A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY HONORING THELMA G. BUCHHOLDT AND REQUESTING A CITIZEN NAMING PANEL.

WHEREAS, on November 5, 2007, Anchorage lost one of its finest residents with the passing of Thelma G. Buchholdt, whose lifelong and distinguished career - from author to public servant – is worthy of lasting recognition as an integral part of Alaskan history; and

WHEREAS, Thelma G. Buchholdt was born on August 1, 1934 in Claveria in the northern Philippines, came to the United States in 1951 and later graduated from Mount St. Mary's College in Los Angeles; and

WHEREAS, while a graduate student at the University of Nevada Las Vegas, Thelma G. Buchholdt met her husband of fifty years, Jon Buchholdt; and

WHEREAS, Jon and Thelma Buchholdt moved their family to Anchorage in 1965; and

WHEREAS, as a public servant and private citizen, Thelma G. Buchholdt worked to increase the standard of living for all Alaskans through her participation in the March of Dimes, the League of Women Voters, and as one of the founders of the Boys and Girls Clubs of Alaska; and

WHEREAS, in 1973, Thelma G. Buchholdt was elected the first woman president of the Filipino Community of Anchorage and served two consecutive terms; and

WHEREAS, in 1974, Thelma G. Buchholdt was elected to the Alaska House of Representatives, becoming the first Filipino-American woman legislator in the United States, and subsequently re-elected in 1976, 1978 and 1980; and

WHEREAS, during her tenure, Representative Thelma G. Buchholdt served on the House Finance Committee and championed funding for the Spenard Community Recreation Center, the Dempsey-Anderson Ice Arena, the Asian-Alaskan Cultural Center in Spenard, and the renovation of the Filipino Community Hall in Juneau, as well as funding for local roads, trails and parks; and

WHEREAS, in 1980, Thelma G. Buchholdt was elected the first Asian-American president of the National Order of Women Legislators; and

WHEREAS, Thelma G. Buchholdt was appointed director of the State of Alaska Office of Equal Employment Opportunity by Governor Tony Knowles; and

WHEREAS, passionate about history and the contribution of Filipinos in Alaska, Thelma G. Buchholdt wrote a 200-page book, "Filipinos in Alaska: 1788-1958" and produced a 30-minute documentary film chronicling the same, and served as Vice President of the Filipino-American National Historical Society; and

WHEREAS, the fruits of Thelma G. Buchholdt's public service, her commitment to the Filipino community, and her pioneering efforts in recording the history of Filipinos in Alaska are legacies whereby all Alaskan communities are enriched; and

WHEREAS, to honor Thelma G. Buchholdt by designating in her memory a public area, internal fixture or feature as set out in AMC Chapter 3.97, will recognize this exceptional citizen and remind us and future generations how we can build new frontiers of opportunity for individuals and for our great state;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY HEREBY RESOLVES:

The Anchorage Assembly requests that a citizen naming panel be convened to assist the Assembly and the community in naming a greenbelt or other appropriate internal area, fixture or feature to honor and recognize Thelma G. Buchholdt's long and distinguished career, from author to public servant, as follows:

- 1. Aurora Hovland, President of the Filipino National Historical Society, and Quint Bagcal, President of the Filipino Community Anchorage, Inc., are active in the Filipino community, sharing Thelma Buchholdt's passion about history and the contribution of Filipinos in Alaska, and are selected by the Assembly for service on this Naming Panel.
- 2. The Mayor's Office designees to this Naming Panel are two former Alaska legislators and colleagues of Thelma Buchholdt, each of whom share Thelma Buchholdt's community spirit and dedication to public service: Cynthia Toohey and Arliss Sturgulewski.
- 3. If the naming action involves a park, or other asset of the Parks and Recreation Department (park, building, trail, etc.), the issue shall be referred to the Parks and Recreation Commission for an advisory opinion. If the asset is in the Chugiak/Eagle-River Parks District, then it is referred to that service area board. The naming panel shall coordinate its efforts in accordance with AMC Chapter 3.97.
- 4. Larry Baker is the Mayor's Office designee to assist in coordinating the work of this citizen naming panel, assisting the panel in holding a public meeting, facilitating deliberation, and presenting any park asset to the appropriate authority for an advisory opinion, and preparing the panel's recommendation for Assembly action.
- 5. The naming panel's recommendation will come back to the Assembly for public hearing and final action in accordance with AMC Chapter 3.97.
