AN ORDINANCE OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTERS 21.25, 21.40, 21.50, 21.55 AND 10.40 AND ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE OF REGULATIONS 10.40 REGARDING ADULT ORIENTED ESTABLISHMENTS, INCLUDING PHYSICAL CULTURE STUDIOS AND MASSAGE PARLORS.

10 WHEREAS, it is a lawful purpose of the Assembly to enact regulatory drdinances protecting and promoting the general welfare, health and safety of Municipal citizens; and

14 WHEREAS, the Municipality is empowered to enact such ordinances 15 pursuant to the Constitution and Laws of the State of Alaska; and 16

17 WHEREAS, state licensure laws in effect under Title 8 Chapter 84 for 18 physical therapists and occupational therapists do not cover accredited 19 massage therapy, and it is the intent of the Assembly to establish 20 separate licensing categories for accredited and non-accredited massage and exempt all persons currently holding a license under Alaska Code Title 8 Chapter 84 and accredited massage practitioner from regulation 21 22 23 under section two of this ordinance; and 24

25 WHEREAS, the Assembly deems it necessary to provide for licensing and 26 regulation of adult oriented establishments including, but not limited 27 to, adult bookstores, adult mini-motion picture establishments, adult 28 motion picture theaters, physical culture studios, massage parlors, 29 escort services, or similar type businesses where, by the nature of the 30 business, minors under the age of 18 are denied entry or, businesses 31 which are prohibited by law from having minors or unaccompanied minors 32 on the premises for reasons other than the sale of liquor; and 33

34 WHEREAS, many adult oriented establishments provide rooms or install 35 booths with doors in which patrons can view adult oriented movies or 36 videotape or film or view other forms of adult entertainment; and 37

38 WHEREAS, it is well known and has been found in Milwaukee and Kenosha 39 Counties, Wisconsin; Chattanooga, Tennessee; Newport News, Virginia; 40 and Marion County, Indiana, to name a few locales, that the viewing 41 booths in adult oriented establishments have been and are being used by 42 patrons of said establishments for engaging in sexual acts, 43 particularly between males, including but not limited to intercourse, 44 sodomy, oral copulation and masturbation, resulting in unsafe and 45 unsanitary conditions in said booths; and 46

47 WHEREAS, the State of Alaska Department of Health and Social Services, 48 Division of Public Health, Section of Epidemiology has reported that as 49 of December 31, 1992, 138 confirmed cases of Acquired Immune Deficiency 50 Syndrome were reported in the State, including 90 that resulted in 51 death. 52 i

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WHEREAS, AIDS is a sexually transmitted disease which destroys body's immune system, is always fatal, and has no known cure; and

WHEREAS, the viral agents responsible for AIDS and other sexually transmitted diseases have all been isolated at one time or another from semen; and

9 WHEREAS, adult businesses have been determined, by court accepted independent studies, to produce secondary impacts on surrounding land 10 11 The impacts include a decline in property values, and increase uses. 12 in the level of criminal activity including prostitution, rape, and 13 assaults in the vicinity of these types of enterprises, and the 14 degradation of the community standard of morality by including a loss 15 of sensitivity to the adverse effect of pornography upon children, upon 16 established family relations, and upon respect for marital 17 relationships. 18

NOW THEREFORE, THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

21 That AMC 10.40.010 is repealed. All individuals, Section 1: 22 partnerships or corporations holding a license under AMC 10.40.010.A 23 upon adoption of this ordinance shall have 60 days from the effective 24 date to obtain a license under the new provisions set forth in section two of this ordinance. All individuals holding a license under AMC 10.40.010.B upon adoption of this ordinance shall have 60 days from the effective date to obtain a license under the new provisions set forth in section three of this ordinance. The Clerk shall notify all current licensees under AMC 10.40.010.A or B of the new provisions by first class mail within 20 days of passage. The change in licensing procedures will not alter existing uses for purposes of AMC 21.55.

Section 2: That a new AMC 10.40.010 is enacted to read as follows:

10.40.050 Adult oriented establishment -- license

A Definitions

> For the purpose of this section, the following words phrases shall have the meanings indicated:

- 1. "Accredited massage/practitioner" means any person that provides massage, general massage therapy or body work and has a license issued by the Municipal Clerk as an accredited massage practitioner under AMC 10.40.060.B.1.
- 2 "Adult-oriented establishment," or "Adult Business", shall include, but is not limited to, "adult bookstores, " "adult motion picture theaters, " "adult mini-motion picture establishments, " "physical culture studios," "massage parlors," "escort services," or

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similar type businesses where, by the nature of the business, minors under the age of 18 are denied entry, or businesses which are prohibited by law from having minors or unaccompanied minors on the premises for reasons other than the sale of liquor, and further, means any premises to which public patrons or members are invited or admitted and which are so physically arranged so as to provide booths, cubicles, rooms, compartments or stalls separate from the common areas of the premises for the purposes of viewing adult-oriented motion pictures, or where an entertainer provides adult entertainment to a member of the public, a patron or a member, whether or not such adult entertainment is held, conducted, operated or maintained for a profit, direct Adult-oriented establishment does not or indirect. include an "adult cabaret".

"Adult bookstore" means an establishment having as its stock in trade, for sale, rent, lease, inspection or viewing books, films, video cassettes, magazines or which periodicals are distinguished other or characterized by their emphasis on matters depicting, describing or relating to "specific sexual activities" or "specified anatomical area" as defined below, and in have conjunction therewith facilities for the presentation of adult oriented films, movies or live performances, for observation.
 - 4. "Adult motion picture theater" means an enclosed building with a capacity of fifty (50) or more persons used for presenting material having as its dominant theme, or distinguished or characterized by an emphasis on, matters depicting, describing or relating to "specified sexual activities," or "specified anatomical areas," as defined below, for observation by patrons therein.
 - 5 "Adult mini-motion picture theater" means an enclosed building with a capacity of less than fifty (50) persons used for presenting material having as its dominant theme, or distinguished or characterized by an emphasis on, matters depicting, describing or relating to "specified sexual activities," or "specified anatomical areas, " as defined below, for observation by patrons therein.
 - 6. "Adult cabaret" means a cabaret which features topless dancers, strippers, male or female impersonators, or similar entertainers.

"Adult entertainment" means any exhibition of any motion 2 3 pictures, live performance, display or dance of any which has as its dominant theme, is 4 type. or 5 distinguished or characterized by an emphasis on, any actual or simulated "specified sexual activities," or 6 "specified anatomical area," as defined below. 7 8 9 8 "Escort service" means a person or business that 10 furnishes, offers to furnish or advertises to furnish escorts for a fee, tip or other consideration and/or 11 12 prohibits service to or entry onto their premises of minors under the age of 18. Escort service shall not 13 14 include computerized or telephonic services which do not 15 allow access to the premises by customers. 16 17 9. - 15 "Specified anatomical areas" means:
 - a less than completely and opaquely covered human genitals, pubic region, buttocks, and female breast below a point immediately above the top of the areola;
 - b) human male genitals in a discernible turgid state, even if opaquely covered.
- **B** License
 - 1 Except as provided in subsection (6) below, from and after the effective date of this ordinance, no adult oriented establishment shall be operated or maintained in the Municipality of Anchorage without first obtaining a license to operate issued by the Municipal Clerk.
 - 2. A license may be issued only for one (1) adult-oriented establishment located at a fixed and certain place. Any person, partnership, or corporation which desires to operate more than one adult-oriented establishment must have a license for each.

No license or interest in a license may be transferred to any person, partnership or corporation.

- 4 No person may engage in the business of providing massages or related services within an adult business without first obtaining a massage practitioner license from the clerk under AMC 10.40.060.B.1 or B.2.
- 5 valid non-accredited person having a massage Α practitioner license may work only in a premises operated by a person licensed under AMC 10.40.050. Α person having a valid non-accredited massage practitioner license must notify the Clerk of any change in work location.

- 3. Within twenty one (21) days of receiving an application for a license the Clerk shall notify the applicant whether the application is granted or denied.
- 4. Whenever an application is denied, the Clerk shall advise the applicant in writing of the reasons for such action. If the applicant requests a hearing within ten (10) days of receipt of notification of denial, a public hearing shall be held within ten (10) days thereafter before the Clerk, as hereinafter provided.
- 5 Failure or refusal of the applicant to give any information relevant to the investigation for the application or his or her refusal or failure to appear at any reasonable time and place for examination under oath regarding said application or his or her refusal to submit to or cooperate with any investigation required by this ordinance shall constitute an admission by the applicant that he or she is ineligible for such license and shall be grounds for denial thereof by the Clerk.
 - 6. The applicant shall include the name and date of birth for each current employee and upon issuance of the license shall be required to file with the Clerk's Office within 30 days of hiring a new employee the name and date of birth of the employee hired. The Clerk shall be required to forward the new information to the Anchorage Police Department as required under C1 of this section.
- D. Standards for Issuance of License.
 - 1. To receive a license to operate an adult-oriented establishment, an applicant, and the applicant's employees, must meet the following standards:
 - a) If the applicant is an individual:
 - 1 The applicant shall be at least eighteen (18) years of age.
 - 2) The applicant, and the applicant's employees, shall not have been found to have previously violated any provision of this ordinance within five (5) years immediately preceding the date of the application.
 - b) If the applicant is a corporation:

- K. Responsibilities of the Operator
 - 1. Every act or omission by an employee constituting a violation of the provision of this Ordinance shall be deemed the act or omission of the operator if such act or omission occurs either with the authorization, knowledge, or approval of the operator, or as a result of the operator's negligent failure to supervise the employee's conduct, and the operator shall be punishable for such act or omission in the same manner as if the operator committed the act or caused the omission.
 - 2 Any act or omission of any employee constituting a violation of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed the act or omission of the operator for purposes of determining whether the operator's license shall be revoked, suspended or renewed.
 - 3. No employee of an adult-oriented establishment shall allow any minor to loiter around or to frequent an adult-oriented establishment or to allow any minor to view adult entertainment as defined herein.
 - 4 The operator shall maintain the premises in a clean and sanitary manner at all times.
 - 5. The operator shall maintain at least 10 foot candles of light in the public portions of the establishment, including aisles, at all times. However, if a lesser level of illumination in the aisles shall be necessary to enable a patron to view the adult entertainment in a booth, room or cubicle adjoining aisle, a lesser amount of illumination may be maintained in such aisles, provided, however, at no time shall there be less than one (1) foot candle of illumination in said aisles, as measured from the floor.

- 6. The operator shall insure compliance of the establishment and its patrons with the provisions of this Ordinance. 7. No licensee shall have any other license or permits for games of chance to be played or sold on that premises licensed as an Adult Business. An operator may not have his/her business premises 8. connected by any means of ingress or egress with premises occupied by an establishment selling or dispensing alcoholic beverages. L. Administrative Procedure and Review. Review of the grant, denial, renewal, nonrenewal, suspension or revocation of a license shall be in accordance with AMC 10.10.035 and AMC 3.60. Μ. Exclusions All private schools, and public schools, operated under the supervision of the Anchorage School District and/or the Alaska State Board of Education, located within the Municipality are exempt from obtaining a license hereunder when instructing pupils in sex education as part of its curriculum. N. Penalties and Prosecution. Any person, partnership, or corporation which is found to have violated this Ordinance shall be fined a definite sum not exceeding the bond posted by the applicant required under section E.2. of this ordinance and shall result in the revocation of any license. The municipal clerk shall notify the administrative official, as identified in AMC 21.25.030, of any convictions for violations of AMC 10.40.050. Whenever a particular establishment is the location of two or more violations of this ordinance occurring within a 24 month period, the administrative official shall proceed against the use entitlement under AMC 21.25.030. Severability. 0. If any provision of this Ordinance is deemed invalid or unconstitutional by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the other provisions of same.

An Ordinance of the Municipality of Anchorage Amending AMC Chapters 21.25, 21.40, 21.50, 21.55 and 10.40 and Anchorage Municipal Cone of Regulations Chapter 10.40 Regarding Adult Oriented Establishments, Including Physical Culture Studios and Massage Parlors

The adult ordinance proposed is intended to regulate licensing and certain aspects of adult oriented establishments. The ordinance would repeal AMC 10.40.010, the physical culture studio ordinance in which all massage practitioners are regulated, and replace it with two licensing programs; one regulating adult establishments and the other directed at massage practitioners. The existing ordinance requires all massage practitioners to be fingerprinted and submit background checks to the poll e. Clearly, hundreds of men and women that offer legitimate massage related services are offended by having to submit to this licensing procedure. This new ordinance creates two separate massage licenses: accredited and non-accredited. The ordinance also institutes a 100 massage practitioners in Anchorage who are not currently licensed. If the MOA continues to require these business professionals to be fingerprinted and submit to police interrogation, they will continue to ignore the license requirement.

AMC 10.40.010 also requires all massage practitioners to be licensed as physical culture studios ⁴⁴⁸ and to be located in an approved zone 1000 feet from churches, schools, etc. Clearly, professional people are not, and should not be, lumped into this adult requirement created in 1988. The adult zoning ordinance, AMC 21.45.240, places a difficult burden on zoning enforcement to decide which businesses to issue permits to.

This ordinance is content neutral, which means it does not seek to togulate or restrict the viewing or purchasing of any type of constitutionally protected material. It also establishes procedures for issuing licenses for adult establishments, as well as massage practitioners. A large portion of the ordinance is rewritten from existing ordinances. The ordinance also establishes approcedures for repeal of these licenses should the licensee be convicted of certain crimes. It also provides grandfather rights to each adult establishment, currently in violation of 21.40.050, allowing for conditional or non-conforming uses until the business ceases and the non-conforming use right is terminated.

The ordinance establishes a \$500 fee for an adult establishment license, and requires a \$5,000 bond be posted for each adult establishment license issued.

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Page 2:

Section 2 institutes the adult establishment license and includes definitions.

Page 5:

Section B describes the adult establishment license and its requirements. One requirement that has changed states non-accredited massage practitioners must work only in a business that holds an adult establishment license. Current law requires all massage practitioners work under an adult establishment license.

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Page 6:

Section C provides requirements to obtain the adult establishment license.

Page 7:

Section D provides standards for issuance of the license.

Page 8:

Section E provides for a fee requirement of \$500 and a bond requirement of \$5,000.

Section F provides for the display of the adult establishment license.

Section H provides for the renewal of the adult establishment license.

Page 9:

Section I provides for revocation of the license, should a license holder or their employees be involved in offenses such as prostitution or crimes against minors. Current laws do not have this provision.

Page 11:

Section J establishes the physical layout of the adult oriented establishment. This section deals with private viewing of adult material inside the business. This section will eliminate holes in booth we''s placed there for the purposes of phonymous sexual contact between patrons in the booths. These regulations have been constitutionally upheld. Video stores that rent adult video tapes are not regulated under this section provided they do not have rooms or booths in the business for on-site viewing of adult material.

Page 12:

Section K states the responsibilities of the operator while holding a license. Operators will be held responsible for acts or omissions of their employees. This section also prohibits the selling or dispensing of alcohol.

Page 13:

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Section L provides for administrative procedure and review.

Section M provides exclusions for private schools, the Anchorage School District, and others that may instruct pupils in sex education as part of their curriculum.
