as an
46 accredited massage practitioner under AMC 10.40.060.B.1.
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48 2 "Adult-oriented establishment," or "Adult Business",
49 shall include, but is not limited to, "adult
50 bookstores," "adult motion picture theaters," "adult
51 mini-motion picture establishments," "physical culture
52 studios," "massage parlors," "escort services," or

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2 similar type businesses where, by the nature of the
3 business, minors under the age of 18 are denied entry,
4 or businesses which are prohibited by law from having
5 minors or unaccompanied minors on the premises for
6 reasons other than the sale of liquor, and further,
7 means any premises to which public patrons or members
8 are invited or admitted and which are so physically
9 arranged so as to provide booths, cubicles, rooms,
10 compartments or stalls separate from the common areas of
11 the premises for the purposes of viewing adult-oriented
12 motion pictures, or where an entertainer provides adult
13 entertainment to a member of the public, a patron or a
14 member, whether or not such adult entertainment is held,
15 conducted, operated or maintained for a profit, direct
16 or indirect. Adult-oriented establishment does not
17 include an "adult cabaret".

- 19 3. "Adult bookstore" means an establishment having as its
20 stock in trade, for sale, rent, lease, inspection or
21 viewing books, films, video cassettes, magazines or
22 other periodicals which are distinguished or
23 characterized by their emphasis on matters depicting,
24 describing or relating to "specific sexual activities"
25 or "specified anatomical area" as defined below, and in
26 conjunction therewith have facilities for the
27 presentation of adult oriented films, movies or live
28 performances, for observation.
29
- 30 4. "Adult motion picture theater" means an enclosed
31 building with a capacity of fifty (50) or more persons
32 used for presenting material having as its dominant
33 theme, or distinguished or characterized by an emphasis
34 on, matters depicting, describing or relating to
35 "specified sexual activities," or "specified anatomical
36 areas," as defined below, for observation by patrons
37 therein.
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- 39 5. "Adult mini-motion picture theater" means an enclosed
40 building with a capacity of less than fifty (50) persons
41 used for presenting material having as its dominant
42 theme, or distinguished or characterized by an emphasis
43 on, matters depicting, describing or relating to
44 "specified sexual activities," or "specified anatomical
45 areas," as defined below, for observation by patrons
46 therein.
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- 48 6. "Adult cabaret" means a cabaret which features topless
49 dancers, strippers, male or female impersonators, or
50 similar entertainers.
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7. "Adult entertainment" means any exhibition of any motion pictures, live performance, display or dance of any type, which has as its dominant theme, or is distinguished or characterized by an emphasis on, any actual or simulated "specified sexual activities," or "specified anatomical area," as defined below.
- 8 "Escort service" means a person or business that furnishes, offers to furnish or advertises to furnish escorts for a fee, tip or other consideration and/or prohibits service to or entry onto their premises of minors under the age of 18. Escort service shall not include computerized or telephonic services which do not allow access to the premises by customers.
9. "Massage" means the treatment of the human body by soft tissue manipulation, through the use of techniques including, but not limited to effleurage, petrissage, friction or tapotement.
- 10 "Non-accredited massage practitioner" means any person that provides massage, general massage, therapy or body work and has a license issued by the municipal clerk as a non-accredited massage practitioner under AMC 10.40.06.B.2.
- 11 "Operators" means any person, partnership, or corporation operating, conducting, maintaining or owning any adult-oriented establishment.
12. "Out call" means providing a service to anyone not on the premises of a business licensed as an adult business.
- 13 "Physical culture studio or massage parlor" means an establishment that provides any of the following services for hire or compensation:
- a) massage services performed by "non-accredited massage practitioner"
 - b) escorts
 - c) "out call" for escorts or massage performed by "non-accredited massage practitioner"
 - d) private rooms for the showing or viewing of "adult entertainment"
- 14 "Specified sexual activities" means simulated or actual

- 2 a) showing of human genitals in a state of sexual
3 stimulation or arousal;
4
5 b) acts of masturbation, sexual intercourse, sodomy
6 bestiality, necrophilia, sado-masochistic abuse
7 fellatio or cunnilingus;
8
9 c) fondling or erotic touching of human genitals,
10 pubic region, buttock or female breasts
11

12 15 "Specified anatomical areas" means:

- 13
14 a less than completely and opaquely covered human
15 genitals, pubic region, buttocks, and female
16 breast below a point immediately above the top of

22 B License
23

24 1 Except as provided in subsection (6) below, from and
25 after the effective date of this ordinance, no adult
26 oriented establishment shall be operated or maintained
27 in the Municipality of Anchorage without first obtaining
28 a license to operate issued by the Municipal Clerk.
29

30 2. A license may be issued only for one (1) adult-oriented
31 establishment located at a fixed and certain place. Any
32 person, partnership, or corporation which desires to
33 operate more than one adult-oriented establishment must
34 have a license for each.
35

36 No license or interest in a license may be transferred
37 to any person, partnership or corporation.
38

39 4 No person may engage in the business of providing
40 massages or related services within an adult business
41 without first obtaining a massage practitioner license
42 from the clerk under AMC 10.40.060.B.1 or B.2.
43

44 5 A person having a valid non-accredited massage
45 practitioner license may work only in a premises
46 operated by a person licensed under AMC 10.40.050. A
47 person having a valid non-accredited massage
48 practitioner license must notify the Clerk of any change
49 in work location.
50

51 6 All adult-oriented establishments existing at the time
52 of the passage of this ordinance must submit an

1 application for a license within sixty (60) days of the
 2 passage of this ordinance. If an application is not
 3 received within said sixty (60) day period, then such
 4 existing adult-oriented establishment shall cease
 5 operations.
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7 C. Application for License
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- 9
 10 1. Any person, partnership or corporation desiring to
 11 secure a license shall make application to the Municipal
 12 Clerk. The application shall be filed in triplicate
 13 with and dated by the Clerk. A copy of the application
 14 shall be distributed promptly by the Clerk to the
 15 Anchorage Police Department and to the applicant.
 16
 17 2. The application for a license shall be upon a form
 18 provided by the Clerk. An applicant for a license,
 19 shall furnish the following information under oath:
 20
 21 a) Name and address;
 22
 23 b) Written proof that the individual is at least
 24 eighteen (18) years of age;
 25
 26 c) Whether the applicant previously operated in this
 27 or any other county, city or state under an adult-
 28 oriented establishment license or similar business
 29 license; whether the applicant has ever had such a
 30 license revoked or suspended, the reason
 31 therefore, and the business entity or trade name
 32 under which the applicant operated that was
 33 subject to the suspension or revocation.
 34
 35 d) All criminal statutes, whether federal or state,
 36 or city ordinance violation convictions,
 37 forfeiture of bond and pleadings of nolo
 38 contendere on all charges, except minor traffic
 39 violations within the past 5 years.
 40
 41 e) The address of the adult-oriented establishment
 42 and the name of the business to be operated by the
 43 applicant.
 44
 45 f) If the applicant is a corporation, the application
 46 shall specify the name of the corporation, the
 47 date and state of incorporation, the name and
 48 address of the registered agent and the name and
 49 address of all shareholders owning more than five
 50 percent (5%) of the stock in said corporation and
 51 all officers and directors of the corporation.
 52

3. Within twenty one (21) days of receiving an application for a license the Clerk shall notify the applicant whether the application is granted or denied.
4. Whenever an application is denied, the Clerk shall advise the applicant in writing of the reasons for such action. If the applicant requests a hearing within ten (10) days of receipt of notification of denial, a public hearing shall be held within ten (10) days thereafter before the Clerk, as hereinafter provided.
5. Failure or refusal of the applicant to give any information relevant to the investigation for the application or his or her refusal or failure to appear at any reasonable time and place for examination under oath regarding said application or his or her refusal to submit to or cooperate with any investigation required by this ordinance shall constitute an admission by the applicant that he or she is ineligible for such license and shall be grounds for denial thereof by the Clerk.
6. The applicant shall include the name and date of birth for each current employee and upon issuance of the license shall be required to file with the Clerk's Office within 30 days of hiring a new employee the name and date of birth of the employee hired. The Clerk shall be required to forward the new information to the Anchorage Police Department as required under C1 of this section.

D. Standards for Issuance of License.

1. To receive a license to operate an adult-oriented establishment, an applicant, and the applicant's employees, must meet the following standards:
 - a) If the applicant is an individual:
 - 1) The applicant shall be at least eighteen (18) years of age.
 - 2) The applicant, and the applicant's employees, shall not have been found to have previously violated any provision of this ordinance within five (5) years immediately preceding the date of the application.
 - b) If the applicant is a corporation:

1 1 All officers, directors and stockholders
2 required to be named under Section C.2.f
3 shall be at least eighteen (18) years of age.

4
5 2) No officer, director, or stockholder required
6 to be named under Section C.2.f shall have
7 been found to have previously violated this
8 ordinance within five (5) years immediately
9 preceding the date of the application.

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11 c If the applicant is a partnership, joint venture,
12 or any other type of organization where two (2) or
13 more persons have a financial interest:

14
15 1 All persons having a financial interest in
16 the partnership, joint venture or other type
17 of organization shall be at least eighteen
18 (18) years of age.

19
20 2) No person having a financial interest in the
21 partnership, joint venture or other type of
22 organization shall have been found to have
23 violated any provision of this ordinance
24 within five (5) years immediately preceding
25 the date of the application.

26
27 **E. Fees and bond**

28
29 1. A license fee of FIVE HUNDRED (\$500.00) DOLLARS shall be
30 submitted with the application for a license. If the
31 application is denied, the fee shall be returned.

32
33 2. An applicant for a license shall file a bond in the
34 amount of FIVE THOUSAND (\$5,000.00) DOLLARS with his
35 application. The bond shall be conditioned on the
36 licensee's compliance with Title 10 and all applicable
37 laws. Proceedings against the bond may be initiated by
38 a customer or victim involved in the violation or by the
39 Municipality as a penalty for the violation.

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41 **F. Display of License or Permit**

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43 The license shall be displayed in a conspicuous public place
44 in the adult-oriented establishment.

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46 **H. Renewal of License or Permit**

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48 1. Every license issued pursuant to this Ordinance will
49 terminate at the expiration of one (1) year from the
50 date of issuance, unless sooner revoked, and must be
51 renewed before operation is allowed in the following
52

1 year. Any operator desiring to renew a license shall
 2 make application to the Clerk. The application for
 3 renewal must be filed not later than sixty (60) days
 4 before the license expires. The application for renewal
 5 shall be filed in triplicate with and dated by the
 6 Clerk. A copy of the application for renewal shall be
 7 distributed promptly by the Clerk to the Anchorage
 8 Police Department and to the operator. The application
 9 for renewal shall be upon a form provided by the Clerk
 10 and shall contain such information and data, given under
 11 oath or affirmation, as is required for an application
 12 for a new license.
 13

- 14
- 15 2. A license renewal fee of FIVE HUNDRED (\$500.00) DOLLARS
 16 shall be submitted with the application for renewal. In
 17 addition to the renewal fee, a late penalty of ONE
 18 HUNDRED (\$100.00) DOLLARS shall be assessed against the
 19 applicant who files for a renewal less than sixty (60)
 20 days before the license expires. If the application is
 21 denied, the renewal fee only shall be returned.
 22
 - 23 3. If the Anchorage Police Department is aware of any
 24 information bearing on the operator's qualifications, or
 25 that of the applicant's employees, that information
 26 shall be filed in writing with the Clerk.
 27

28 I. Revocation of License.

- 29 1. The Clerk shall revoke a license or permit for any of
 30 the following reasons:
 31
 - 32 a) Discovery that false or misleading information or
 33 data was given on any application or material
 34 facts were omitted from any application.
 35
 - 36 b) The operator or any employee of the operator,
 37 violates any provision of this Chapter or any rule
 38 or regulation adopted pursuant to this Chapter.
 39
 - 40 c) The operator becomes ineligible to obtain a
 41 license or permit.
 42
 - 43 d) Any cost or fee required to be paid by this
 44 Ordinance is not paid.
 45
 - 46 e) Any intoxicating liquor or cereal malt beverage is
 47 served or consumed on the premises of the adult-
 48 oriented establishment.
 49
 - 50 f) The applicant, or the applicant's employees,
 51 manager or designated representative having been
 52

convicted of the following offenses at the location to which an adult business license has been issued or if services are rendered at another location by any employee representing the business to which the license has been issued:

(1) involving any of the following offenses as described in Chapter 8 of the Anchorage Municipal Code:

- (a) assignation for prostitution
- (b) prostitution
- (c) offering to secure another for prostitution
- (d) maintaining place of prostitution
- (e) owning or leasing place of prostitution
- (f) coercing another to become a prostitute
- (g) Section 8.05.410 Minors--Prohibited performances and exhibitions
- (h) Section 8.05.410 Minors--Disseminating indecent material to
- (i) Section 8.05.425 Sexual exploitation of minors.

(2) for which:

- (a) less than two years have elapsed since the date of conviction or the date of release from confinement imposed for the conviction, whichever is the later date, if the conviction is of a misdemeanor offense;
- (b) less than five years have elapsed since the date of conviction or the date of release from confinement imposed for the conviction, whichever is the later date, if the conviction is of a felony offense;
- (c) less than five years have elapsed since the date of the last conviction or the date of release from confinement for the last conviction, whichever is the later date, if the convictions are of two or more misdemeanor offenses or combination of misdemeanor offenses occurring within any twenty four (24) month period;

(d) the fact that a conviction is being appealed shall have no effect on the revocation of the license.

- 2. The Clerk, before revoking or suspending any license or permit, shall give the operator at least ten (10) days written notice of the charges against him/her, and the opportunity for a public hearing before the Clerk, as hereinafter provided.
- 3. The transfer of a license or any interest in a license shall automatically and immediately revoke the license.
- 4. Any of the reasons set forth in AMC 10.10.035.
- 5. Any operator whose license is revoked shall not be eligible to receive a license for one (1) year and one (1) day from the date of revocation. No location or premises for which a license has been issued shall be used as an adult-oriented establishment for a period of one (1) year and one (1) day from the date of revocation of the license.

J. Physical Layout of Adult-Oriented Establishment.

Any adult-oriented establishment having available for customers, patrons or members, any booth, room or cubicle for the private viewing of any adult entertainment must comply with the following requirements:

- 1. Access. Each booth, room or cubicle shall be totally accessible to and from aisles and public areas of the adult-oriented establishment, and shall be unobstructed by any curtain, door, lock or other control-type devices.
- 2. Construction. Every booth, room or cubicle shall meet the following construction requirements:
 - a) Each booth, room or cubicle shall be separated from adjacent booths, rooms and cubicles and any non-public areas by a wall.
 - b) Have at least one side totally open to a public lighted aisle so that there is an unobstructed view at all times of anyone occupying same.
 - c) All walls shall be solid and without any openings, extended from the floor to a height of not less than six (6) feet and be light colored, non-absorbent, smooth textured and easily cleanable.

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- d) The floor must be light colored, non-absorbent smooth textured and easily cleanable.
- e The lighting level of each booth, room or cubical, when not in use shall be a minimum of ten (10) foot candles at all times, as measured from the floor.

3. Occupants. Only one individual shall occupy a booth, room or cubicle at any time. No occupant of same shall engage in any type of sexual activity, cause any bodily discharge or litter while in the booth. No individual shall damage or deface any portion of the booth.

K. Responsibilities of the Operator

- 1. Every act or omission by an employee constituting a violation of the provision of this Ordinance shall be deemed the act or omission of the operator if such act or omission occurs either with the authorization, knowledge, or approval of the operator, or as a result of the operator's negligent failure to supervise the employee's conduct, and the operator shall be punishable for such act or omission in the same manner as if the operator committed the act or caused the omission.
- 2 Any act or omission of any employee constituting a violation of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed the act or omission of the operator for purposes of determining whether the operator's license shall be revoked, suspended or renewed.
- 3. No employee of an adult-oriented establishment shall allow any minor to loiter around or to frequent an adult-oriented establishment or to allow any minor to view adult entertainment as defined herein.
- 4 The operator shall maintain the premises in a clean and sanitary manner at all times.
- 5. The operator shall maintain at least 10 foot candles of light in the public portions of the establishment, including aisles, at all times. However, if a lesser level of illumination in the aisles shall be necessary to enable a patron to view the adult entertainment in a booth, room or cubicle adjoining aisle, a lesser amount of illumination may be maintained in such aisles, provided, however, at no time shall there be less than one (1) foot candle of illumination in said aisles, as measured from the floor.

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6. The operator shall insure compliance of the establishment and its patrons with the provisions of this Ordinance.

7. No licensee shall have any other license or permits for games of chance to be played or sold on that premises licensed as an Adult Business.

8. An operator may not have his/her business premises connected by any means of ingress or egress with premises occupied by an establishment selling or dispensing alcoholic beverages.

L. Administrative Procedure and Review.

Review of the grant, denial, renewal, nonrenewal, suspension or revocation of a license shall be in accordance with AMC 10.10.035 and AMC 3.60.

M. Exclusions

All private schools, and public schools, operated under the supervision of the Anchorage School District and/or the Alaska State Board of Education, located within the Municipality are exempt from obtaining a license hereunder when instructing pupils in sex education as part of its curriculum.

N. Penalties and Prosecution.

Any person, partnership, or corporation which is found to have violated this Ordinance shall be fined a definite sum not exceeding the bond posted by the applicant required under section E.2. of this ordinance and shall result in the revocation of any license. The municipal clerk shall notify the administrative official, as identified in AMC 21.25.030, of any convictions for violations of AMC 10.40.050. Whenever a particular establishment is the location of two or more violations of this ordinance occurring within a 24 month period, the administrative official shall proceed against the use entitlement under AMC 21.25.030.

O. Severability.

If any provision of this Ordinance is deemed invalid or unconstitutional by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the other provisions of same.

P. Enforcement

1 The Anchorage Police Department shall have the authority to
 2 enter any adult oriented establishment at all reasonable
 3 times to inspect the premises and enforce this ordinance.

5 Section 3: That a new AMC 10.40.060 is enacted to read as
 6 follows:

10 No person may engage in the business of providing massages or
 11 related services without first obtaining an accredited massage
 12 practitioner or a non-accredited massage practitioner license from
 13 the municipal clerk.

17 For the purpose of this section, the following words and phrases
 18 shall have the meanings indicated:

- 21 1. "Massage" means the treatment of the human body by soft
 22 tissue manipulation, through the use of techniques including,
 23 but not limited to effleurage, petrissage, friction or
 24 tapotement.
 25
 - 26 2. "Accredited massage practitioner" means a person who has
 27 graduated from a state approved post secondary education
 28 school of massage therapy or other massage therapy training
 29 program which requires the successful completion of a program
 30 of at least 160 hours of supervised instruction or current
 31 professional class membership in a recognized national
 32 professional society whose policy making officials are
 33 elected by the professional class membership and whose
 34 members are pledged to a code of ethics and the pursuit of
 35 continuing professional education or current certification by
 36 the national certification board for therapeutic massage and
 37 body work or its successor or a national certification
 38 program meeting similar standards or persons currently
 39 licensed under Alaska Statutes Title 8 Chapter 84 or any
 40 person who has been issued a license as a massage
 41 practitioner from a state that regulates massage therapists.
 42
 - 43 3. "Non-accredited massage practitioner" means a person engaging
 44 in general massage work that has not met the standards
 45 required for accredited massage practitioner as defined in
 46 subsection A.2 of this section.
 47
 - 48 4. "Engaging in the business of providing massages or related
 49 services" means administrating for compensation or hire a
 50 method of treating the superficial parts of the human body
 51 through physical contact with or by rubbing, stroking,
 52

1 kneading, tapping, rolling, pounding or vibration for the
 2 purposes of relaxation, amusement, hygiene or improvement of
 3 physical appearance, muscle tone or circulation.

5 B. License
 6

- 7 1. An accredited massage practitioner licensee must be 18 years
 8 of age and fill out a form supplied by the municipal clerk
 9 and provide evidence of certification as defined above in
 10 subsection A.2 of this section.
 11
 12 2. A non-accredited massage practitioner licensee must be 18
 13 years of age and fill out a form supplied by the municipal
 14 clerk, and
 15
 16 a) not be addicted to intoxicants, dangerous drugs or

Subject: An Ordinance of the Municipality of Anchorage Amending AMC Chapters 21.25, 21.40, 21.50, 21.55 and 10.40 and Anchorage Municipal Code of Regulations Chapter 10.40 Regarding Adult Oriented Establishments, Including Physical Culture Studios and Massage Parlors

The adult ordinance proposed is intended to regulate licensing and certain aspects of adult oriented establishments. The ordinance would repeal AMC 10.40.010, the physical culture studio ordinance in which all massage practitioners are regulated, and replace it with two licensing programs; one regulating adult establishments and the other directed at massage practitioners. The existing ordinance requires all massage practitioners to be fingerprinted and submit background checks to the police. Clearly, hundreds of men and women that offer legitimate massage related services are offended by having to submit to this licensing procedure. This new ordinance creates two separate massage licenses: accredited and non-accredited. The ordinance also institutes a license for adult establishments. Other than a \$50 license fee for accredited massage practitioners, no other regulation of their business or practice is covered under this new ordinance. There are more than 100 massage practitioners in Anchorage who are not currently licensed. If the MOA continues to require these business professionals to be fingerprinted and submit to police interrogation, they will continue to ignore the license requirement.

AMC 10.40.010 also requires all massage practitioners to be licensed as physical culture studios and to be located in an approved zone 1000 feet from churches, schools, etc. Clearly, professional people are not, and should not be, lumped into this adult requirement created in 1988. The adult zoning ordinance, AMC 21.45.240, places a difficult burden on zoning enforcement to decide which businesses to issue permits to.

This ordinance is content neutral, which means it does not seek to regulate or restrict the viewing or purchasing of any type of constitutionally protected material. It also establishes procedures for issuing licenses for adult establishments, as well as massage practitioners. A large portion of the ordinance is rewritten from existing ordinances. The ordinance also establishes procedures for repeal of these licenses should the licensee be convicted of certain crimes. It also provides grandfather rights to each adult establishment, currently in violation of 21.40.050, allowing for conditional or non-conforming uses until the business ceases and the non-conforming use right is terminated.

The ordinance establishes a \$500 fee for an adult establishment license, and requires a \$5,000 bond be posted for each adult establishment license issued.

34 they do not have rooms or booths in the business for on-site viewing of adult
35 material.

38 Section K states the responsibilities of the operator while holding a license. Operators
39 will be held responsible for acts or omissions of their employees. This section also
40 prohibits the selling or dispensing of alcohol.

45 Section M provides exclusions for private schools, the Anchorage School District, and
46 others that may instruct pupils in sex education as part of their curriculum.

6 Section P provides for enforcement and allows the Anchorage Police Department to
7 inspect the premises and enforce this ordinance.


