RE: Recall Petition 2020-5

Dear Mr. Biggs:

In accordance with the May 20, 2021, split decision in Judge Kevin M. Saxby's order in the matter of RUSSELL BIGGS v. BARBARA A. JONES AND MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE (Case No. 3AN-20-08262CI), the Municipal Clerk's Office is providing you with the recall petition on the successful portion of your application to recall Assembly Member Meg Zaletel.

On June 15, 2021, 900 pages of the recall petition were provided to you. Under Anchorage Municipal Code of Regulations, section 3.90.002, additional petition pages will cost \$0.30 per page, because the Municipal Clerk's Office has already spent one hour preparing and printing petition pages, and by policy, the office charges after the first hour.

Please note the following:

- In order for this recall to be placed on a ballot before the voters of Assembly District 4, the recall petition must contain at least **2,468** signatures of voters residing in Assembly District 4. This number is 25% of the votes cast in the April 2, 2019 election for Assembly Seat F.
- The signatures must be collected within 60 days of issuance of the petition, by **August 16, 2021**. All signatures must be submitted at the same time. The Clerk's Office will not accept serial submittal of signature pages.
- Signatures may only be collected by petition sponsors. Additional sponsors may be added at any time before the petition is filed using the "Recall Application – Adding a Petition Sponsor" form, of which you are in possession.
- Signatures shall be in ink or indelible pencil and shall be collected only on the petition pages provided by the Clerk's Office.

- The Clerk's Office will verify all signatures received on the petition. Illegible signatures that are not accompanied by a legible residence shall be rejected.

As you know, Judge Saxby's decision is currently on appeal before the Alaska Supreme Court. Proceedings in Case No. S-18102 may affect this recall. Through its attorneys, the Clerk's Office will follow the orders of the Alaska Supreme Court, up to and including not holding a recall election even if adequate signatures have been collected, as directed by the Court. By gathering signatures while legal proceedings are pending, you assume the risk that the Court will not allow the recall to proceed. The Clerk's Office will not provide any relief to you, including refunds of payments for petition pages, if the Alaska Supreme Court rules that the recall should not go forward.


