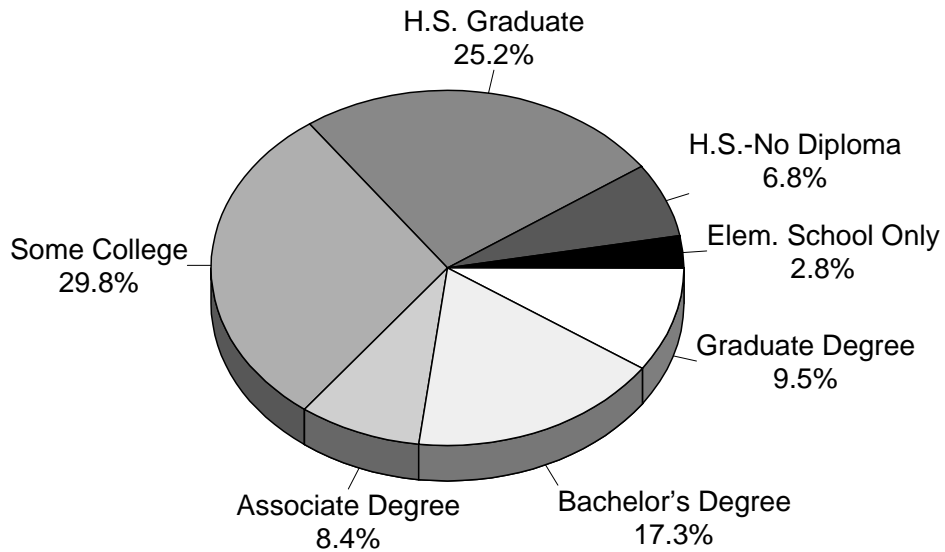

### Anchorage Population Age 25 & Older - 1990

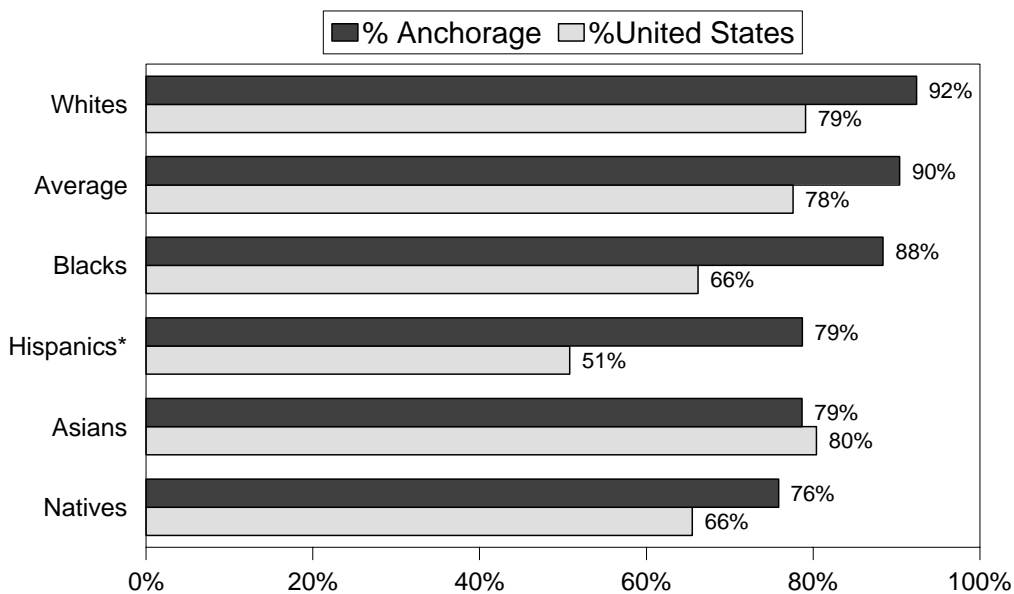

### Anchorage & U.S. Persons 25 Years & Older - 1990

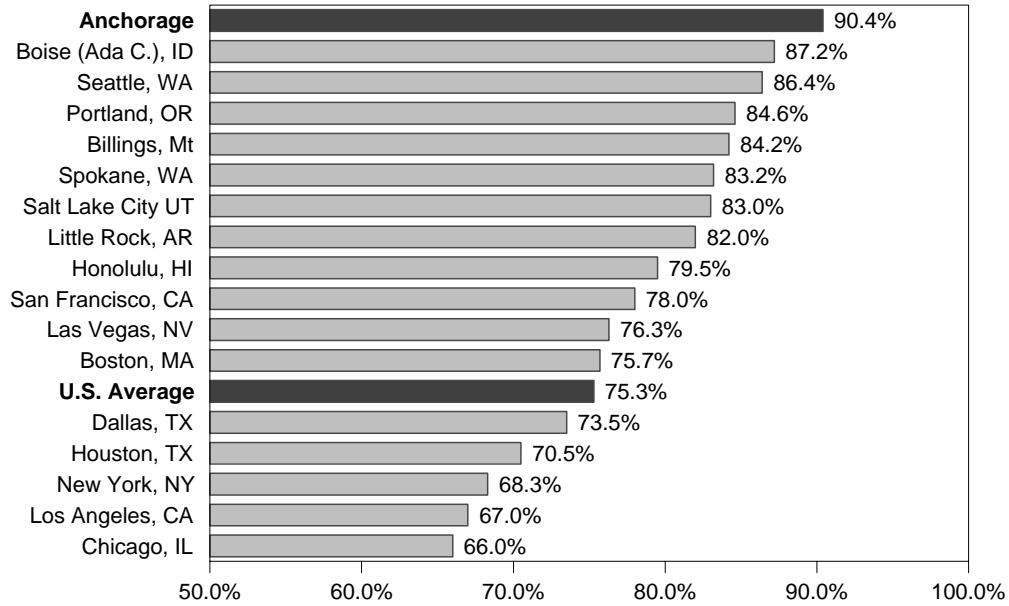

### Anchorage & U.S. Cities - 1990

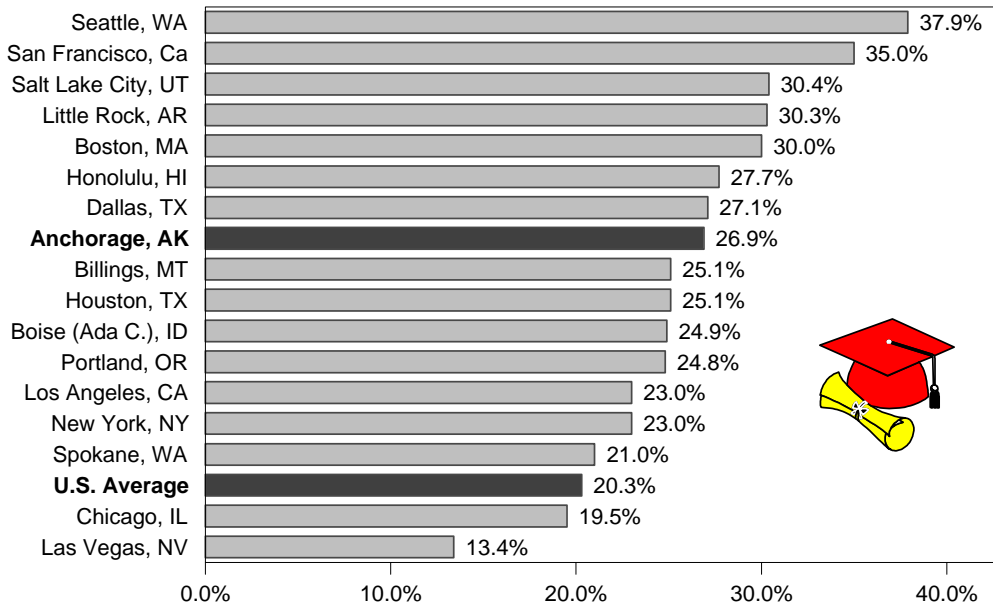

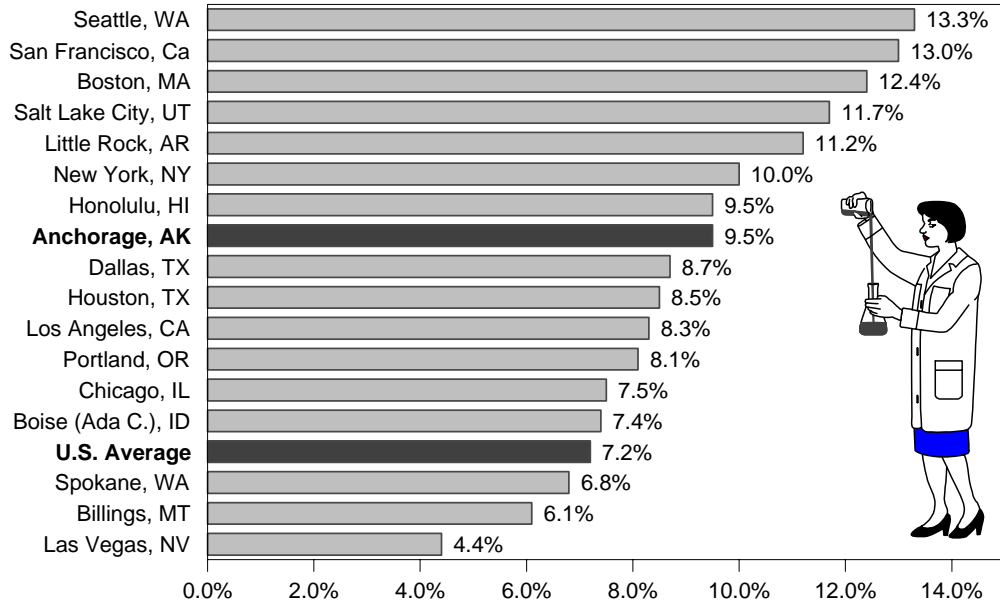

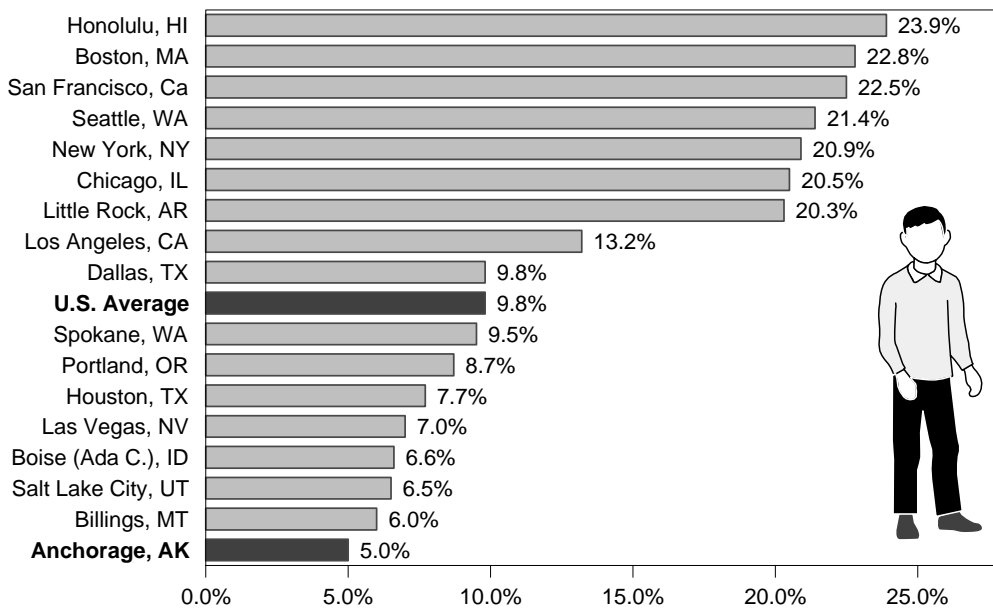

# % Students in Private Schools

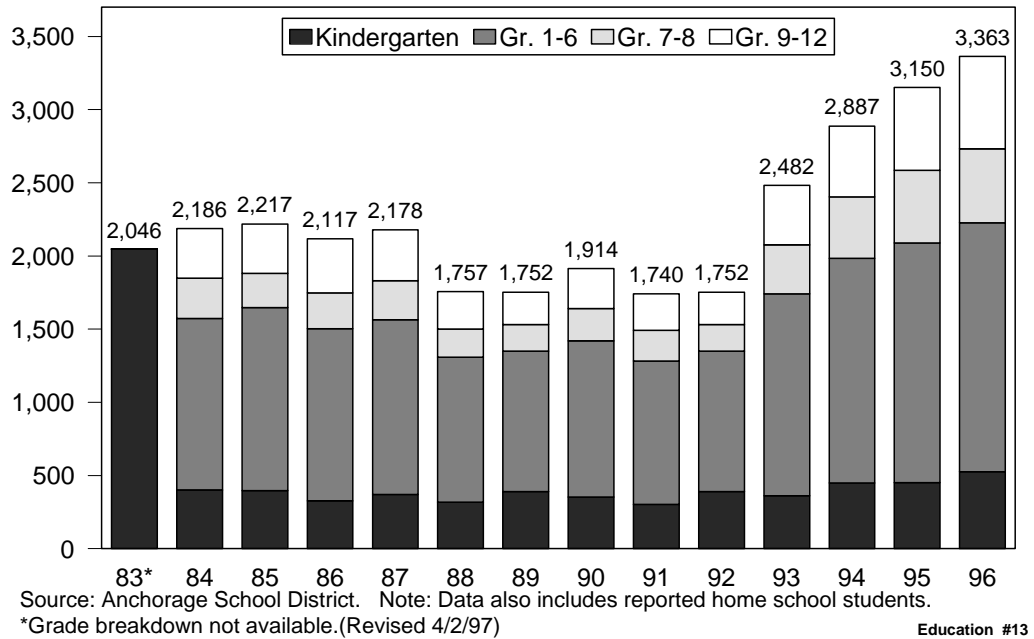

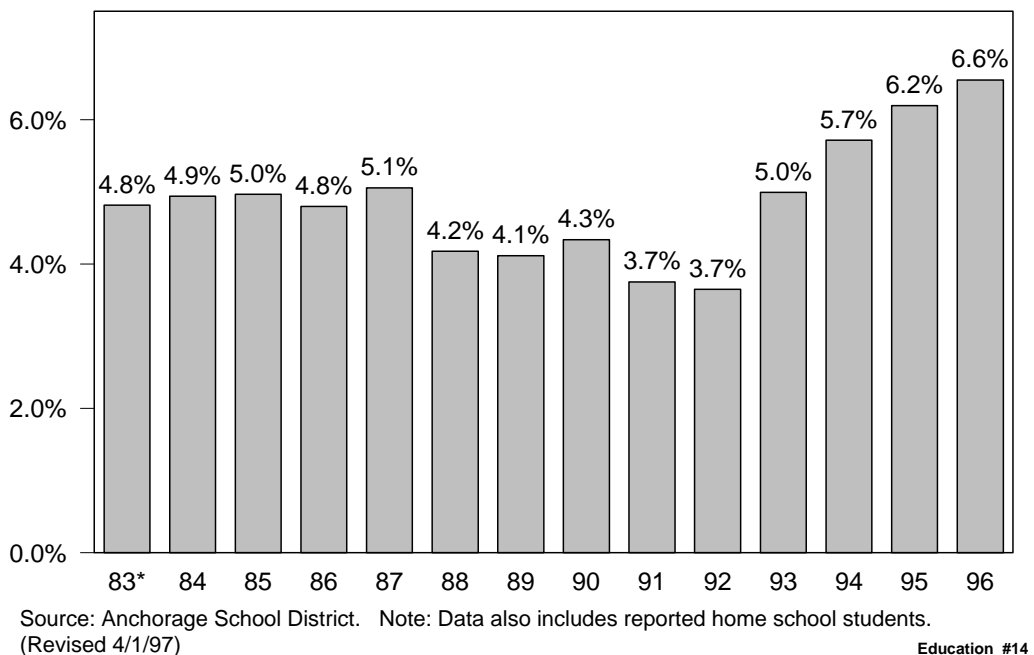

## Private School Enrollment Anchorage - 1983-84 to 1996-97

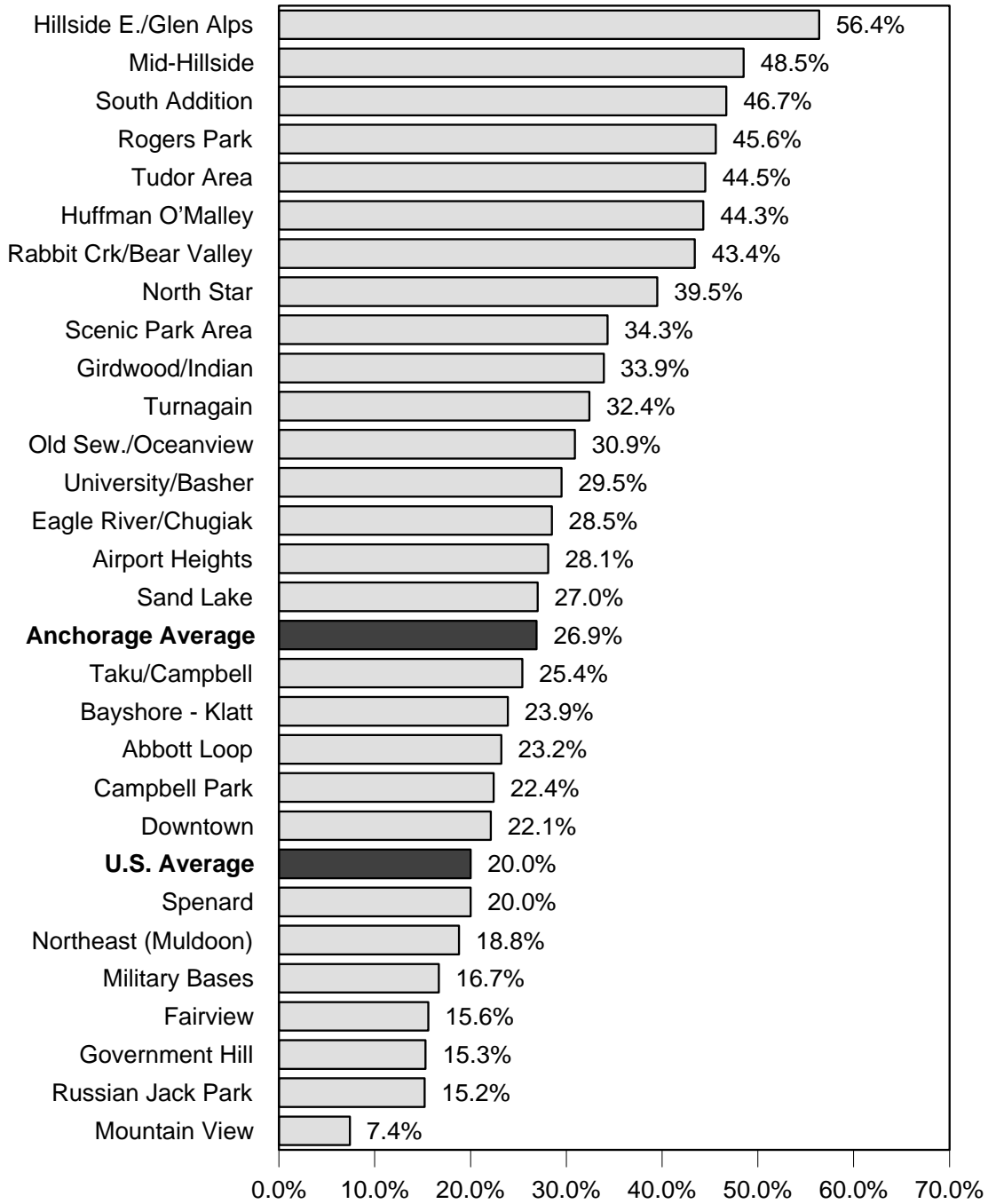


## Private School Enrollment Anchorage - 1983-84 to 1996-97



# % College Graduates

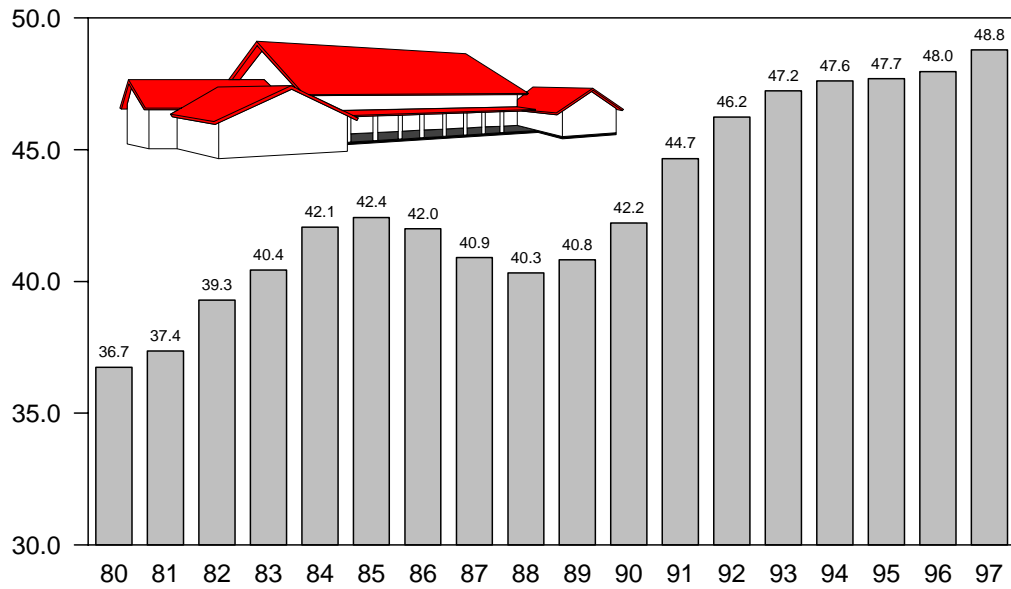

Anchorage - September 30, 1980 to 1997

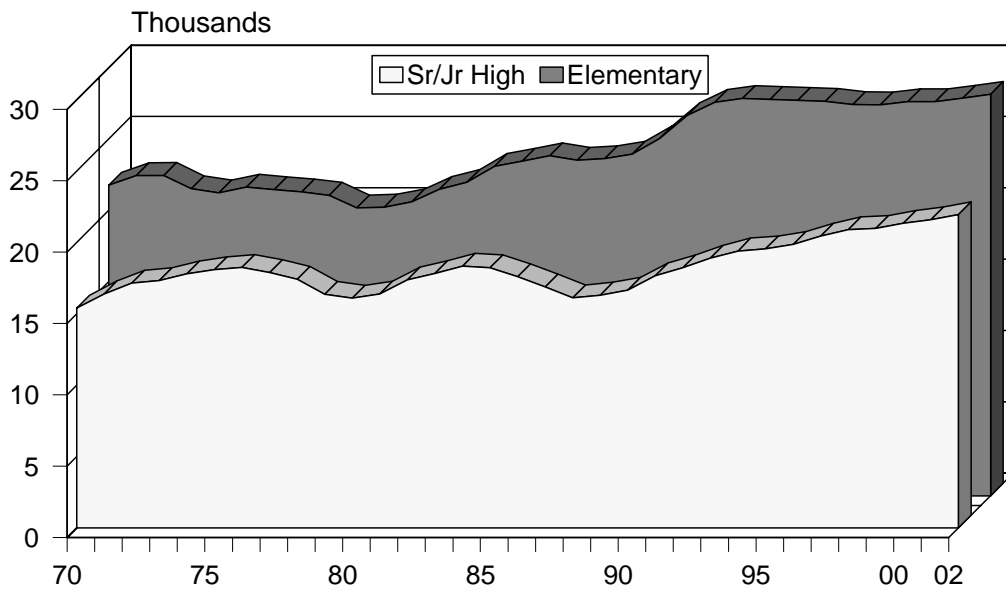

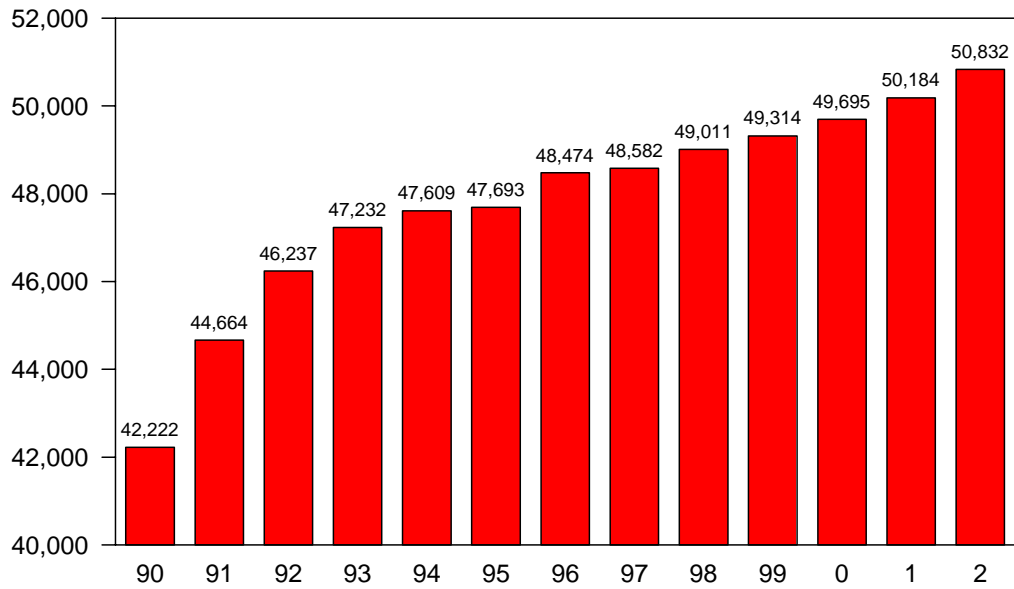

Anchorage - September 30, 1990 to 2002

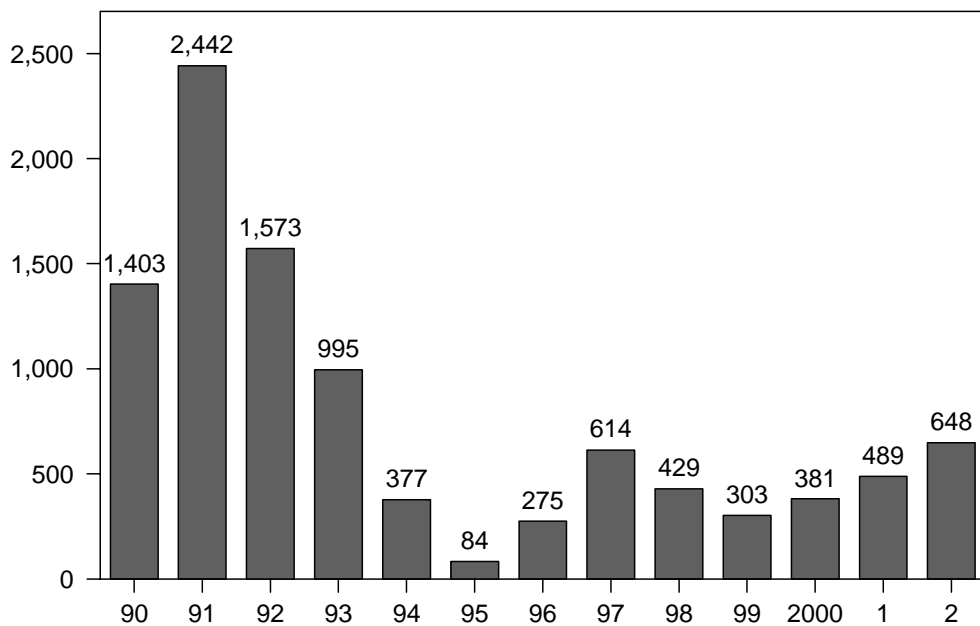

Anchorage School District - 1990-96 & Projections to 2002

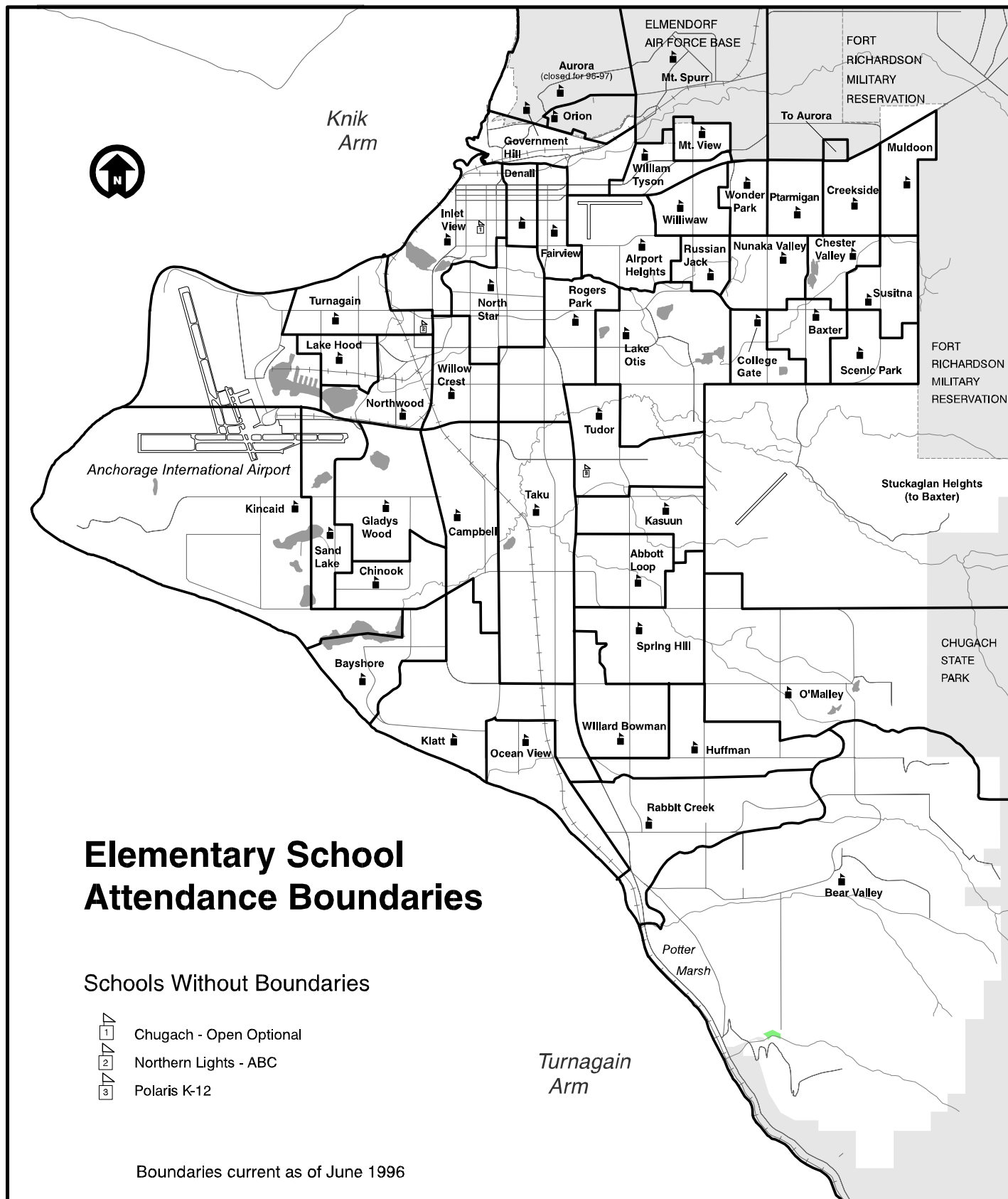

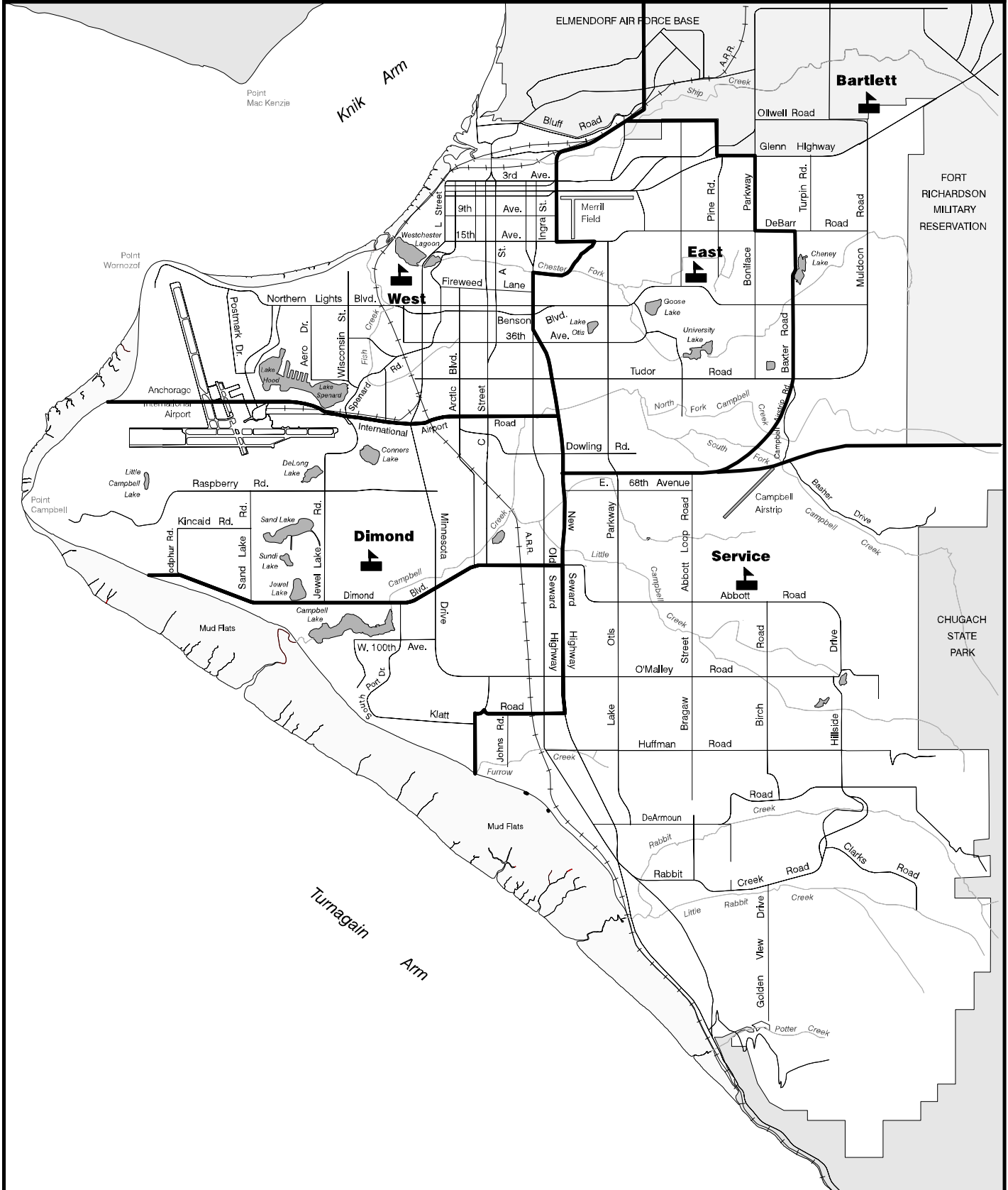

# School Attendance Boundaries - Senior High



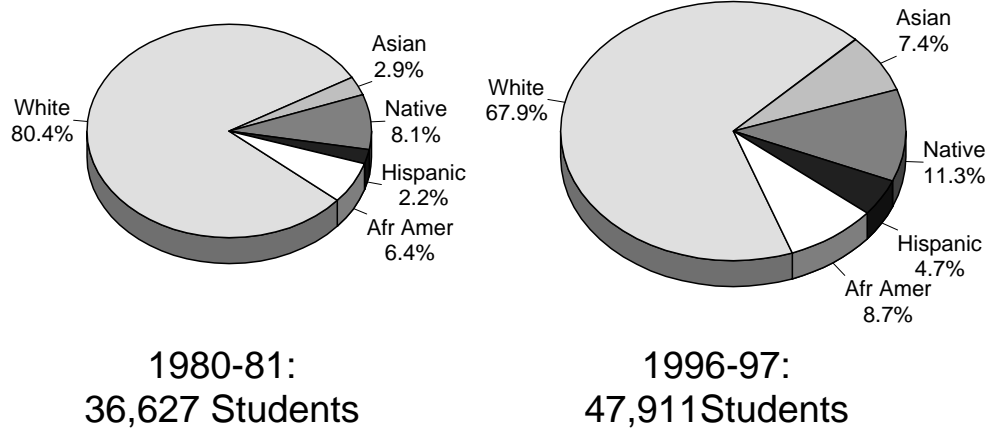

## Anchorage School District - 1980-81 & 1996-97

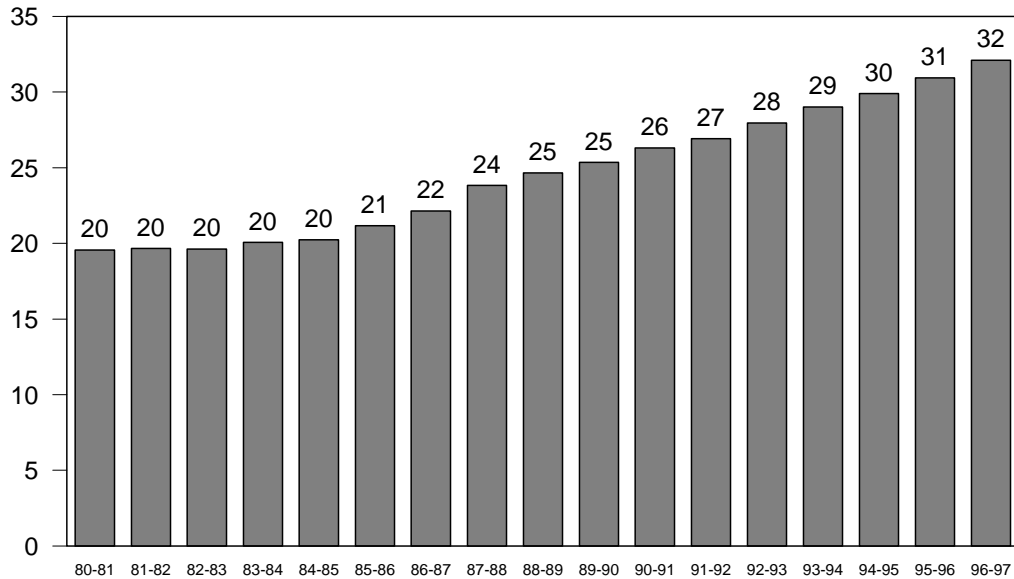

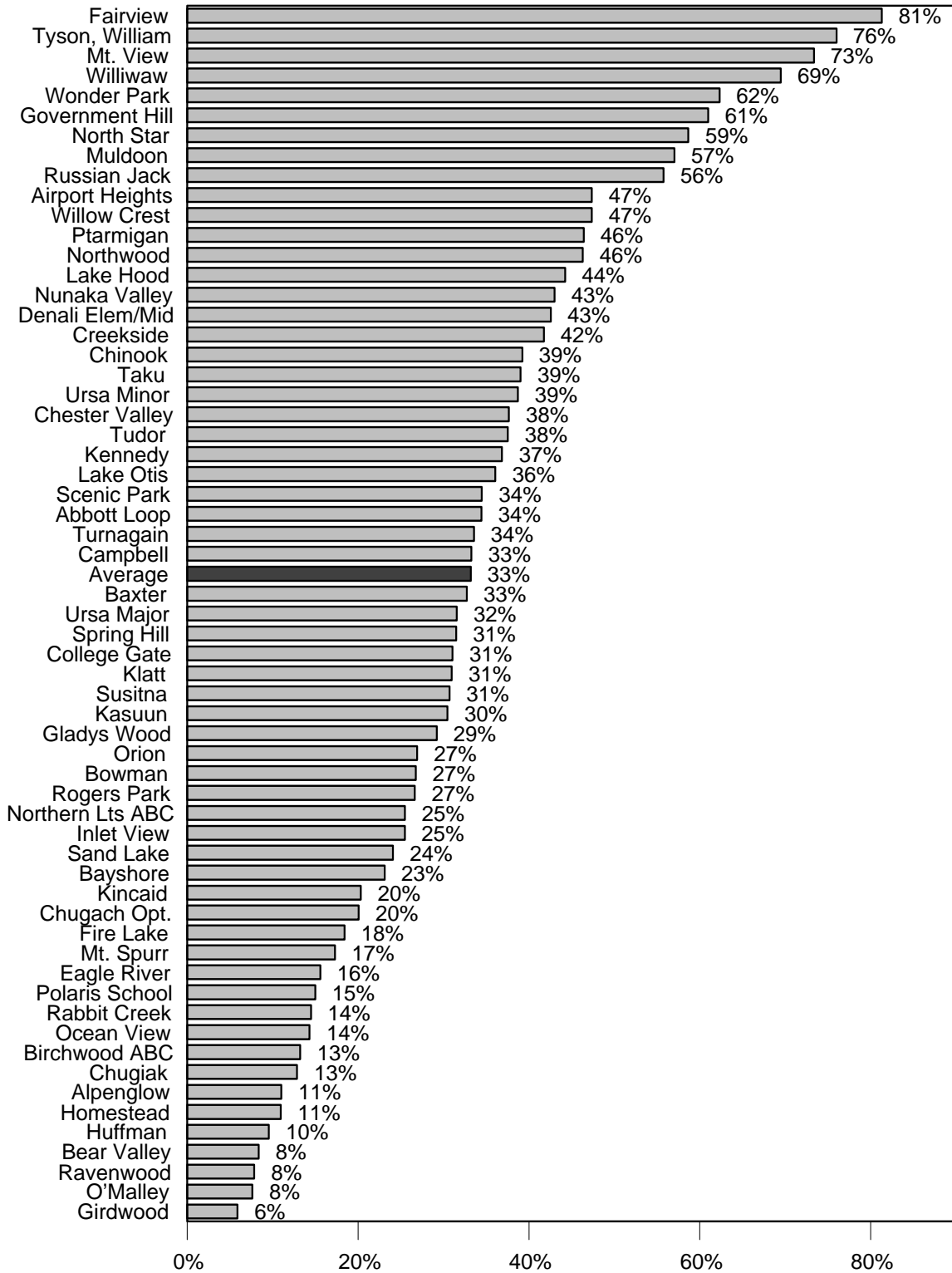

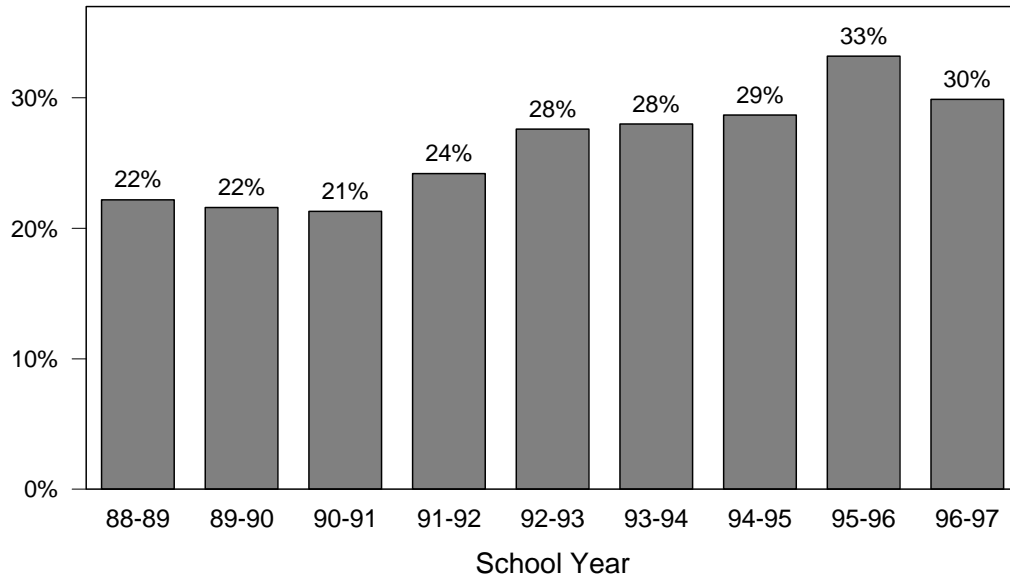

### Anchorage Elementary Schools 1988-89 to 1996-97

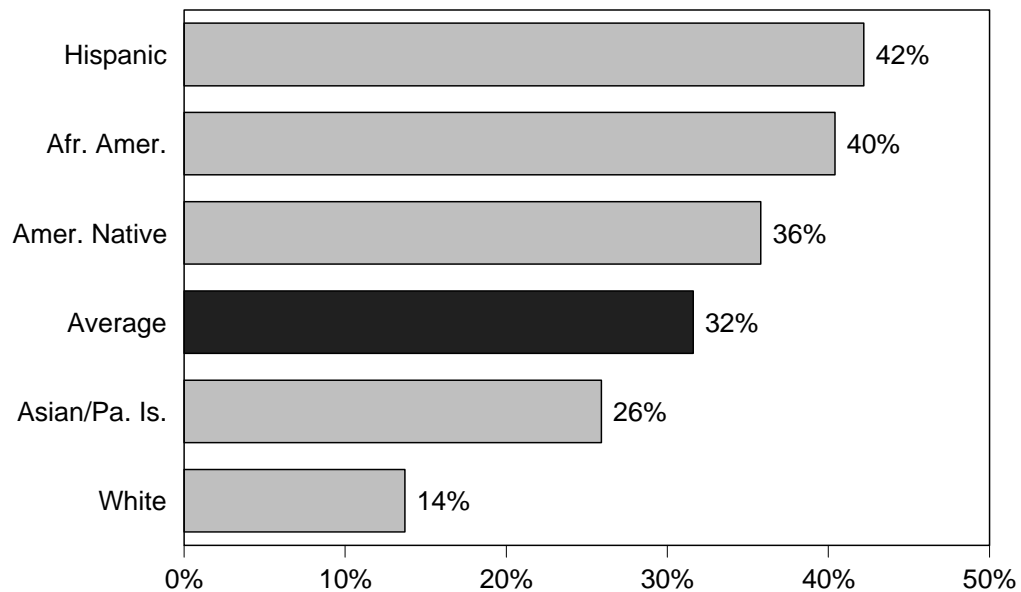

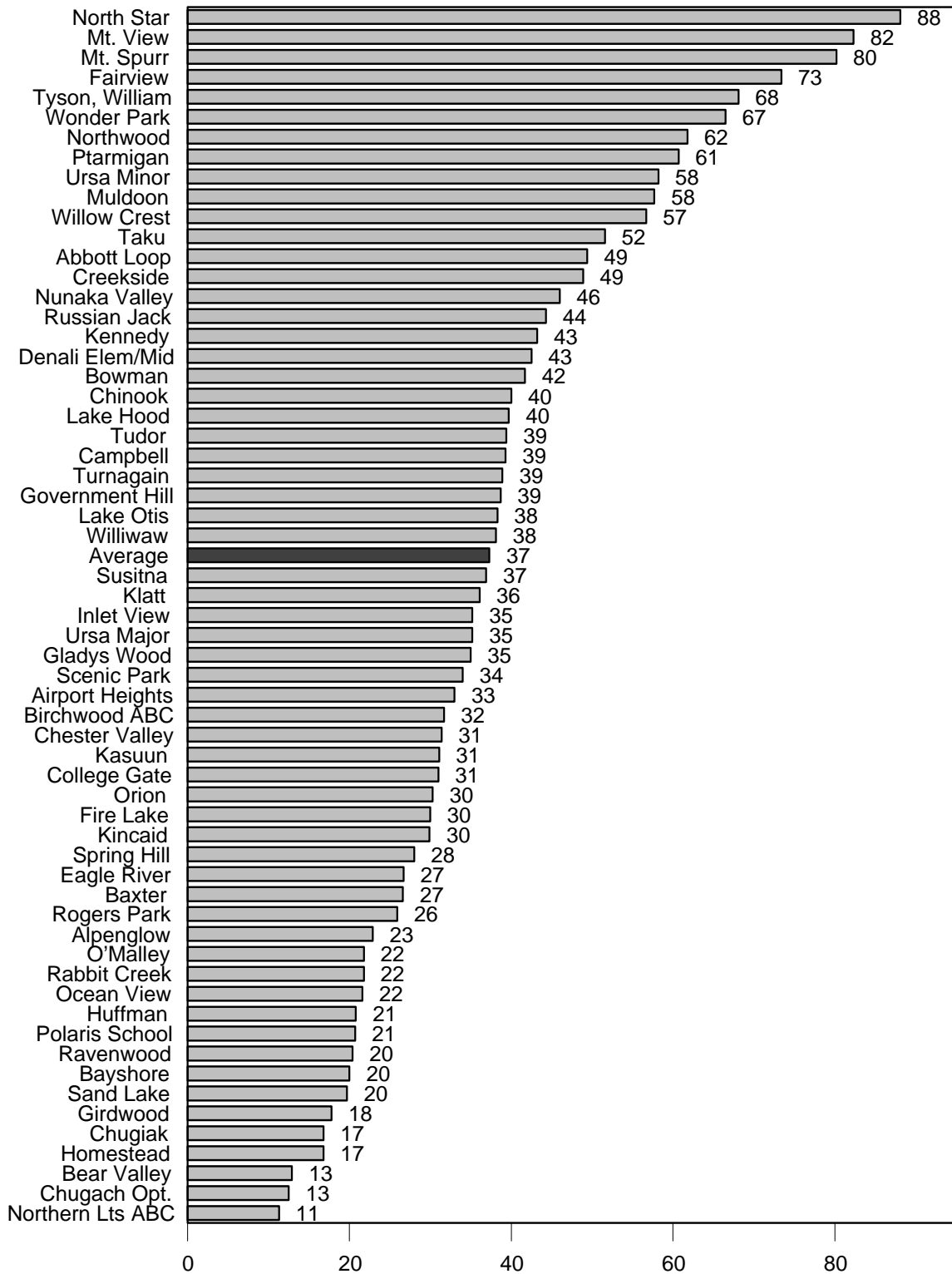

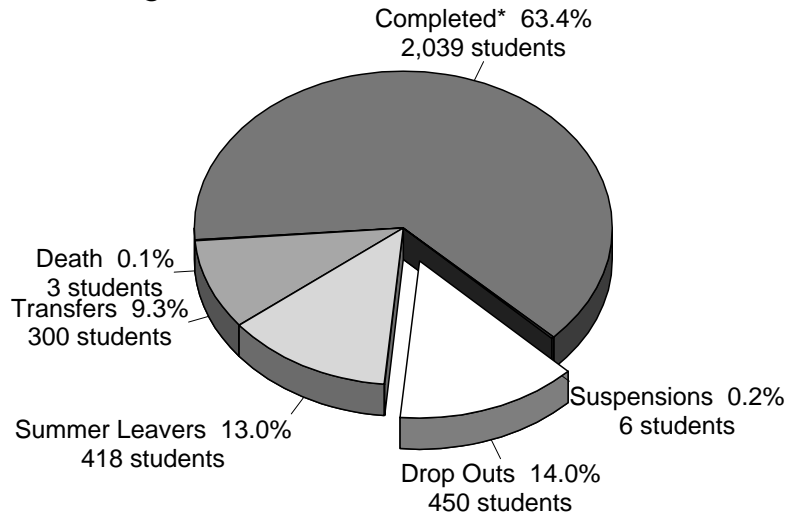
## Anchorage Elementary Schools 1996-97

Anchorage 9th Graders from 1993-94 to 1996-97

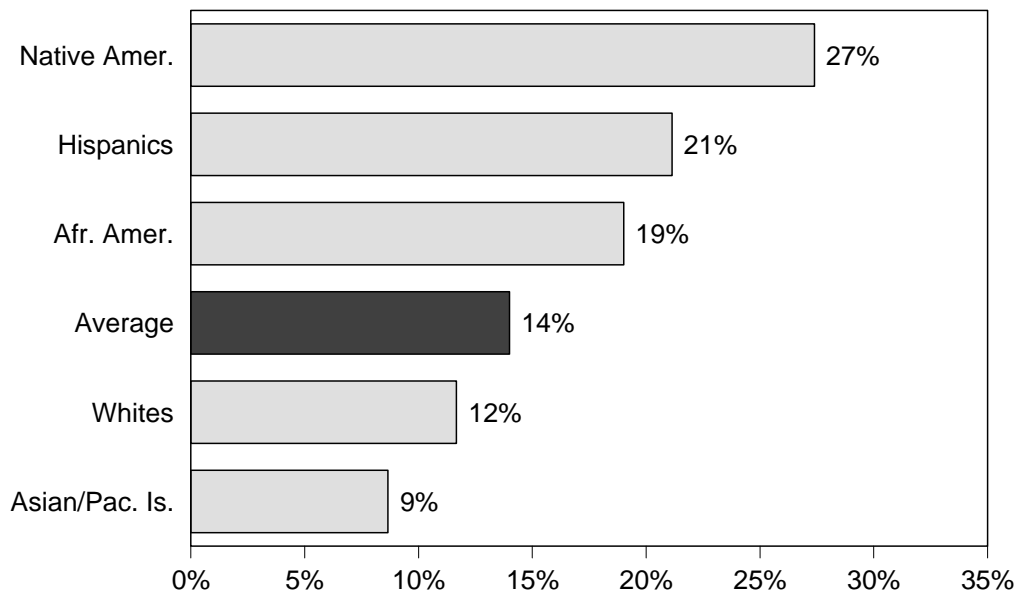


## Transfer Pattern for 3,216 9th Graders Between 1993-94 and 1996-97

# High School Drop Outs by Ethnic Group

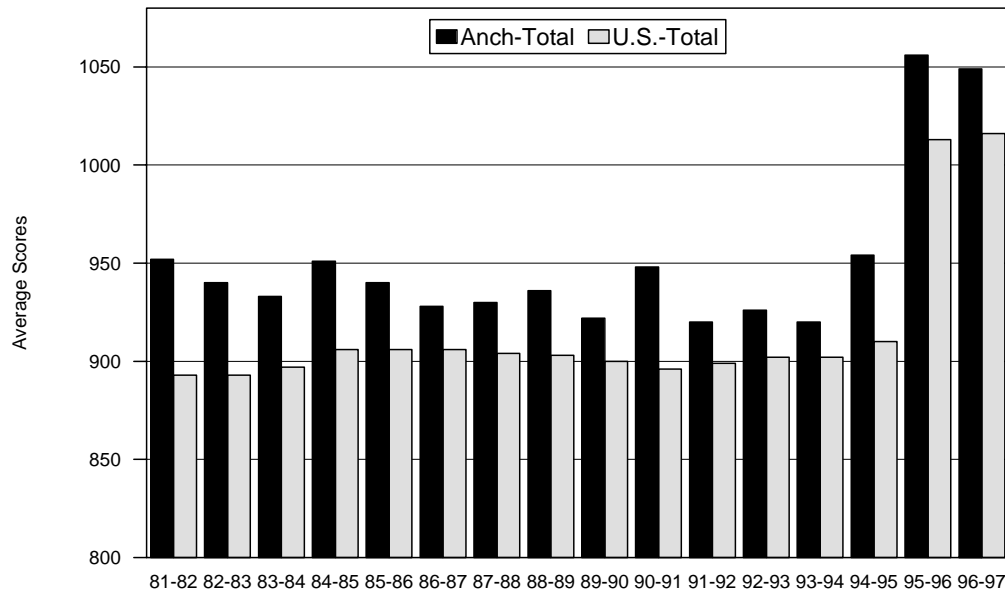
Anchorage 9th Graders from 1993-94 to 1996-97

# Student SAT\* Scores

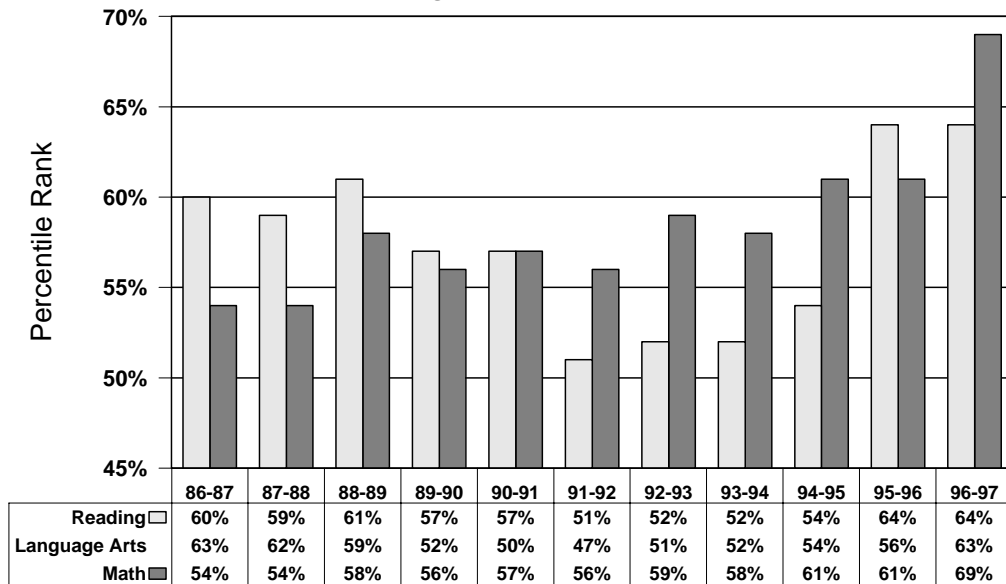
Anchorage & U.S. 1981-82 to 1996-97

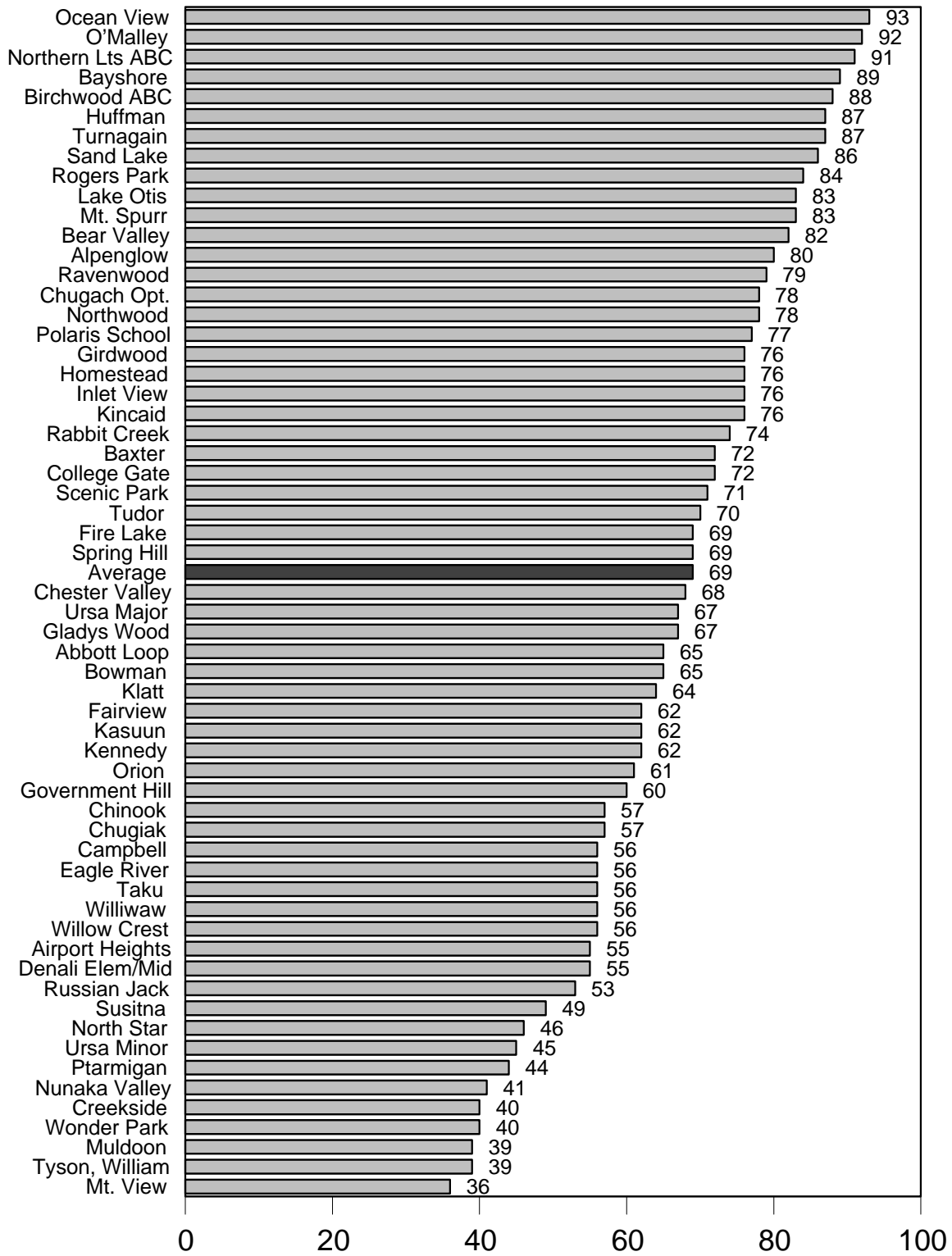

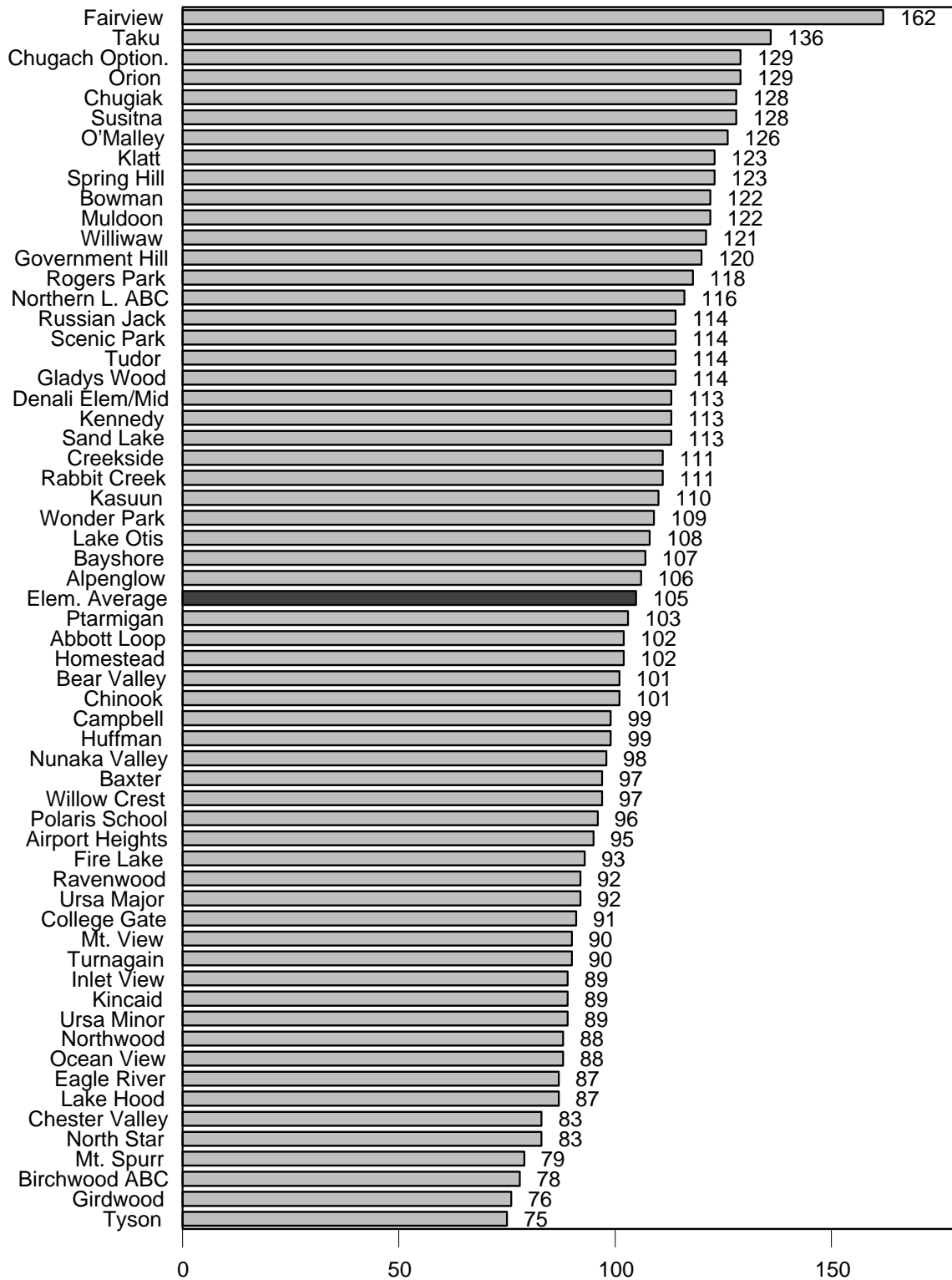

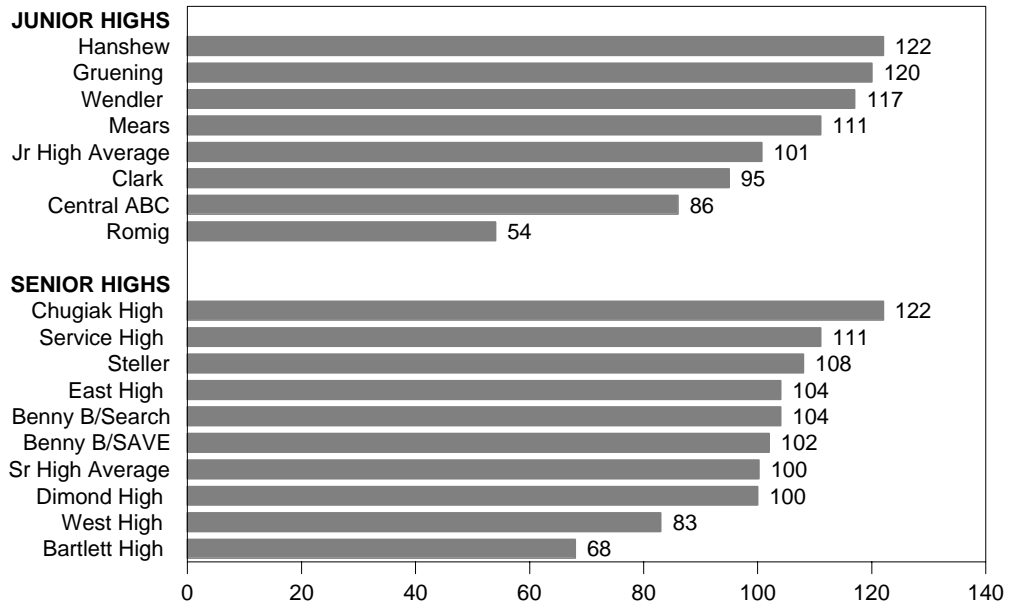

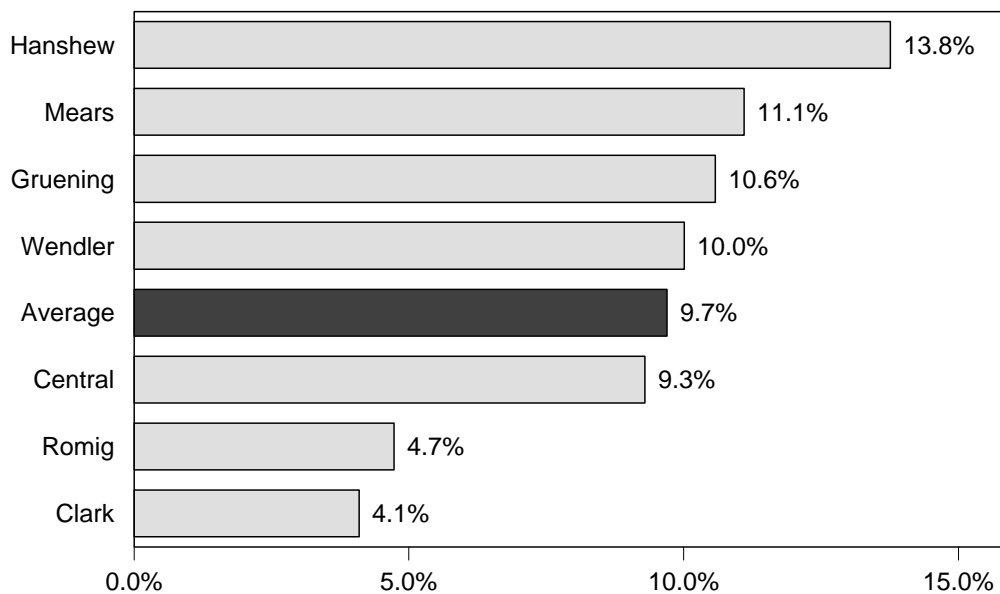
## % of Capacity Anchorage Secondary Schools - May 1997

## Percent Gifted Students Anchorage Jr. High/Middle Schools 1996-97

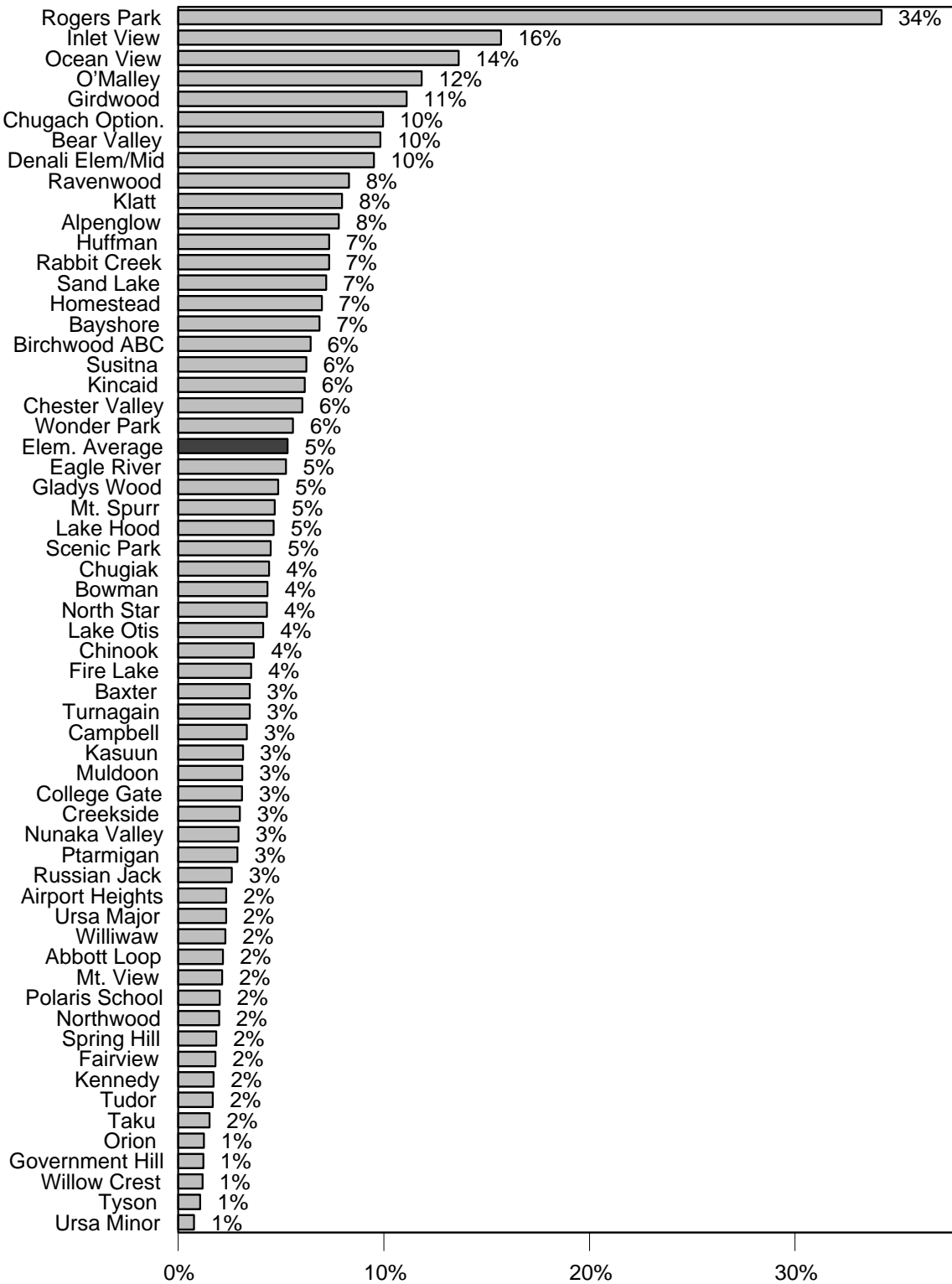

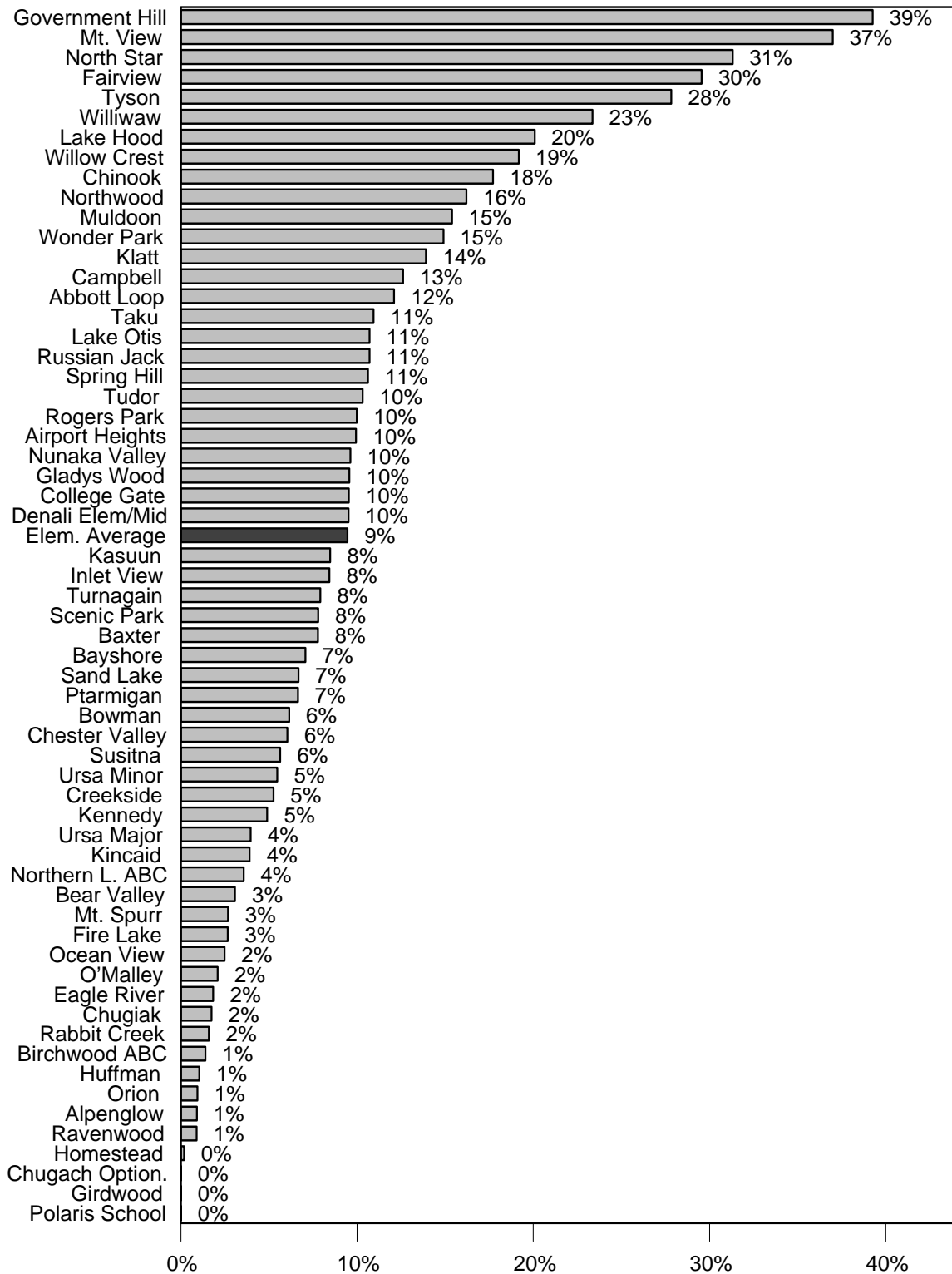

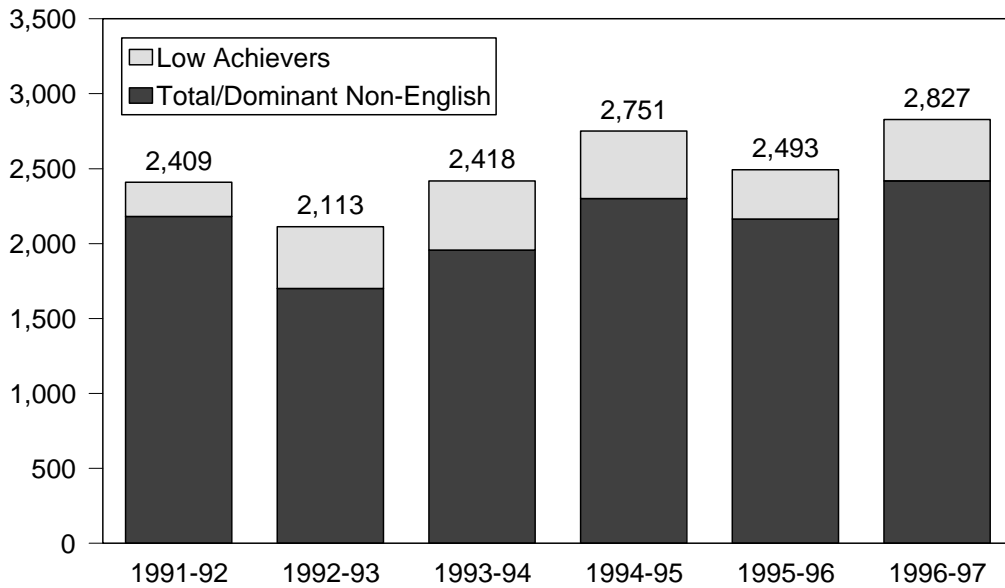

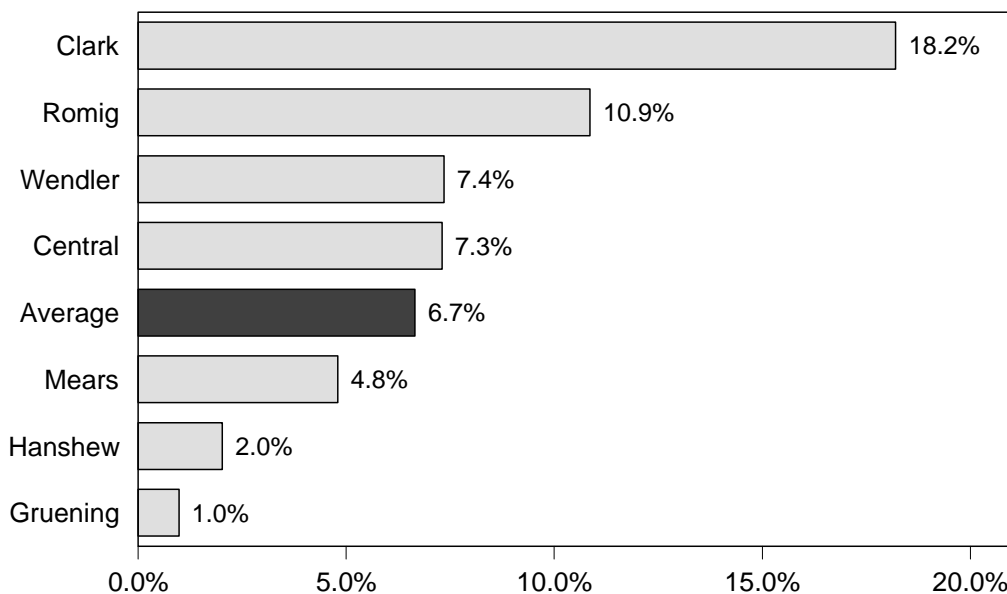
Anchorage School District 1991-92 to 1996-97

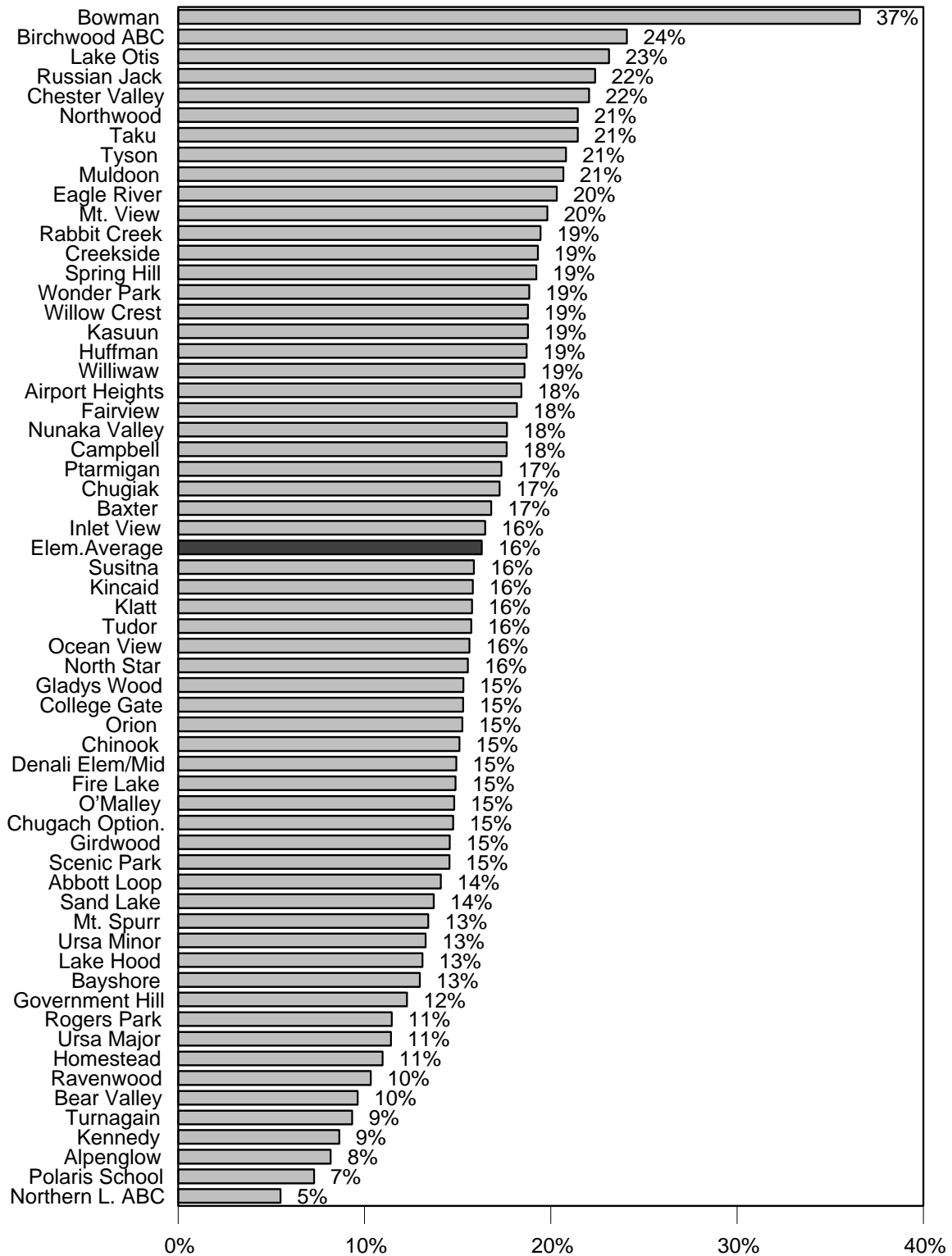
Anchorage Jr. High/Middle Schools 1996-97

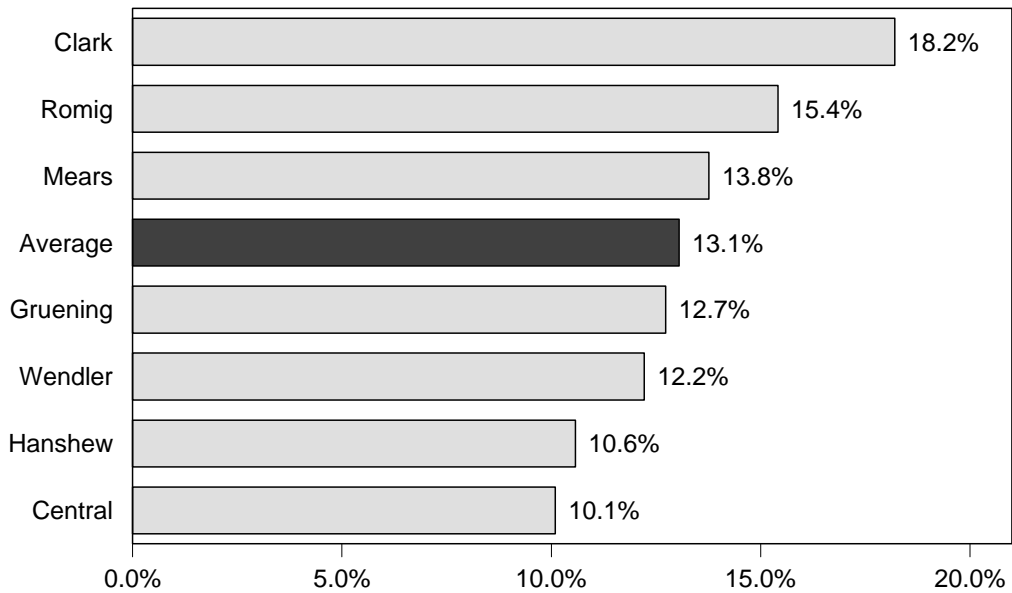

## Anchorage Elementary Schools 1996-97



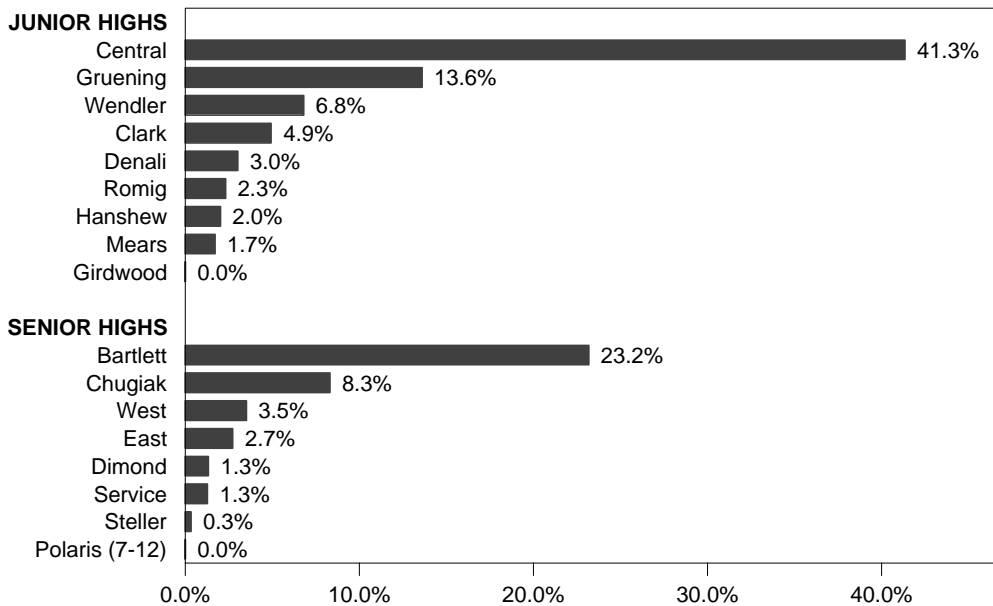

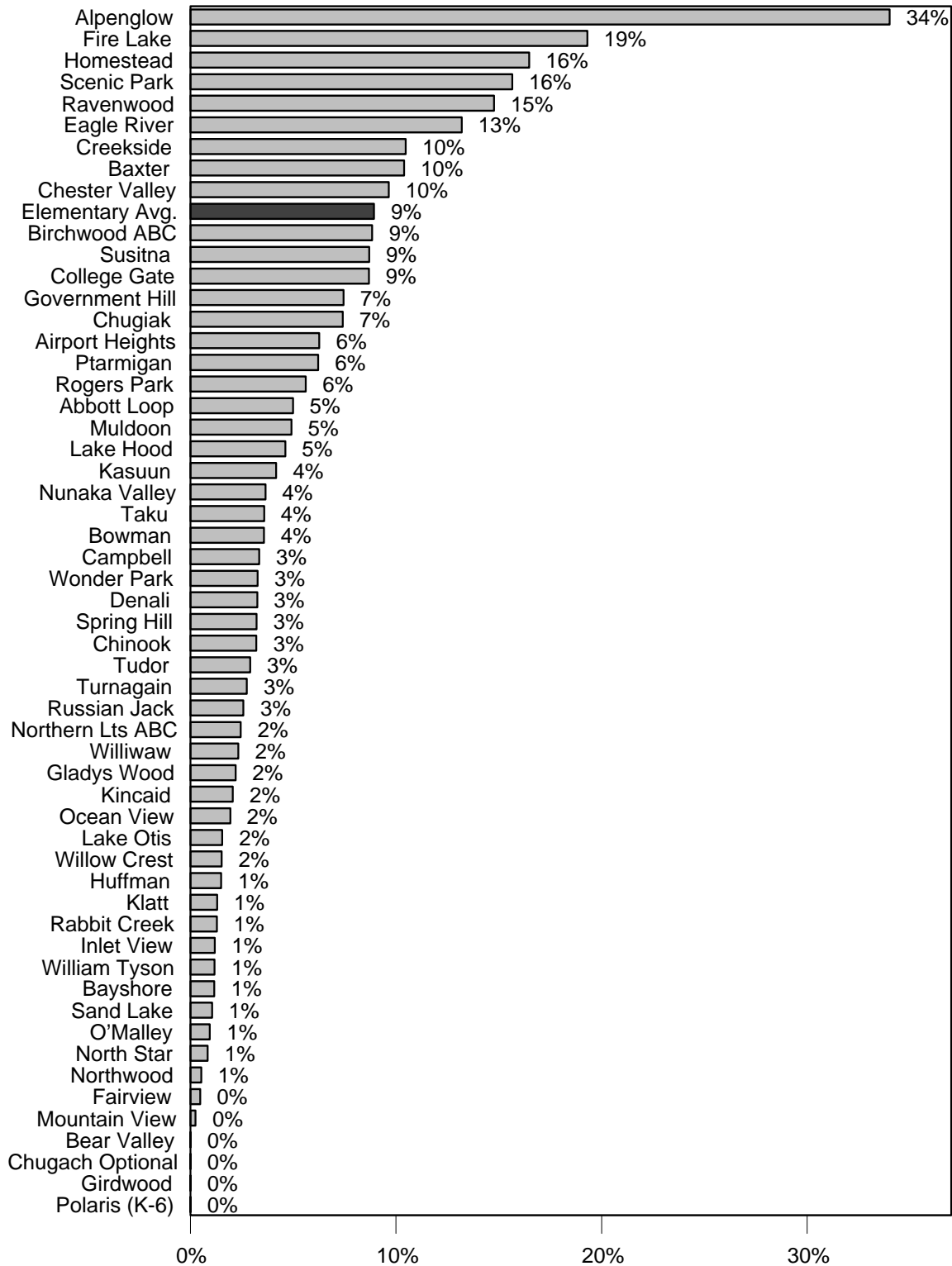

# % Military Students in Off-Base Schools

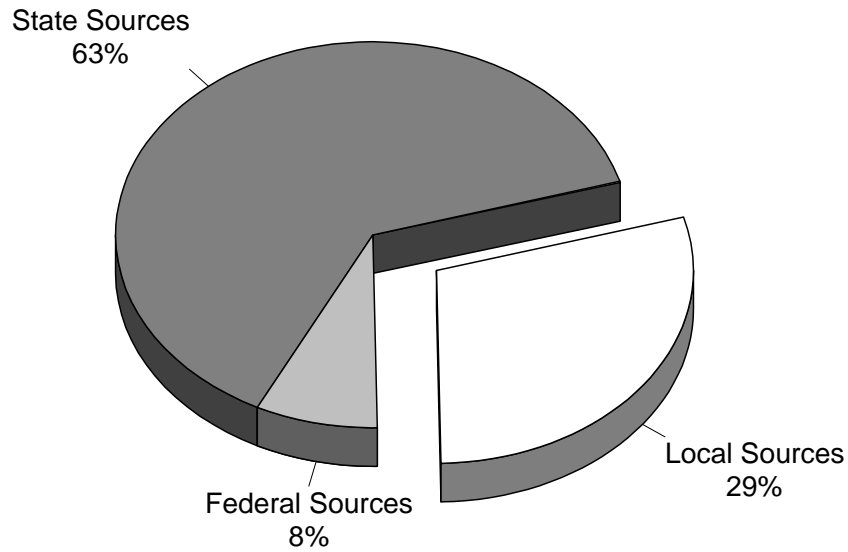

Fiscal Year 1996-97



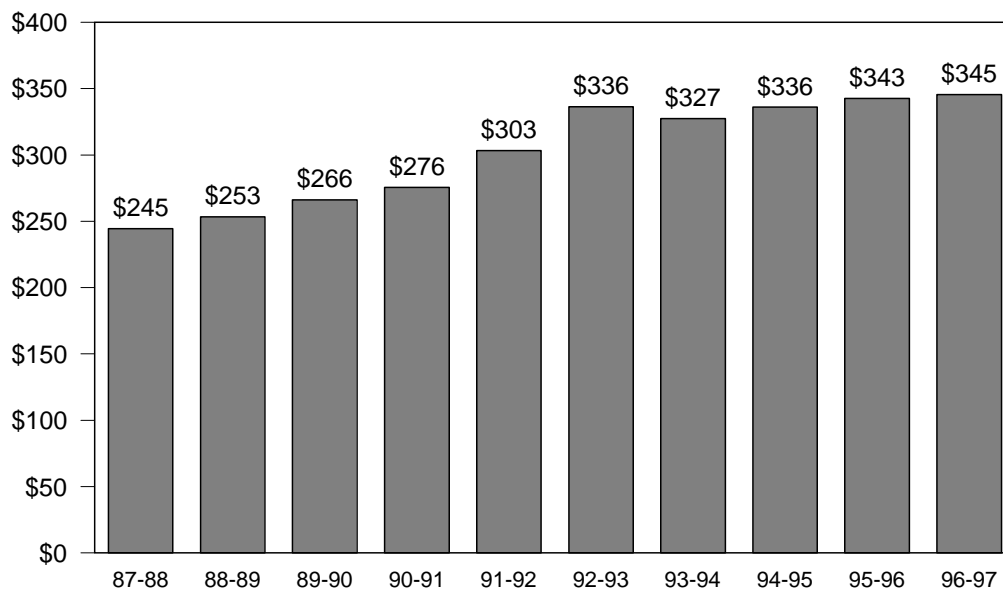

Anchorage - Fiscal Years 1987-88 to 1996-97

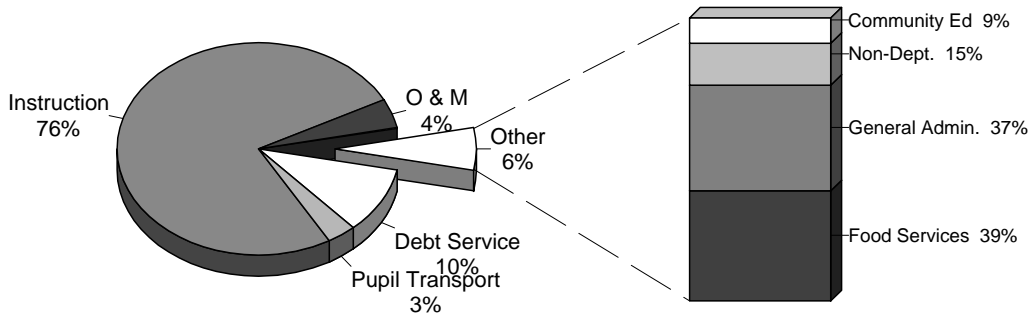

## Fiscal Year 1996-97



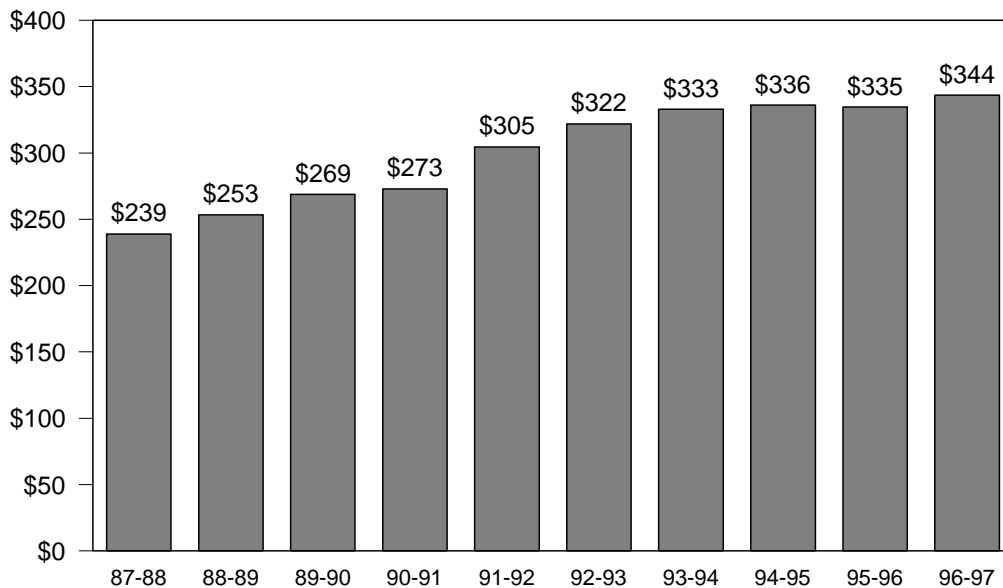

## School District Budget (\$Millions)

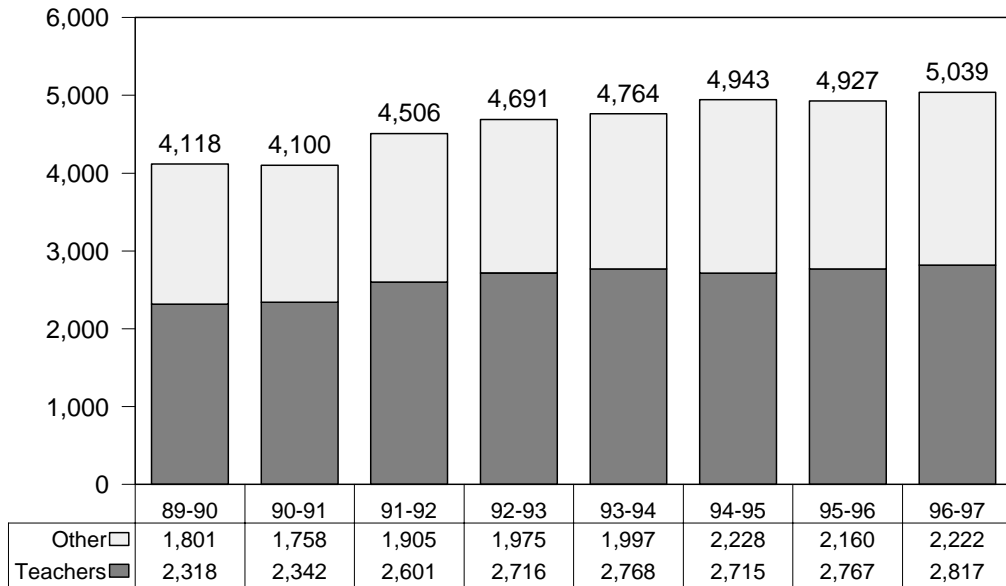
### Anchorage - Fiscal Years 1987-88 to 1996-97

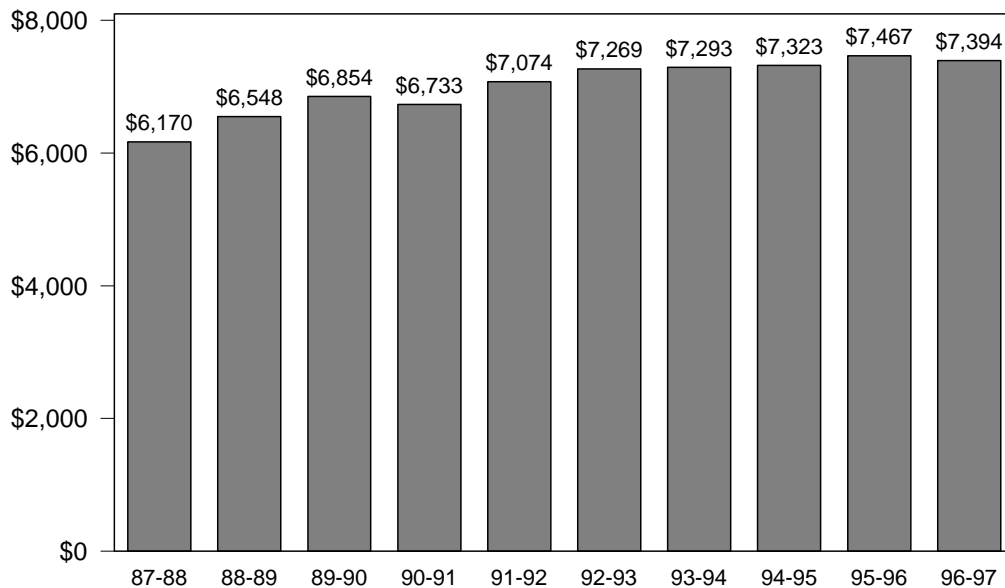
## Anchorage School District Employees Fiscal Years 1987-88 to 1996-97

## Expenditures Per Student Anchorage - Fiscal Years 1987-88 to 1996-97

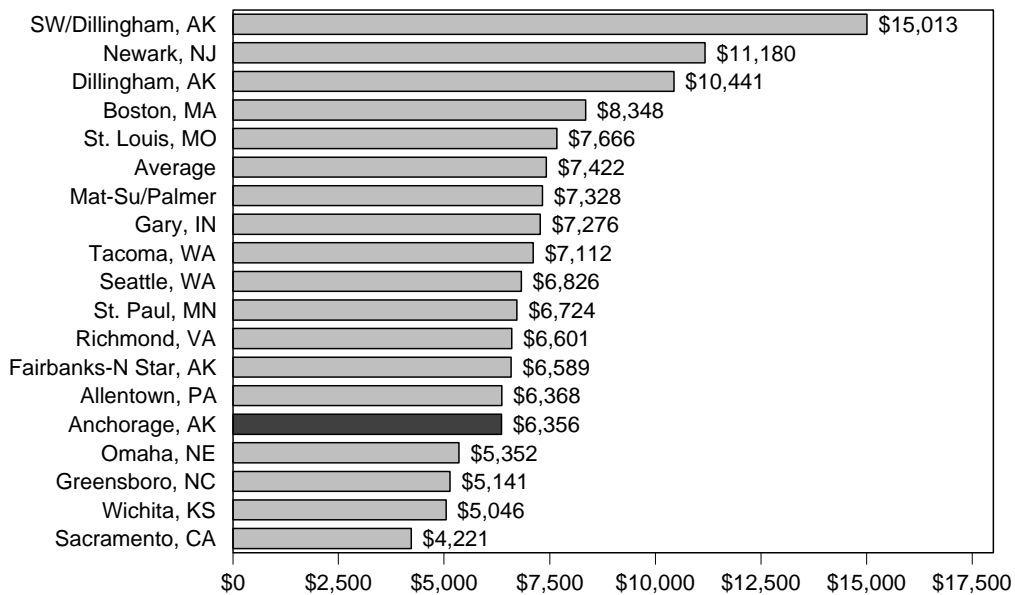

### Anchorage & Other Districts - 1995-96

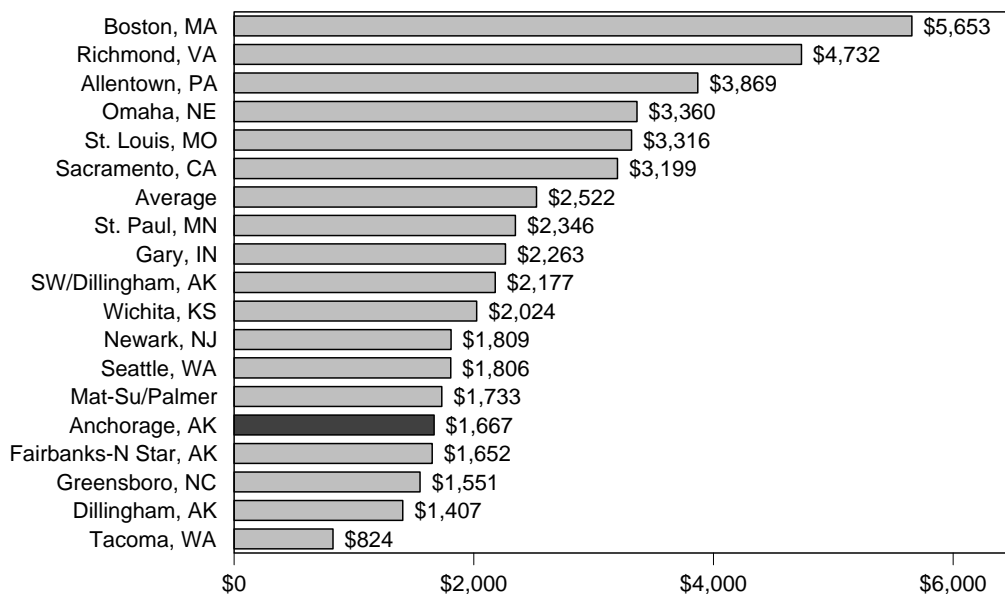

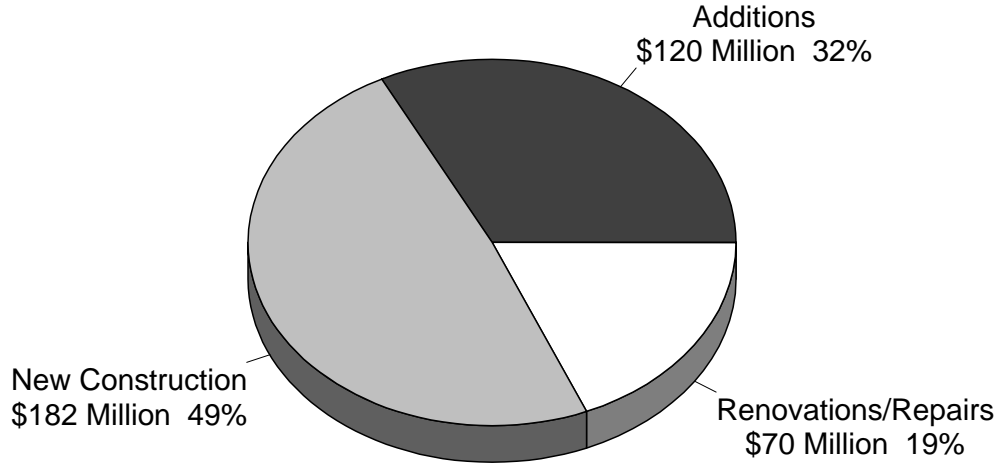

Anchorage - 1991-Future



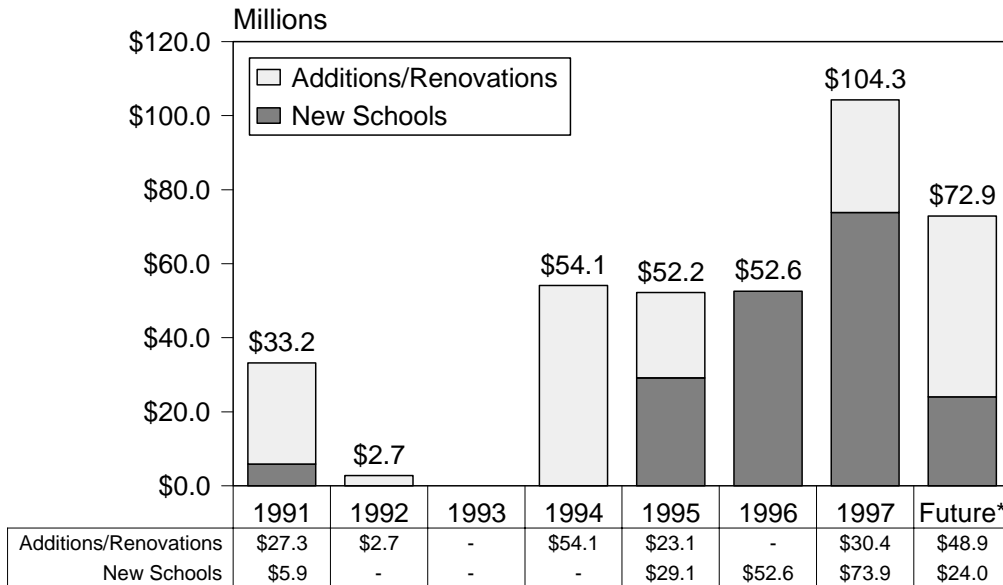

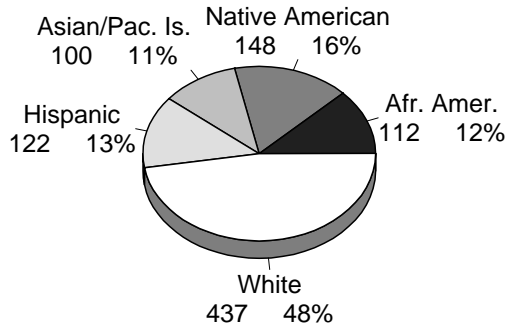

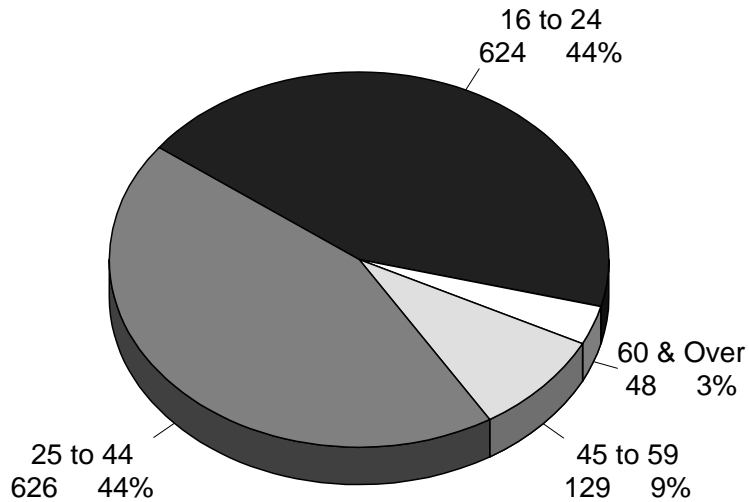

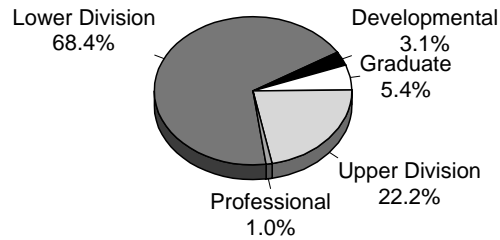

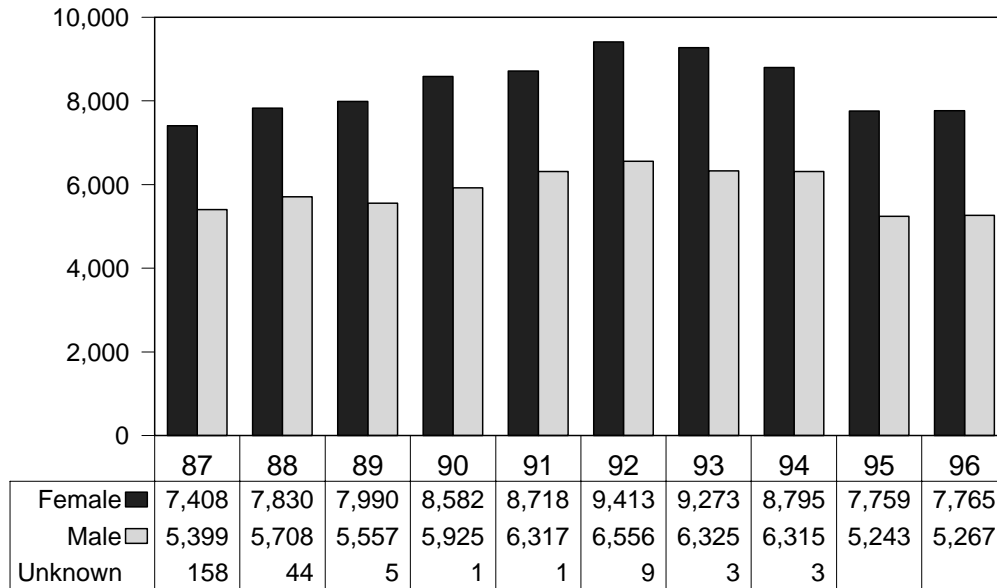

### Anchorage Campus - Fall Term - 1987-1996

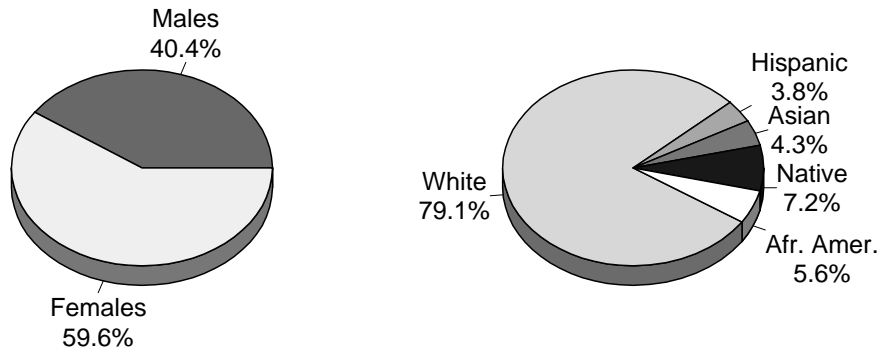

Anchorage Campus - Fall Term - 1996



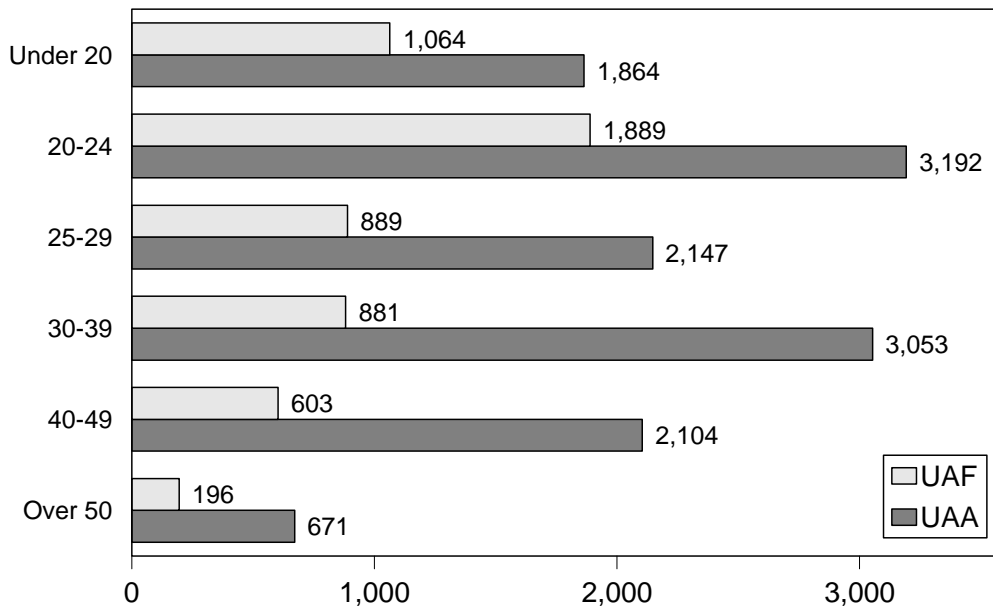

# U of A Student Headcount by Age

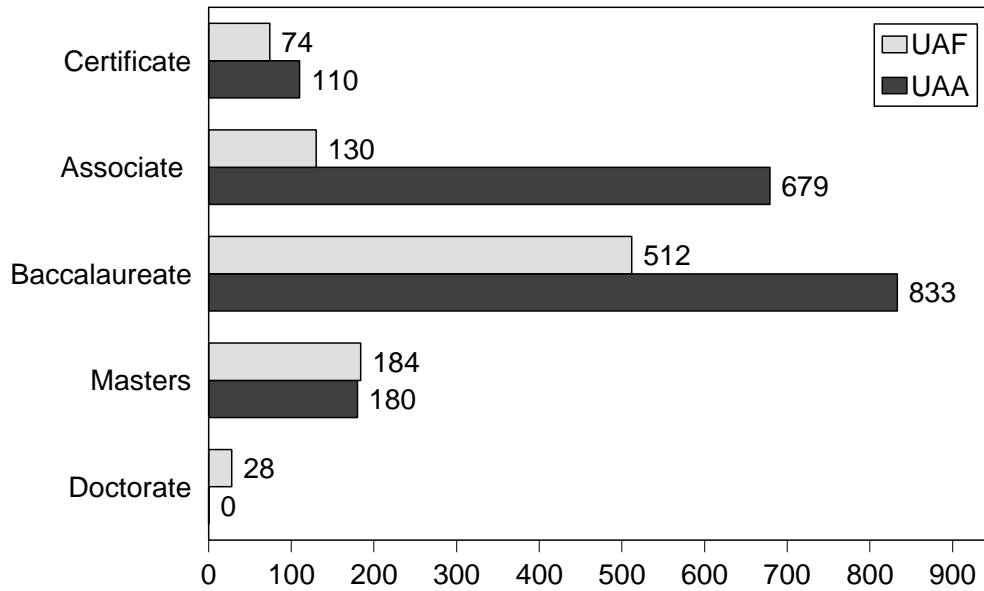

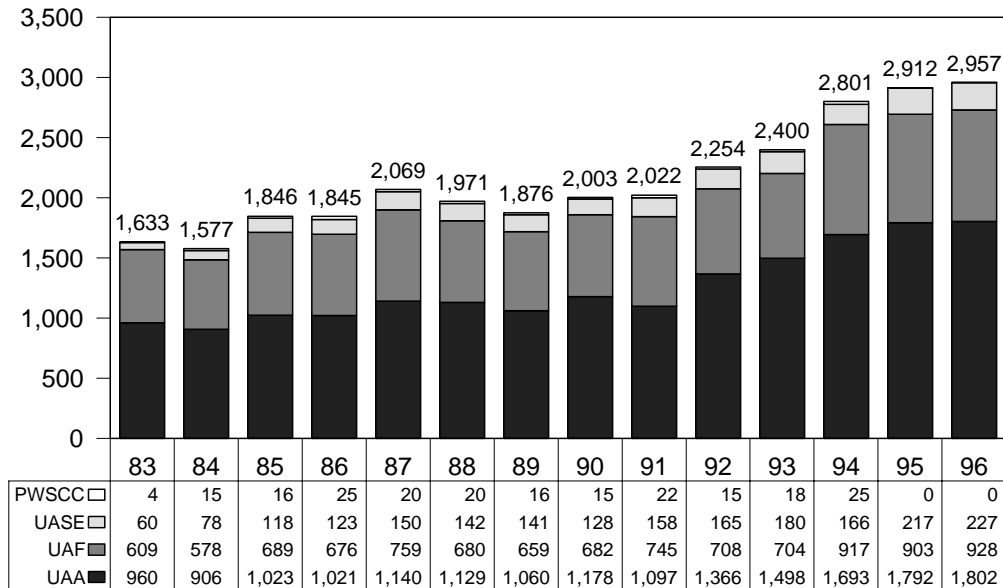

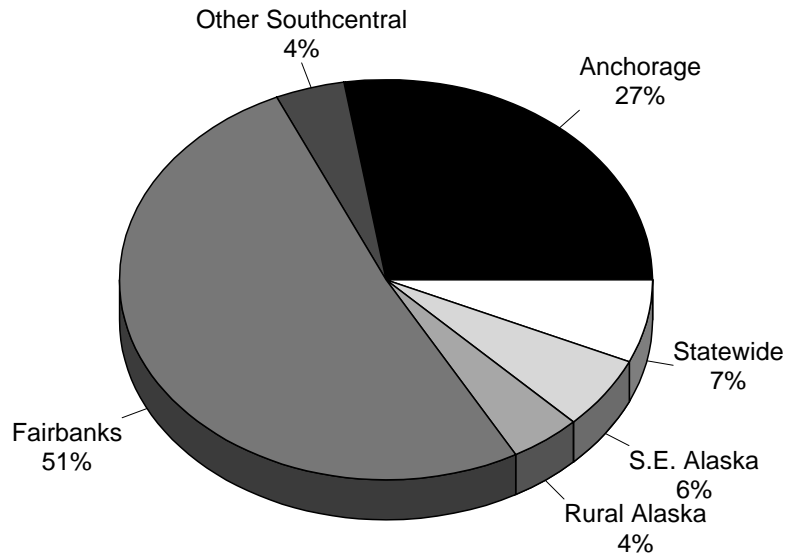
## University of Alaska Degrees Awarded By Area - Fiscal Year 1983-1996

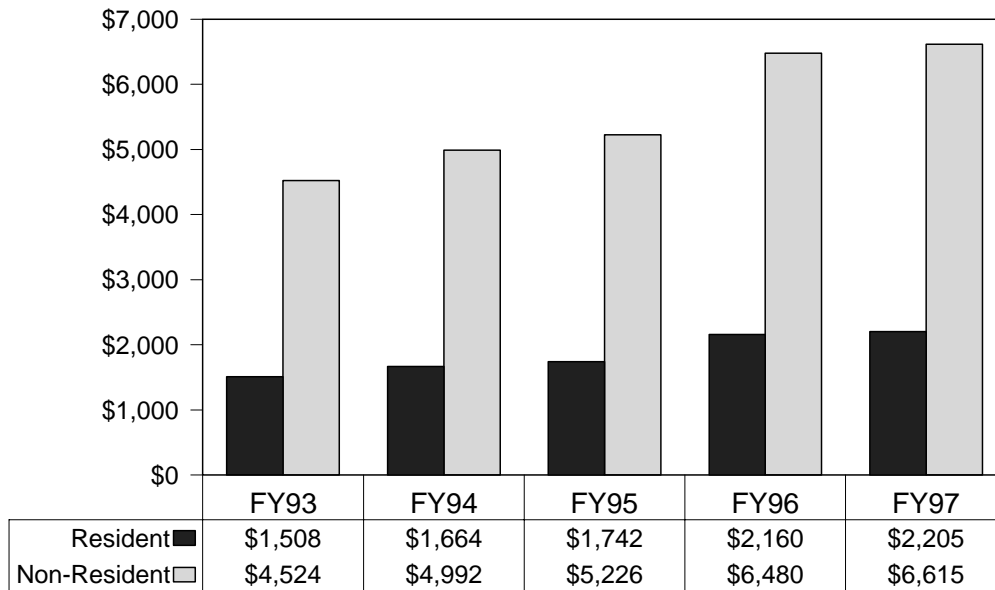
## University Budget by Campus University of Alaska - FY 1997

## Annual Full-Time Undergraduate Tuition University of Alaska - FY 1993-97

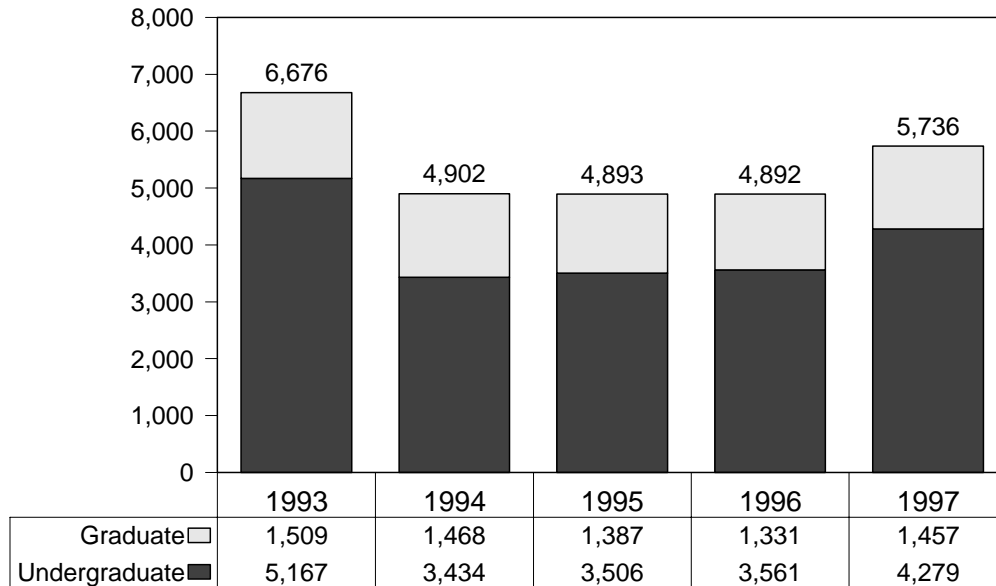

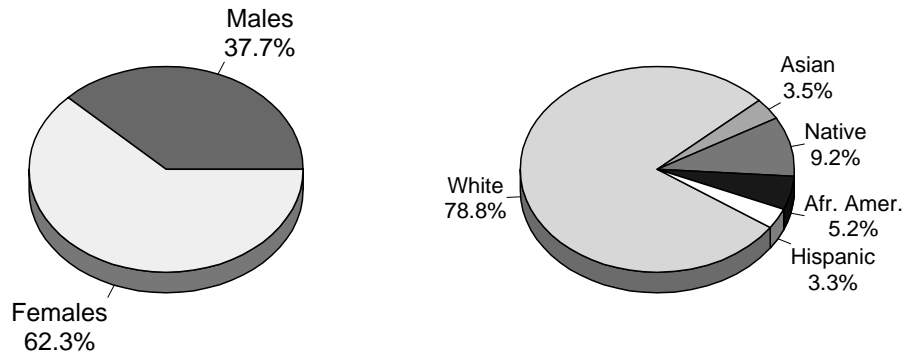

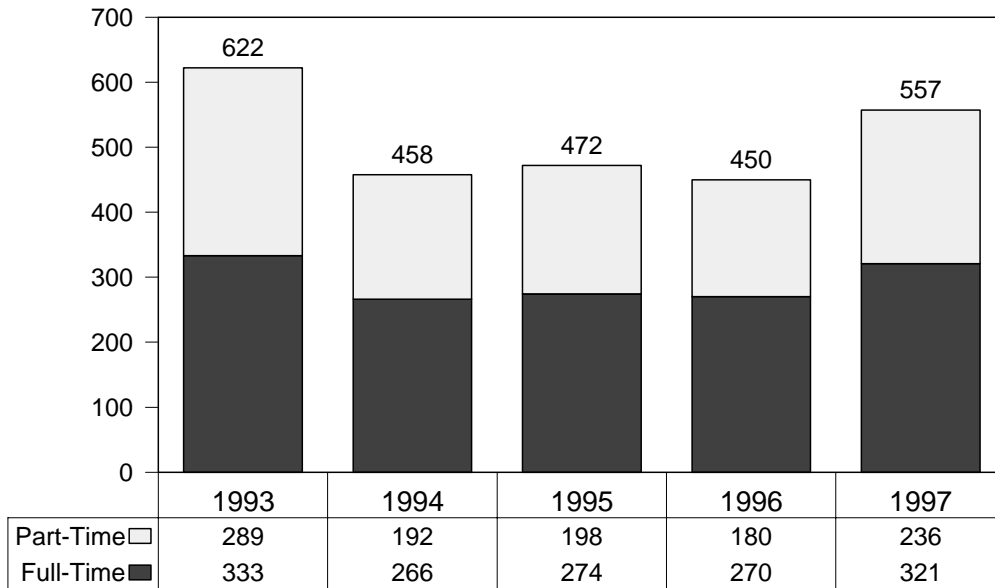

## Student Headcount - Full & Part-time

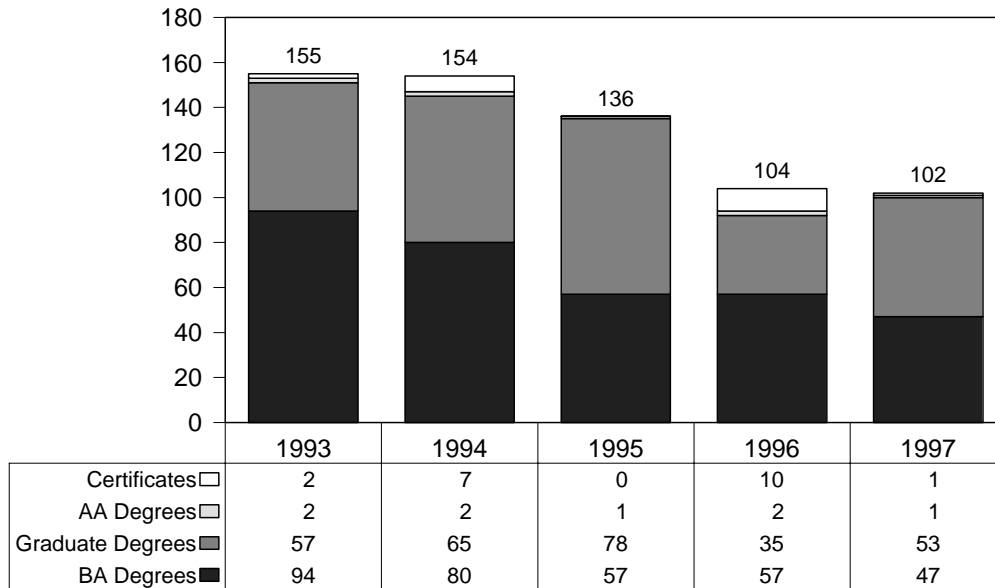

# Alaska Pacific University Degrees Awarded 1993-1996

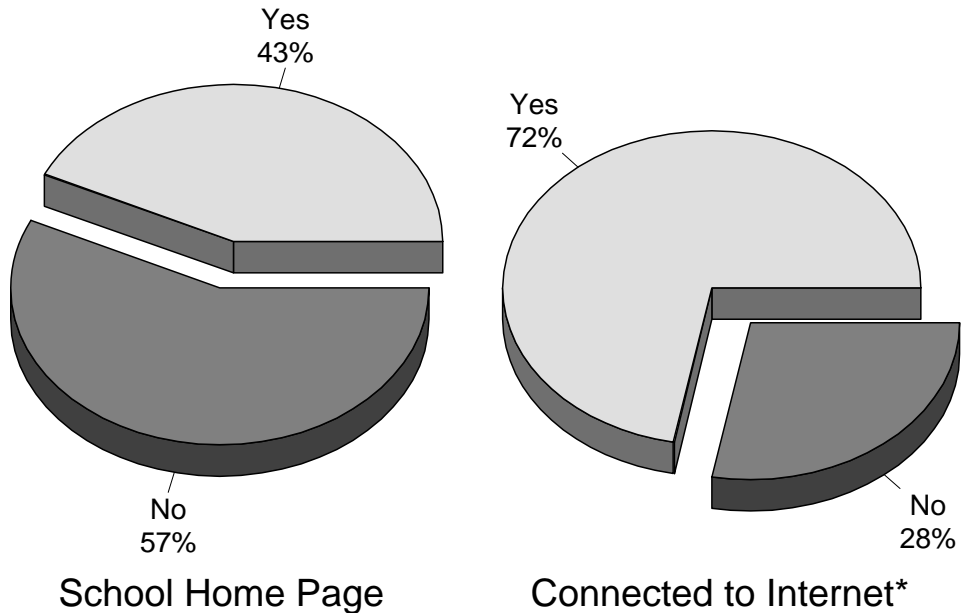
